

Seminole split with St. Francis

Florida State got the big hit in the first game, but almost nothing big in the second as the Seminoles split a doubleheader with the College of St. Francis Tuesday at Seminole Field.

FSU won the first game 4-1 with four runs in the bottom of the seventh — three on Jeff Ledbetter's second homer of the year.

But Ledbetter, a freshman left-hander, started the second game on the mound and was riddled for five runs in two innings in a 5-2 St. Francis win.

FSU plays Tulane today in a 2 p.m. doubleheader (first game, WGLF-radio 104-FM). Rick Holloway (1-2) and Jim Riley will pitch for the Seminoles, now 8-4. Ken Francingues (2-0) and Frank Wills (2-1) are the scheduled pitchers for Tulane, who have a 9-2 record.

Both Francingues and Wills beat the Seminoles last year, with Francingues pitching a shutout.

Dick Wiggins got the win for the Seminoles in game 1, going the distance (seven innings) to make his record 3-0.

He allowed six hits overall, and was touched for the only St. Francis run in the second.

FSU entered the seventh trailing 1-0. Don Milner led off with a single and moved to second on Mike Fuentes' sacrifice bunt.

Jack Emerick hit a grounder to shortstop Art Galli, but the throw to first was high, and FSU had runners at first and third.

Ronnie Traylor singled Milner home with the tying run, and St. Francis pitcher Dan Pesabento was replaced by Jerry Mutz.

Mutz got David Mobley to fly out, but Lebetter hit a 1-1 pitch over the wall in rightfield to win the game for the Seminoles.

In the second game, St. Francis (2-4) got three in the first and two in the second off Ledbetter. John Debus had a two-run single and Jim Altobelli hit

doubles in each of the first two frames.

Ken Smith came on to hold the Saints for four innings before giving way to Rick Hatcher, who pitched a scoreless seventh.

FSU, meanwhile, was getting single runs in the second and fourth, though the Seminoles had the bases loaded with one out in the second and

could score just once.

In the seventh, FSU loaded the bases with two out, but David Mobley, pinch-hitting for Craig Ramsey, took a called third strike from pitcher Ken Klaccka for the final out.

Klacca pitched three scoreless innings in relief of winner Bill Gimbel.

The teams meet again Thursday in a 2 p.m. twinbill at Seminole Field.
