Florida State's baseball
team received sterling pitching performances from Jeff
Hill and Wayne Vincent Saturday, but the Tribe batsmen
could only muster up a single
win.

The Seminoles lost a 1-0 contest to Wake Forest and then trimmed North Carolina 2-1.

Both games went 11 innings and Seminole pitchers both went the distance both times.

Vincent pitched perfect ball against North Carolina for seven innings before centerfielder Charlie Carr stroked a leadoff single in the eighth. The Tar-Heel clean up battergolfed a low outside pitch to

break up Vincent's no-hit,

perfect game bid.

The Seminoles grabbed a 1-0 lead in the fourth inning. Dick Gold led off with a double to left field, a walk to Lance Hitchcock and a single by Dave Cook loaded the bases. Row Mewbourne followed with a long fly to right scoring Gold with the run.

Hitchcock went to third on the play, but the big outfielder was cut down at the plate, as he attempted to score on a double steal.

became the Tar Heels' second base runner as he worked Vincent for a inning-opening walk.

Pitcher Tom Buskey bunted the ball back to the mound, and Vincent elected to go to second base with the throw. The toss was wide however, and all hands were safe. Bruce—Bolick attempted to advance—the two runners, but his bunt down the third base line was too hard, and Hall was forced at third.

Chuck Cone made a brilliant play on Charlie Thomas' shot back through the middle, and threw the Carolina second baseman out at first, but the runners moved up on the play.

Tar Heel first baseman Danny Talbott lined a shot off Vincent's glove, however, and then beat the throw to first by a step, allowing Buskey to score the tying run.

An error by Cone in the tenth put a runner on for North Carolina, but Clem Medley bounced into a double play to end the threat.

In the eleventh, Hitchcock was safe at second on a two-base throwing error, and after a wild pitch moved him to third, Mary Stringfellow lined a single back through the box for the Tribe's second win over the highly-regarded Tar Heels.

In the first contest, Hill tied up with the Deacons' Jeff. Willison in a scoreless pitchers battle for ten innings.

In the eleventh Wake Forest leftfielder Bob Blanton crashed a one-out home run over the left field fence for the game's only score.

The Seminoles had men in scoring position in each of the last three innings, but could not come up with any scoring punch.

With one out in the ninth, Tom Whitaker doubled, but the Seminoles left him stranded, as John Mason flied to center and Mary Stringfellow took a called third strike.

In the tenth, a two-out single by Hill, who had two of the Tribe's six hits, and a walk to Cone put runners on first and second, but Mike E as on bounced out to first to end that threat.

In the eleventh, trailing by a run, Whitaker kept the Seminoles' hopes alive with a sharp single to right. Harry Greene ran for the Seminole first sacker and stole second.

His effort was in vain, however, as Willison struck out Dick Gold and Lance Hitchcock to gain the win.

Hill scattered nine hits and walked only one, while registering four strikeouts in the heart-breaking loss. Willison walked three and struck out seven for the Deacons.

The Seminoles, whose record is now 16-6, will have a well-earned three-day rest before meeting Parson's College Wednesday and Thursday.

The Tribe, which has won 13 of the 19 games it played in the last two weeks, will travel to Auburn for two games next weekend, before having a break for exams.
