

Florida State's 2-game baseball series with University of Tampa, scheduled here this week, has been called off.

Sam Bailey, the Tampa athletic director, called and cancelled. He said the team has disbanded because of failure of some players to make their grades, and because others had been drafted into military service.

Coach Fred Hatfield said there is a slim possibility of scheduling substitute games with some other school. Should FSU have played and beaten Tampa, it would have enhanced the Seminoles' chances of receiving a bid to the district playoffs.

Meanwhile Hatfield disclosed that two FSU pitchers, Wayne Vincent and LaDon Boyd, have been invited to take part in the Pan-American Game tryouts July 1-19 in Minneapolis.

Should they make the squad, they will play in the Pan-Am Games at Winnipeg, Canada, July 24-Aug. 5.

Sometime between May 12 and May 14 Coach Hatfield discovered that Tampa played a game with South Florida on May 10, so the two cancelled games with Tampa are counted as wins.
