

# Hot-hitting 'Noles win two

They are using the same old baseball bats, but a magic spirit seems to have lately possessed the aluminum the Seminoles have been waving this year.

Following Wednesday's five-homer, 16-run double-header sweep of Tulane, Florida State came back with 14-5 and 8-1 trouncings of the College of St. Francis Thursday at Seminole Field.

In the first game, three Seminoles hit home runs in the first three innings as FSU grabbed a 12-5 lead.

Forsaking the long ball in the second outing, the 'Noles nevertheless recorded 12 hits and received a strong effort from pitcher Rick Hatcher, who went the seven-inning distance for his first win.

The Seminoles, winners of four straight and holders of a 12-4 record, entertain Austin Peay today at 2. Dipping into his bullpen, FSU Coach Dick Howser gives senior Joe Nichols and freshman Rich Bombard their first starts of the campaign.

The Seminoles struck quickly and savagely in the opening encounter. Five runs in the first inning, four in the second and three in the third made freshman Gary Batty, the starter for St. Francis (3-7), wish he were back in high school.

Shortstop Don DeLoach hit a solo blast in the first, after which the Seminoles put runners on first and third. David Mobley knocked a run in with a double, Jack Emerick's walk loaded the bases, and Don Milner's double cleaned them off.

DeLoach now has two homers, but does not want to be considered a power hitter.

"I just hit it good, but I was as surprised as anyone else. That's the way it is for little guys like us," the 5-foot-9, 155-pound sophomore said.

In the second, Mike Fuentes, the soph from Coral Gables with the quick wrists, lashed a Batty pitch over the wall in right-centerfield for his fifth homer of the year. DeLoach and Patterson were on base. Later, Mobley singled and John Gagnon drove him in with a double.

In the third, it was Mobley at bat with two on, and he took Batty downtown for his second homer in two days. The hit was Mobley's third of the game.

The senior third baseman from Columbus, Ga., entered Wednesday's twinbill hitting .235. Two homers, a double, and two singles later, the average is .306 for Mobley, a .320, 13-homer hitter last year.

"I'm just 100 percent more relaxed now," he said, crediting his father with helping him work out of a bad slump. "It helps when you've got people who care."

The Seminoles tagged on single runs on the fifth and sixth to close the rout.

Pitcher John Wolfer, not as sharp as he has been in his first two starts, pitched four shaky innings to get his third win of the year.

Wolfer was hit for two runs in the top of the first, and three in the third before coming out.

Lefthander Ken Fischer was tough in relief, giving up no runs and no hits in the final three innings.

The 16-hit attack was followed by a more modest run production in the second game.

Milner broke a 1-1 tie with a run-scoring single in the third, then Bruce Huff drove home two runs in the fourth with a single and Patterson produced a run with a sacrifice fly.

The 'Noles tacked on three more tallies in the sixth on hits by DeLoach, Patterson and Milner.

Hatcher gave up six hits as he breezed in his best performance since transferring this year from George Wallace Community College in Dothan, Ala.
