Florida State's Seminoles used Dave Nichols' two-run homer in the eighth inning to pull out the first game of a day-night doubleheader with South Alabama 9-7, but couldn't manage a second late-inning drama, losing 5-4 in the nightcap Saturday at Seminole Field.

The split makes Florida State's season record 27-13. The third game of the series with the Jaguards will be

played at 1:30.

In the first game, the Seminoles socked three homers, a solo by Greg Gromek in the second, a three-run smash by Harry Saferight in the third and Nichols' game-

winning blow in the eighth.

The Jaguards, however, who came into the series with a healthy .344 team batting average, could not match the Tribe blows, their closest shots being two doubles by hard-hitting catcher Glenn Borgmann and third baseman Al Snypes.

South Alabama jumped on Bill Fuller in the second inning, with Borgmann and Snypes cracking back-to-back doubles to score the first run

of the game.

Florida State got the marker back in the botton of the inning on Gromek's blast. Saferight's blow provided Fuller a three-run cushion in the third, after singles by Mike Leber and Nichols.

The Tribe scored two more in the fourth when Fuller walked, Lever singled and Fuller scored on an error by Jack Gaskin. Ken Doria then hit into a fielder's choice and Lever scored the second unearned run.

The Jaguars went ahead briefly in the seventh, when Fuller tired and gave up singles to Gaskin and Pete Phillips and a base on balls to Borgmann. Snypes cracked a single off Dave Price to knot the score at 6-6 and then Jerry Bevins followed with a base hit to put the Jaguars in front 7-6.

Florida State, however, made that one up in the bottom of the inning as Roatche got a base hit and scored on Gromek's double. The stage was then set for Nichols winning blow in the eighth, his first of the year.

Again in the second contest,

the Jaguars broke the ice first with a first-inning run, which the Tribe matched with a homer by Dave Grimes in the last of the initial inning.

FSU added a run in the third on two Jaguar errors and two more in the fourth using a combination of two errors, a wild pitch and a hit by Grimes.

Jaguars, however, The errors by utilized two rightfielder Harry Saferight in the fifth to inch closer and clinched the win in the seventh when South Alabama rightfielder Al Snypes delivered a two-run single after Pete Phillips had walked and Borgmann had reached on a hit.
