

Seminoles rip Stetson, host hot JU

Florida State tuned up for today's crucial doubleheader with sixth-ranked Jacksonville in a rather "lefthanded" way Tuesday afternoon, pounding Stetson 12-0 and 10-4 at Seminole Field.

The Dolphins bring a 21-1 record into today's twin bill which was scheduled to get under way at 3:30 with the second game set for 6:30.

The Seminoles, 17-2 and ranked fourth in the nation, will send ace lefty Jackie Smith to the mound in the first game. Righthander Craig Eaton gets the nod in the nightcap.

Tuesday it was a pair of lefthanders who continued the Seminoles' sensational pitching string of late.

Bob Mayer secured his first victory of the year in the opener, pitching seven innings of shutout ball and allowing only two hits. John Nichols came on in the eighth and shut down the Hatters in the last two innings.

Then Brooks Carey, getting his first start of the season, pitched six and two-thirds innings allowing only a four-run fourth. The lefty gained his third win of the season against one loss. Two more lefties, John Nicholas and Ray Fox, finished out the nightcap without giving up a run.

BEFORE THE four-run inning in the second game, the Tribe pitching staff had stretched its "innings-without-an-earned-run" streak to 48. All of that started six games ago on Thursday night.

But with all the good pitching, the hitting was more than adequate in both games.

Mark Coulter and Jeff Hardy sparked the first-game attack, each had a three-run homer. Coulter's came in a six-run fifth inning and Hardy's highlighted a five-run eighth.

Hardy finished the first game with five runs batted in and added two more in the nightcap with a bases-loaded walk and a single.

The Seminoles jumped to a four-run lead in the first inning of the second game and coasted the rest of the way, scoring a run in the fourth and five, more in the sixth.

Hardy, Bruce Huff and Jim McArdle each had a pair of hits and Florida State was aided by four Hatter errors.

Stetson leaves town with a 9-6 rec-

ord after dropping the doubleheader.

Obviously pleased with Tuesday's performance, FSU Coach Woody Woodward was looking ahead to Jacksonville.

"There's no question that this is a big day for us," he said. "We're starting our two most productive pitchers to date and I think we're playing as good a baseball as we have all year.

"Jacksonville is obviously red-hot right now and I think this will be a super doubleheader for all of our fans to come out and see. It'll be a great one to watch."
