# Tribe snaps 2-game skid with 5-0 win

MACON, Ga.— Righthander Larry Jones pitched his second straight shut-out to lead Florida State's baseball team to a 5-0 victory over Mercer here Saturday afternoon.

Jones, a sophomore from Seminole, improved his record to 11-0 on the season and recorded his fifth shutout of the year. It was the 13th shutout for the Seminole pitching staff this season.

The win snapped a two-game losing streak and improved Florida State's record to 37-5. Mercer had a six-game winning streak broken and saw its record fall to 26-13.

The 37 victories equals the total number of victories compiled by Florida State during all of last season.

The Seminoles, who stranded 13 baserunners in Friday's 5-2 loss to the Bears, left 12 runners on base Saturday.

Bill Daniel's two-run homer in the second inning gave Florida State a 2-0 lead. Designated hitter Terry Kennedy had led off the inning with a single to left and moved to second when the leftfielder bobbled the ball.

After Curt Kole struck out, Daniel drilled his fifth home run of the season. The homer ties him with Jim Busby and Steve Tebbetts for the club lead.

Following the Daniel home run, the Seminoles loaded the bases on two singles and a walk but Tebbetts struck out to end the threat.

Florida State got two men on in the third inning, but Mercer starter John Hart bore down and retired 13 straight Seminoles.

With two out in the seventh, shortstop Joe Pettini made an errant throw allowing Busby to reach. Tebbetts followed with an infield hit and Guillermo Bonilla drove home Busby and sent Tebbetts to third with a single to center.

Tebbetts scored on a double steal that moved Bonilla to second and Kennedy received an intentional pass. Kole then lined a single to center to score the final FSU run.

Jones, who gave up football to concentrate full time on baseball, had a no-hitter going until Carlos Reed singled in the fifth inning.

A walk put runners on first and second and, after a pop-up on a bunt attempt, Jones wild pitched the runners to second and third. He then fanned Paul Burke and got the next hitter to pop up ending the inning.

Another Mercer threat came in the sixth when Cecil Patterson walked and stole second. After a fly out, Tiger Elgin singled and Patterson was held at third. Greg Engle made the second out of the inning, popping to third before Bonilla made a sparkling play to throw out designated hitter Fred Head.

The Seminoles had a mild threat in the eighth inning when Randy Davidson singled and stole second. Tebbetts singled to right and Engle made a perfect throw to the plate to nip Davidson.

FSU coach Woody Woodward, who missed the two Seminole losses because of a previous engagement with a Cincinnati Reds telecast, made it in time for Saturday's game.

Florida State travels to Gainesville Tuesday for a doubleheader with the University of Florida. The two teams will meet in a single game on Wednesday.

The Seminoles will return home to face Georgia Southern Friday night and Saturday afternoon.
