

Florida State scored unearned runs in the seventh and eighth innings yesterday and overcame stubborn William and Mary 5-4 in baseball here.

The Indians from Virginia broke on top with a first-inning run, then lost the lead in the fourth as the Seminoles scored three times.

But the visitors countered with a run in the fifth, and two more in the seventh to regain the lead.

FSU Starter Chet Cole gave up the first-inning run on a walk to Jack Driscoll, an error by Marv Stringfellow, and a run-producing single by Randy Glesenkamp.

The Seminoles were handcuffed by W&M Starter Mike Lubeley until the fourth.

Mike Easom led the uprising off with a single, went to second when, on an attempted double play, second baseman John Bane booted the ball.

With Easom on second and Tom Whitaker on first, Lance Hitchcock bounced the ball back to Lubeley on the mound. The pitcher elected to go to

third and threw the ball over the third baseman's head. Both runners scored on the play, and Hitchcock went to second.

An infield out moved Hitchcock to third, and the centerfielder scored when Lubeley uncorked a wild pitch.

Dick Gold and Ed Yarnell followed with singles, and Cole walked to load the bases after that, but Chuck Cone struck out to end the inning.

The Indians picked up a run in the fifth on a single by pinch-hitter Bart Stein, a fielder's choice by Bob Bradenham, a walk and a single by Albertson.

In the seventh, singles by Tron Brekke and Bradenham and a walk to Driscoll loaded the bases with one out. Jim Helm took over mound duties from Cole, but gave up a third single by Albertson to score one run, and a second came in on an infield out.

Bob Canty, batting for Helm, opened the Seminoles seventh with a walk and went to second on a sacrifice by Cone. Bane then threw the ball away at first and Canty scampered home with the tying score.

With one out in the eighth, Stringfellow was safe on Bane's third error of the day, and scored on a single by Gold.

Len Sullivan came on in the eighth for the Seminoles to stop the Indians, and picked up his first victory of the season.

Today the Seminoles go up against Wake Forest at 3 and North Carolina at 7:30. The two visitors were to meet in an 11 a.m. game.

The Tar Heels eliminated the Florida State in the District III NCAA playoffs last year in Gastonia.
