

# Tribe nine in 13-10 win over Cajuns

Florida State baseball coach Woody Woodward is the first to admit that his team makes a lot of mistakes, but he's also quick to express his confidence in the young club.

The Seminoles had just out-slugged Southwestern Louisiana before 2,087 sun-drenched fans at Seminole Field, and Woodward was surprisingly optimistic for the coach of a team that had made more than its share of mistakes in the long afternoon.

"Sure, we had a lot of mistakes today," he said, "but this is a very young club. It will just take awhile before things fall together.

"You look at Southwestern; they started five seniors today. We didn't have any. We have a young team, but there's a lot of talent out there."

The Seminoles improved their record to 5-0 with the victory, but not before seven pitchers were shelled for 24 hits in the wild game that lasted just short of three hours. The onslaught by both teams included 13 extra-base hits, eight of them by the Ragin' Cajuns.

The defensive effort was not much better, with each team making four miscues. Only seven of Southwestern's runs were earned, and 11 of Florida State's.

**BROOKS CAREY**, Woodward's fourth pitcher, picked up the victory, going the last 3½ innings. He was the most effective Seminole hurler, giving up just a pair of unearned runs on four hits. He walked just two and struck out seven.

Jackie Smith, Danny Owen, and John Nicholas all made the trip before Carey, and none were very successful. Smith was touched for four runs in the first three innings, Owen for two in 1½ and Nicholas for two in ½ of an inning.

But the Seminoles took full advantage of their hits in the slugfest, scoring their 13 runs on just 11 hits. Terry Kennedy led the way, getting three hits in five trips, including two doubles. He also scored twice and drove in two.

Jon Pevey and Mike Kerrigan did Seminole pitchers the most damage. Pevey had three doubles in five trips, while Kerrigan blasted a two-run homer and a double, and drove across four runs.

"We showed a lot of power," said Woodward. Then he added, laughing, "but I guess we had to, today."

Third baseman Guillermo Bonilla made his first home appearance of the

season, but was removed from the game after the third inning. One of only two returners from last year's College World Series team, he missed Saturday's home-opener with a flu virus.

**BONILLA AND** shortstop Jeff Hardy were the only Seminoles without a hit. Only two Southwestern players took the collar also, rightfielder Kevin Jeansonne and designated hitter Paul LeGuenec.

After Southwestern scored four in the top of the third to go ahead 4-3, the Seminoles quickly countered with a pair in their half of the inning. Hardy bounced to first to score Mark Coulter with the second run of the inning, and Florida State never trailed after that.

Florida State will host Columbus Wednesday afternoon at 3:30, and Georgia Southwestern comes to town for a doubleheader Thursday.

Craig Eaton, who started against Biscayne in the second game of the year and lasted just 2½ innings, will get the nod for the Seminoles against Columbus.
