OMAHA (AP) — Jim Lyttle, hard-hitting sophomore outfielder of Florida State, has been named to the All-America college baseball team.

Announced yesterday by the College Baseball Coaches Association, the team lists Steve Arlin, pitching ace of Ohio State, as Lyttle the only repeater.

Lyttle is the fifth Seminole to make the All-America first team. Others: shortstop Dick Howser (twice), outfielder Mike Augustine, catcher Ken Suarez, catcher Buddy Teagle.

Thirteen homers were included among Lyttle's hits this year. His batting average was .324.

The other first-team pitcher is Bill Frost of California, the national strikeout champion, who was the No. 1 draft choice of the San Francisco Giants.

The first-team infield includes Bob Willett of Ohio University, .473-hitting third baseman; big Ed Maras of South Dakota State, .380 at first base; fiery little Matt Galante, .400-hitting second baseman from St. John's of New York, who has 135 consecutive chances without an error; and shortstop Eddie Leon, .378, of Arizona.

In the outfield are fleet Reggie Jackson of Arizona State, .327-hitter who signed with the Kansas City A's for \$85,000; Dale Ford, .390, of Washington State, the national homerun champion; and Lyttle of Florida State.

The first-team catcher is Jim Hibbs, .331, of Stanford. Stanford.
