## FSU rallies for No. 12

With Florida State's baseball team down 3-0 and his second consecutive throwing error on its way to first base, Guillermo Bonilla looked up and began shouting a stream of "non-English" profanity into the air.

But, just a little over two hours later, Bonilla was all smiles with three runs batted in—two of which had propelled FSU to a thrilling 7-5 comeback victory over Florida International University.

It was a record-tying triumph for the Seminoles who have won 12 straight to open the 1975 campaign. They can break the 1972 mark this afternoon with another win over these same Miamians at 2. The contest will be televised by WFSU.

"I was saying a few things to and about myself, " third baseman Bonilla sheepishly offered. "And I don't think they would call it praying."

His first error, on the first batter of the game, was followed by a single, double, fielder's choice and sacrifice fly which

totalled three runs. The second did no damage.

The Sunblazers, who fell to 9-4 on the season, added a run in the fourth on two Texas League singles and a wild pitch by Seminole pitcher Danny O'Brien.

That score held until the sixth when FSU cranked up its bats against FIU pitcher Ralph Alvarez who was sailing along with a strong two-hitter

Jim Busby sped all the way to second on

first baseman Fred Cosper's fielding bungle. Steve Tebbetts, returning to action with 14 stitches still in his leg, drew a walk and designated hitter Terry Kennedy singled to right to load the bases.

Bonilla then singled up the middle to drive home Busby and Tebbetts and a single to right by Jim Foxwell again loaded the bases. George Carr came on for the suddenly hittable Alvarez and Wayne Mears greeted him with a sacrifice fly to score Kennedy before Carr retired the next two batters to end the inning.

Randy Davidson, who injured his funny bone in the eighth and may miss today's game, followed the argument with a single and stole second. Busby walked and Tebbetts' single loaded the bases.

Kennedy then got another key hit—this time a single over the drawn-in infield— and drove home Davidson and Busby. A sacrifice fly by Bonilla scored Tebbetts for the third run. Foxwell got his second straight single and went all the way around to score when centerfielder Juan Diaz dropped Mears' fly ball.
