

Florida State received strong pitching performances from Tom Henson and Mike Slade Friday as the Seminoles swept a doubleheader from top ten teams New York University and Southern Illinois.

NYU, ranked tenth in the final poll of last season, fell to the Tribe for the second time, 4-2. Southern Illinois, which finished atop of last year's rankings, was a 6-1 victim in the night cap.

Today the Seminoles will host SIU in a day-night doubleheader. The first game is scheduled for 1:30 with the second at 7:30.

Larry Cocks drove in two runs with a sixth inning single in the NYU game. That broke a 1-1 tie and the Seminoles were never again in trouble.

FSU jumped to an early 1-0 lead on Greg Schnute's first inning home run, but the Violets tied things up in the top of the sixth.

Each team scored once in the eighth to wind up the scoring.

The Seminoles scored three runs in the fourth and fifth innings to take command of the Southern Illinois game.

A single by Ron Cash and a walk to Harry Saferight put

two on with no outs in the fourth. After an infield out, Mike Vasquez walked, loading the bases.

Tom Porter grounded too short, forcing Vasquez, but the relay to first was missed by Saluki first baseman, Dan Radison and two runs scored.

The third run came home on a wild pitch by losing hurler John Daigle.

The three runs in the fifth all came on Saferight's towering home run over the right field fence. The ball cleared not only the fence, but also the road beyond.

Southern Illinois scored its

lone run in the sixth on a two out single by Bob Sedik and a double by Mark Newman.

Slade, who won his second game of the year, went the distance striking out eight men and allowing seven hits.

He was helped out several times, by some spectacular fielding by third baseman Cash.

The junior thirdsacker from Manatee went into the hole to knock down several hard hit balls and turn them into outs.

Henson pitched a four hitter in the opener, striking out 10 and walking just one man.
