Seminole Baseball Gets Hope From Fast Finish

Florida State's baseball team fought off early frustrations and closed the 1974 season with an optimistic eye on the future.

"While there were several disappointments," said head coach Jack Stallings who has guided the Seminoles for six years, "the year was far from discouraging. And considering our strong finish, we have to be looking forward to next season."

The Seminoles completed the year with a 37-25 record after winning 21 of their final 31 contests.

The Seminoles fooled most everyone by getting off to a quick early start, winning nine of the first ll games.

An exam break slowed the Seminole express and it took nearly a month to get back on the right track. By midseason, the club had fallen to 16-15.

But, the Tribe snapped out of it with a seven game winning streak then took two out of three from Miami and split a pair with Georgia Southern in a four day period. Both opponents were nationally ranked at the time.

"Confidence is a big factor with a young club," Stallings s a i d . "The lack of it or the presence of it is highly contagious among the players.

"When we started to slump most everyone got down. We started pressing and our problems started to multiply. When we started to win again everyone picked right up." FSU completed the second half of the season 21-10 and won

16 of 22 in one stretch. Stallings' optimism stems from the fact that players will return at every position except shortstop where Marty Maier and Mike Eissey were both seniors.

Heading the list of returnees are Randy Davidson and Guillermo Bonilla. Third baseman Bonilla led the club in hitting with a .351 average, while Da-

vidson, the club's second baseman, hit .341.

Jim Busby was the only other Seminole to hit .300 and along with Bonilla is a returning freshman. Davidson led the club in hits

Davidson led the club in hits (a new FSU season record of 83), runs, stolen bases, and fewest strikeouts.

Bonilla led the team in RBIs, doubles and total bases.

Busby shared the home run lead with junior Jim Foxwell as each man hit six.
