

Left-hander Wayne Vincent tossed a six-hitter last night and belted a long homer as Florida State downed Tulane 5-1 and gained a split in the final day of the Seminoles' Open Invitational Tournament.

Earlier in the day, the Seminoles had kicked away a 7-6 decision to Penn State by committing six errors.

Vincent recorded his third triumph against a tough 2-1 defeat by Georgia earlier in this tourney. The Birmingham, Ala., junior fanned 12 Greenies as the Seminoles ran their season record to 11-4.

Florida State opens its second tournament — the Southern Invitational — today as the Seminoles take on William & Mary at 3 p.m. in the only action of the opening round.

Vincent was the master last night. The curve-balling southpaw made sure his club got on the scoreboard when he belted one of loser George Ditta's offerings far over the right field fence for a homer and the Seminoles' first hit in the third inning.

Wayne lost his shutout in the ninth when Ron Scott led off with a triple to left-center and scored on football quarterback Bobby Duhon's infield single.

In between, the Seminoles got all the runs they needed in the third. Lance Hitchcock started things with a walk and held at second as Charles Whitaker singled. Dick Gold's perfect bunt went for a hit and the sacks were jammed. One run got home on a wild pitch and catcher Bobby Jordan drove home two more with a single.

Two walks and Dick Gold's single added the Seminoles' final tally in the fifth.

In the afternoon contest, the Seminoles' six errors allowed Penn State to score all seven of its runs unearned.

The Tribe jumped in front in the first, when Chuck Cone singled, stole second, went to third on a wild pitch, and scored as Mike Eason grounded out to second.

The Nittany Lions capitalized on the first Tribe error in the second for two runs. With runners on first and second with no one out, the Lions' Kenny Barto attempted to sacrifice. He beat the bunt out for a single however, and Seminole pitcher Mike Reibling's throw got away from first baseman Marv Stringfellow allowing a run to score.

John Featherstone then grounded into a double play, but Toby Frymire scored on the play.

The Tribe tied it up in the bottom of the second when Stringfellow singled, went to second on a passed ball and scored on a two-base error by Lion shortstop, Featherstone.

The Lions scored twice more in the second, and three times

in the sixth to put the game out of reach of the Seminoles. In the third an error by Cone, singles by Steve Bazarnic and Shorty Stoner, and a successful two-out delayed steal put the Lions back in front.

In the sixth, Penn State loaded the bases with two outs on a single by Barto, a double by Featherstone and a walk to Gary Kanaskie. Pinch hitter Joe Riale bounced the ball high over the mound, and when pitcher Reibling finally got hold of it, his throw was wide of the bag at first and three runs scored.

The Seminoles came back with four runs in the bottom of the sixth, but it was not enough to overtake the Lions. Stringfellow, who went 4 for five for the day singled to open the frame. Bob Canty walked, and Jim Spooner grounded into a force playscoring Stringfellow. Mike Easom and John Mason contributed back-to-back singles, and pinch hitter Dave Cooke drove in the final score with a base hit.
