TAMPA — Pat Osburn and Don Harbaugh combined to pitch Florida State to its fourth -straight\_shutout victory Saturday with an 8-0 decision over slumping South Florida.

The Seminole hurlers limited the Brahmans to just one hit following Gene Ammann's nohit performance of Friday

afternoon.

Osburn started for the Tribe, worked the first seven innings before giving away to the wilting 90-degree heat. Don Harbaugh finished up for the Tribe.

Departing from their usual big-inning style, the Seminoles scored in six of the nine innings to pick up their eight runs.

Ron Cash paced an 11-hit attack with two triples and a single, while second baseman Dick Nichols, held hitless inFriday's game picked up two hits Saturday. Nichols had a 14-game hitting streak snapped

in that Friday game.

The Seminoles scored their first run in the first inning without benefit of a base hit. · Nichols walked, stole second base and moved to third on a wild pitch. Harry Saferight's sacrifice fly brought-himhome.

The Tribe added two more in the third on an error, the first of Cash's triples and a sacrifice fly off the bat of Greg Gromek.

Nichols drove in a lone run in the fourth inning and the Seminoles added two more in

the fifth to run their margin to 6-0.

A single by Cash and a double by Gromek resulted in another run in the seventh and the Seminoles' final tally came \_\_in the ninth on a single by John Grubb and a pair of fielding errors by Brahmans third

baseman Keith Blanton.

South Florida's Ken Maples got the Brahmans' only hit of the two-game series — a firstinning leadoff pop-fly single down the rightfield line. The soft-hit ball fell just out of the reach of on-rushing rightfielder Grubb.

The victory upped No. 2 ranked Florida State's record to 28-2, while the loss, the sixth straight for USF, evened the Brahmans record at 11-11.

Florida State will face St. Leo this afternoon in a 2 p.m. game in Dade City.
