Parsons got the only runs it needed in the first inning with the help of a Florida State error, one of four the Seminoles were to make during the

afternoon.

A five - run explosion in the third frame put the game out of Florida State's reach and the Wildcats kept adding to the total with single tallies in the fifth, seventh and eighth.

Southpaw Mary Stringfellowstarted for Florida State and it was apparent early that this just wasn't his day. Some sloppy fielding hurried his exit luring the five run third and Len Sullivan relieved.

Following Sullivan, Hatfield used three more hurlers, Steve Marks, Rodger Netsel and Bill Cappleman.
