# Weaver's three homers highlight sweep by FSU

It had never been done in the 1,179 games in which Florida State had fielded a baseball team.

Not one of the countless future professionals, not Terry Kennedy or Woody Woodward or Dick Howser, had accomplished it.

There have been various All-Americans and All-Stars, many others who have been all-this or all-that but never, ever, ever had any Seminole hit three homers in a game. Until Thursday.

Jim Weaver, who transferred from Manatee Community College and then hit .197 for a summer league team, knocked three baseballs over the Seminole Field wall as FSU clubbed Missouri-Rolla 18-3 in the first game of a doubleheader.

Weaver calmed down in the second game, going hitless, but the Seminoles didn't. They beat the Miners 13-0 to complete the sweep, break three other team records and tie one and give them an 11-3 mark for the year.

The Seminoles' leftfielder, Weaver was incredulous at his accomplishment.

"I can't believe that no one has done that," he said. "I never thought about hitting three in one game."

Weaver now has six homers for the season. Last year at Manatee, he hit just two, and added two more while batting under .200 for the Coloney's summer team. His

average for the Seminoles so far is a team-leading .425.

To what divine mysticism, secret potion or doctored bats does Weaver attribute his turnabout?

Why, none of that, of course.

"It's this park," Weaver said, motioning to Seminole Field's rightfield corner.

The sign there says it's 320 feet from home plate, but you can't believe everything you read.

"Look how short the fence is," said Weaver, a left-handed swinger. "The ball just jumps out of here. If I played at a park this size in junior college, I could have hit 10 or 15 homers."

Additionally, Weaver said, he is using a lighter bat and keeping his head screwed on properly.

"I think I'm concentrating more at the plate," the 6-foot-4, 200-pounder said. "I'm trying to hit the ball hard wherever it's pitched."

Weaver added a double to his three homers to finish with 14 total bases, another FSU record. The old mark was 11 in one game, set by John Librandi in 1972.

The Seminoles collectively hit seven homers in that first game — including two by Don DeLoach — and accounted for 46 total bases to establish two more records.

DeLoach had seven hits on the day and raised his average from .282 to .357.

The Seminoles broke open a 6-3 first game with 12

runs in the sixth inning. That wasn't a record; FSU scored 13 against Jacksonville in 1976. But the 11 hits tied the previous best, set against the Dolphins.

Jeff Ledbetter added two home runs in the second game after hitting

one in the first to bring his total to eight after just 14 games. As a freshman last season, Ledbetter hit 13, second best on the club.

"I like a laugh," FSU Coach Mike Martin said. "But it ain't that easy. The thing about Weaver and DeLoach

and Ledbetter is that they're athletes.

"Baseball isn't that simple. They give you a round ball and a round bat and tell you to hit it square."

Squarely confronted with the Seminoles' 34-hit assault was Chuck Broyles, the head coach of Rolla, an NCAA Division II team that now sports a 1-5 record.

"It was a very helpless feeling," said Broyles, who used seven pitchers in the two games. "I was kind of feeling sorry for the kids. But after awhile, we tried to enjoy ourselves."

Rolla had played three games in three days, and Broyles said he used just one top-flight pitcher, Jeff Walters, who lasted until the fifth inning of Game One.

"But I don't know if it really made any difference," Broyles said.

The Seminoles pitching played second-fiddle to the hitting, but the youngsters were effective. Freshman Jay Keeler got his first victory by working the first five innings of the opener, allowing three runs on three hits.

In the second game, junior transfer Ed Schneider (2-0) and freshman David Smalley combined for a three-hit shutout.

FSU is off until Sunday when Brooklyn College comes to Seminole Field for a 1 p.m. game.
