After threatening to get the run which would have won the game in six of the last seven innings, Florida State finally found someone to get the job done in the person of Doug Kasimier and took a 4-3 decision from South Florida in 14 innings Tuesday.

Kasimier's winning hit, a

single, scored Harry Saferight from second and ended the 3:33 marathon.

Enduring Ray Reteneller was the victim of Kasimier's blow. The strong armed lefty went the distance for the Brahmans suffering his sixth loss in 12 decisions.

Bill Fuller on the other hand was the Seminoles, fourth pitcher and picked up his fifth win in six decisions. The sophomore lefty came on in the 12th with two men on and no outs. He got out of that jam and kept the Brahman's penned up until the Tribe came up with the winning rally.

The Seminoles had the winning run in scoring position in the eighth, ninth, 10th, 11th and 13th innings, but each time failed to come up with a hit.

Florida State went in front in the first inning, but lost the lead as USF came up with single tallies in second and fourth.

Dave Nichols' double opened the first for the Tribe. He went to third on an infield out, then scored when he beat a throw home on Dave Grimes infield bouncer to second.

The Bramans scored an

unearned run in second on Manny Pumariega's single and a three base error by leftfielder Ron Cash.

In the fourth, Seminole starter Dave Price walked the bases loaded, then uncorked a wild pitch.

Greg Gromek tied things up in the fifth with a towering home run to left in the fifth inning.

That was the way things stood as the game went into extra innings.

Mac Scarce replaced Price in the tenth. With one out he hit Lamar Gillis. The Brahman leftfielder went to second on an infield out and scored when Mark Choquette lined a single to center.

In the bottom of the tenth,

Saferight drilled a home run over the right-centerfield fence and the game went on.

With one out in the 13th, the Seminoles had a runner at second, but Reteneller completely baffled Nichols and Grimes, who both struckout.

The Brahman righthander walked Saferight and Larry Cocks with one out in the 14th. Ken Doria then popped to short, setting the stage for Kasimier's dramatic hit to left.

The win gives the Seminoles a 31-13 record and a three game win streak to take into weekend series against Stetson and Georgia Southern.
