

Dick Gold slammed a three-run home run in the seventh inning last night against Wake Forest to lift Florida State to a 3-2 baseball victory and a split of two games during the day.

North Carolina defeated the Seminoles 3-1 in an afternoon contest.

Today Florida State goes against Wake Forest at 11, and against North Carolina at 3. Either Jim Helm or Len Sullivan will pitch for the Seminoles in the opener and Wayne Vincent in the second game.

The Seminoles had many chances to score, leaving the bases loaded three times and two men on twice, but Gold's homer provided all the runs.

Wake Forest jumped out in front with two runs in the first inning as Seminole starter Marty Brooks had trouble getting anyone out.

Sonny Swails led off with a base on balls and Bill Myers

followed with a single. Jim Callison singled to load the bases and Steve Wrenn added another base hit, scoring Swails.

Digit Laughridge grounded to second forcing Wrenn, but Myers scored on the play. Bob Blanton then lifted a fly to center and Callison raced home with the apparent third run of the inning. However, the Seminoles tossed the ball to third and Callison was call-

ed out for not having tagged up.

FSU threatened to break it open many times, but it wasn't until the seventh that it finally went ahead. With two outs, Tom Whitaker started things with a walk and Roy Mewbourne, batting for Lance Hitchcock, beat out an infield single to short.

A passed ball moved the runners up and Gold unloaded on a two-two pitch and far over the left field fence.

Mike Reibling relieved starter Brooks in the third inning and was credited with the victory — his second in three decisions. Reibling walked two, struck out six in five and two-thirds innings. He allowed four hits.

Reibling gave up two singles in the fourth, but got out of it without any trouble by striking out two and getting the third to pop out.

In the fifth, Swails led off with a triple which took a high hop over Lance Hitchcock's head in center. Myers hit a grounder behind second which looked good enough to score the runner, but Chuck Cone fielded the ball and made a perfect throw home to nail Swails.

Reibling got help from Helm in the eighth when he got a bit wild, walking one man on four pitches and opening to the next batter with another ball.

John Mason and Gold both got three hits for the Seminoles.

In the afternoon contest, North Carolina pitcher Gary Hill set the Seminoles down with a hit until the seventh inning — after which FSU got three.

The Tar Heels go three unearned runs in the first, but could manage nothing off FSU starter Lin Garrett or reliever Len Sullivan.

After one man was down in the first, Charlie Thomas reached first when shortstop Chuck Cone bobbled his grounder. Thomas stole second and the next hitter, Ron Lemonds walked. Charlie Carr singled

to right to load the bases.

Rod Thompson grounded to short, forcing Carr at second, but the relay to first on the doubleplay attempt was late and Thomas scored. Bill Estes then lined a drive to right center which took a high hop over centerfielder Lance Hitchcock's head for a two-run triple.

Florida State scored in the ninth. Dick Gold drew one of five bases on balls off Hill, and Marvin Stringfellow followed with a bouncer to second which went through the infielder's legs for an error. After two infield outs, Cone singled sharply to left — the first solid FSU hit — to score Gold.

The Seminoles left 10 base runners stranded — two in each the third, fifth, seventh, eighth and ninth. The runners reached on a pair of errors in the third, two walks

in the fifth and a walk and single in the eighth.

In the seventh, Tom Whitaker led off with a blop, opposite field single to right center for FSU's first hit. The curve-balling Hill fanned eight Seminoles for his second victory without a setback. Garrett's record fell to 2-1.
