Parson's Collège's Wildcats leaned into Florida State pitching again yesterday, and took the Seminoles 16-4 for a sweep of a 2-game baseball series here.

-- The Wildcats got 14 hits, including six for extra bases, offfive pitchers on route to theirtenth victory without a setback. The loss dropped the Seminoles to 16-8.

Leading the attack was

rightfielder Tony DeMacio, who had a triple and a home run. He drove in six runs.

Tom Lolos had three hits, including two ground-rule doubles deep in center field.

Roy Mewbourne had three of Florida State's eight hits, -and drove in two runs.

Parsons jumped on Seminole starter Mike Garrett for three runs in the first inning. The Seminole starter had trouble finding the plate.

Lolos opened the game with a single, but he was picked off first on a throw by catcher Bobby Jordan. Garrett walked three of the next four men, however, and DeMacio tripled down the right-field line, clearing the bases ahead of him. A single and two walks loaded the bases in the third, and this time it was Mike Bottom who cleared the sacks, with a double to left.

A walk to Lolos, a ground rule double by Dunlap and a fielder's choice produced a run in the fourth off reliefer Mike Reibling.

Reibling was struck for two more runs in the fifth. Bottom singled and was forced at second by Frank Favia. Parsonspitcher. Dick F olkers attempted to sacrifice, but beat his bunt out for a single, Lolos doubled and Tom Heintzelmann singled to provide the runs.

The Seminoles finally got on the scoreboard in the fifth. With two outs Bill Zeigle walked and Nick Harris, batting for Reibling, lined a single to right. Mewbourne followed with a double to score the runners. Two more Seminole scores in the sixth made it 9-4, but that was as close as the Tribe was to get. A walk to Lance Hitchcock and a single by Chuck Cone put two runners on with two outs. Catcher Mike English followed with a double to left, scoring Hitchcock, and Howie Wood singled, chasing in Cone.

Chester Cole got the Wildcats out without a run in the sixth, but the visitors tagged Bill Cappleman for four runs in the seventh and eighth.

A single, a hit batsman and a walk loaded the bases in the seventh, and Dave Kent followed with a two-run single. Cappleman then uncorked a wild pitch, allowing a third run to score.

In the eighth, an error by first baseman Tom Whitaker, a sacrifice and a double by Lolos provided the 13th run.

The Wildcats added three more runs in the ninth off the final Seminole pitcher, Marty Brooks. DeMacio's 350-foot blast over the left-field fence did the damage. The Seminoles left Tallahassee after the ball game for Auburn, where they meet the Tigers for single games today and Saturday.

LaDon Boyd and Wayne Vincent are slated to pitch for the Seminoles.
