

## Seminoles salvage a split in doubleheader

AMERICUS, Ga.—Pounded unmercifully by Florida State in a doubleheader two days ago, Georgia Southwestern gained a measure of revenge by taking the front end of a twin bill from the previously unbeaten Seminoles here Saturday afternoon.

Florida State rebounded from the first-game 9-7 loss by taking the nightcap 10-4 and running its record to 9-1 on the young baseball season.

Hurricane center fielder Tim Frazier broke up a 6-6 tie in the bottom of the sixth inning of the first game with a long three-run homer that was too much

for the Tribe to overcome.

Frazier's blow came off ace reliever Brooks Carey who suffered his first loss of the season after a pair of early wins.

The Seminoles had jumped to a 6-4 lead with a three-run sixth of their own, and seemed to have things pretty well under control.

After starter Craig Eaton gave up a leadoff single in the bottom of the inning, however, FSU Coach Woody Woodward went to his bullpen for Carey.

A walk and a single loaded the bases before right fielder Ron Chaffin unloaded a base hit that chased home a pair of runs and tied the score. Frazier

followed that with his 350-foot shot.

The Seminoles were down 4-3 heading into the sixth, but had taken their 6-4 advantage when short-stop Jeff Hardy unloaded a tremendous three-run blast over the right-centerfield fence.

Florida State pitching was handled roughly throughout the game, however,

and couldn't hold the lead. Eaton gave up five runs and seven hits in his five-inning stint.

The Seminoles were able to regroup in the second game and finally get the bats cranked up after being limited to

only four hits in the first contest.

Hardy got things started in the first inning with his second homer run of the day, a three-run blast that carried 400 feet to right-center, bounced off a light pole and rolled away from the outfielders while he circled the bases.

The Seminoles made it 5-0 in the third Bonilla inning when Guillermo doubled home Rick McGlone and Hardy singled him home to account for a pair of runs.

The Hurricanes got right back into the game, however, by getting to FSU starter Mike McLeod for a pair of runs in the third and two more in the fourth.

John Nicholas came out of the Tribe bullpen to silence the upstart Hurricanes and pick up his first victory of the

season.

Florida State added a single run in the sixth and then put the game out of reach with three in the seventh. Two of those scored when Chip Bifano's single skipped past the Georgia Southwestern rightfielder. Bonilla then singled Bifano home for the final run.

The second game was highlighted by the fact that designated hitter Terry Kennedy and pitcher Larry Jones, who was coaching first base, were both ejected.

Kennedy had protested a strike-call while he was at bat and Jones was arguing a close call at first base.

Jones will carry his 3-0 record to the mound against Biscayne Wednesday afternoon at Seminole Field in the second of a two-game series.
