

## STATESBORO, Ga. — Florida State lefthander Wayne Vincent threw a no-hitter at Georgia Southern College Friday as the Seminoles defeated the Eagles 7-1.

Vincent, a junior from Birmingham, Ala., struck out eight and walked only one in tossing his gem. He was touched for an unearned run in the fourth inning after retiring the first nine batters in a row.

Vincent is the first pitcher to toss a no-hitter at Georgia Southern in its 24-year baseball history.

FSU now has a 22-9 record and will play Georgia Southern again today at 1:30. The Eagles now are 23-9.

Coach Fred Hallfield's Seminoles got to Eagle starter Tim O'Learn for three runs in both the second and third innings. Vincent aided his own cause with a two-run single in the second after Chuck Cone had driven in the first run with a fielder's choice.

The Seminoles got three in the third on two hits and four Georgia Southern errors. Tom Whitaker singled and advanced to second on a throwing error and Dick Gold singled his home. Bob Canty then bounced a grounder to first baseman Ralph Lynch who threw wildly to second with both runners safe.

Gold advanced to third on the error and scored when left fielder Mike Long bobbled the

ball. Canty, who advanced to second on the play, then stole third and raced home as catcher Marion Brooks threw wild into left field.

Florida State got an insurance run in the eighth on a base on balls to Cone and a run-scoring single by Ed Yanell following a passed ball.
