Righthander Gene Ammann scattered five Gator hits while teammate Greg Schnute banged a run-scoring single with two out in the 10th as the Seminoles edged Florida 1-0 in the afternoon contest.

Deadlocked in a scoreless tie after nine innings. Doug Kasimier started the Seminole half of the 10th with a bouncing ball to UF first baseman Laurie Vidal who bobbled the ball enabling Kasimier to reach first via the error.

Speedy Tommy Porter was sent in to pinch run for . Kasimier, and Ammann promptly laid down a sacrifice bunt sending Porter to second.

Second baseman Dick Nichols drew an intentional walk which set the stage for Schnute, who rifled the first pitch into centerfield plating Porter with the unearned tally.

Florida had threatened with the game only moments old when Leon Bloodworth cracked a triple down the rightfield line.

Ammann got Nick DeVirgilis to pop up before walking catcher Will Harmon. Tony Dobies then bounced to third baseman Ron Cash who turned it into a double play.

In the second, Florida State had a big opportunity nipped in the bud. With one out, Larry Cocks, who extended his hitting streak to 13-games, singled off shortstop Tom Blankenship's glove.

Greg Gromek then beat out a fading blooper down the third base line to put runners at first and second. Cocks and Gromek advanced on a double steal, but John Keith popped-up to short and Jim Scheller grounded out to second to end the threat.

Florida got Ammann in a jam in the fifth when Blankenship reached first base on an error and pitcher Tom Seybold walked. Bloodworth put down a bunt that Ammann scooped up and caught Blankenship at third.

The Seminole hurler then got DeVirgilis to fly out to center and Harmon to ground back to him to kill another chance.

In the sixth, UF's Dobies lined a single to leftfield. Cocks grabbed the well-hit ball, and

made an outstanding throw to Nichols at second who tagged out Dobies as he attempted to stretch it into a double.

In the same inning, Ron Wright rapped a double to center with two outs, but Vidal grounded to short.

The Seminoles posted a threat in the seventh when Gromek singled to center and Kasimier walked before Ammann struckout.

The alert FSU defense

stopped the Gators in the eighth after Harmon singled with one out. Dobies struck out on a 3-2 count, and Harmon was doubled up trying to steal second.

Ammann kept his unblemished record intact, collecting his 12th victory of the season. He fanned 10 batters, walked five.

Seybold, a lefty who went all the way for Florida, allowed the Tribe six hits, struck out two, walked three.

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
