One thing you can say for Florida State's Larry Cocks, when he starts something, he finishes it. At least you can draw that conclusion from Cocks' part in the Seminoles 7-6 win over Florida Southern Thursday night at Seminole Field.

The Tribe will be back in action again tonight, opening a three-game series with South Alabama, coached by Eddie Stanky. Game time is 7:30. Saturday, a day-night doubleheader is scheduled with games starting at 1:30 and 7:30.

Florida Southern's Mike Dwyer held the Seminoles scoreless for six innings, while the Moccasins built up a 4-0 lead.

Then Cocks, a part time starter in the outfield, took charge.

The junior from Oklahoma
City led off the inning with a
single and before the frame
was up, the Tribe plated four
runs to tie it.

Key hits in the rally were a two run double by Dick Nichols and John Grubbs singled which plated two more. Southern's Terry Snell dropped a bases loaded, two-out single into shallow left field in the eighth as the Mocs went back in front, 6-4.

Dwyer hit Seminole shortstop Greg Gromek to start the bottom of the eighth and Cocks was at the plate again. He worked the count to two balls and a strike, then

drilled a fast ball over the left field fence.

It was his second home run of the year and tied the game at six-all.

A pair of singles and a sacrifice put runners at second and third for the Seminoles in the ninth. Dwyer walked Gromek, intentionally, to fill the bases and up stepped Cocks.

The Tribe left fielder lined a shot off the left-centerfield fence as John Grubb trotted home with the winning run.

The Moccasins gave the more than 1000 Seminole fans reason to believe that their fourth ranked status in the national college division poll was no fluke.
