Seminoles Win Two at USA

MOBILE, Ala. — Just when Florida State appeared dead, up jumped Roger Smith and Rick Colzie to stear the Seminoles to a sweep of a double-header over nationally No. 3 ranked South Alabama here Saturday.

The twin victories, by scores of 64 in extra innings and 3-1, vaulted the Seminoles back into the NCAA post-season tournament picture with a 40-17 record.

The two teams square off here again today with Dave Fernald scheduled to pitch for the Seminoles.

Smith hit a 400-foot, two-run home run to win the first game in the ninth inning of a scheduled seven-inning game, then hit a two-run double in the second to back the sterling pitching of Colzie. Colzie no-hit the Jaguars, now 30-6, for five and a third innings and wound up hiking his record to 4-3 with a two-hitter.

He lost his shutout in the same sicth inning when Al Ryan walked, stole second, was awarded third on interference and scored on Mike Stanky's infield single, first off Colzie. Ernie Rosseau singled off him in the seventh with two

"Nothing beats the feeling of playing well and winning," said FSU Coach Jack Stallings, 'and that's what we did—only one bad inning in the 16 we played."

Stallings referred to the seventh inning of the first game when South Alabama rallied for two runs, tied the game and sent it into extra innings.

But Stallings pointed out it

was a day filled with far more positive than negative things.

"Smith and Colzie had their finest days ever as Seminoies," he said. "Just when we needed a couple of performances, they came along and gave us a shot in the arm."

The Seminoles led 40 and then 4-2 going into the seventh inning of the first game when South Alabama came up with

Dan Roatche led off the ninth with a walk and scored on Smith's home run that was clearly a home run the moment it left his bat.

"He has been working hard the last two weeks," Stallings noted, "and it's beginning to pay off."

Smith's two-run double in the second game came in the fourth inning after Rosa's in-

field forceout scored a run in the third as the Seminoles took a 3-0 lead with Colzie at his best.

"This should put us back in the picture," said Stallings in reference to the District III tournament, which will name three independents at a noon meeting Monday.

South Alabama, despite the double loss, and Jacksonville University figure to get two of the bids, with Florida State contending with Miami, Georgia Southern and Tulane for the third spot.
