Seminoles take two from Jacksonville

Jim Weaver was the man of the hour, and also the eighth and tenth innings, as Florida State beat Jacksonville 7-6 Saturday afternoon at Seminole Field.

In the nightcap, the Seminoles backed some nifty FSU pitching with performance at the plate, dumping the Dolphins 15-3.

Ed Schneider got the win, his fifth without a loss, after picking up nine strikeouts in five

innings in the second game, allowing only three hits.

John Gagnon followed with three hitless innings of relief, and Tim Phillips mopped up in the ninth. Altogether, the FSU pitchers notched 15 strikeouts.

The doubleheader sweep improved Florida State's record to 23-5; Jacksonville is 17-16, and has lost to the Seminoles five straight times this season.

Weaver won the first game with his 11th

homer of the year, off loser Doug Willis, leading off the tenth. It was the first time the Seminoles had the lead.

Earlier, Weaver illustrated another way to produce a run.

With the Seminoles trailing 5-4 in the eighth, Weaver walked with one out. Then he stole second base. Then he stole third base. Then he scored on a head-first slide when Mike Cullen grounded to first baseman Pete Pellegrinelli. Weaver was a split-second

ahead of the throw home.

The Seminoles, who had battled back from a 3-0 deficit to take a 4-3 lead in the seventh, only to lose the lead in the top of the eighth, had to bounce back again.

Trailing 6-5 in the bottom of the ninth, they tied the game on Don DeLoach's dying-quail single to right field that scored pinch-runner George Tebbetts with one out.

Ken Smith, who entered in the eighth in

relief of Dick Wiggins, pitched a scoreless 10th inning and collected his third victory of the season when Weaver stroked his homer over the right-field wall.

Weaver said that was more exciting than his act of dual-thievery in the eighth. But the opportunity never would have arisen if not for his 12th and 13th straight steals — he hasn't been caught — that created the tie.

The 6-foot-4, 200-pound junior left fielder said stealing two was a spur-of-the-moment thing.

"After I stole second, the pitcher (Larry Jackson) was taking so much time delivering the ball, 11 (FSU Coach Mike Martin) said to come on down. It was close. Real close."

The Dolphins went ahead 3-0 with two runs in the third, one on Wiggins' throwing error, and a single run in the sixth. JU starter Jim Walsh was breezing with a three-hitter entering the last of the seventh.

Then two-out lightning struck for FSU after Weaver lined into a double-play. Cullen walked, and catcher Jack Emerick cracked his second homer of the season.

After a walk and a single, Lionel Martinez's base hit tied the game, 3-3, and DeLoach singled in the go-ahead run.

Pellegrinelli put JU ahead 5-4 with a two-run homer off Smith in the eighth, but Weaver's baserunning tied the game again.

The Dolphins scored once in the top of the ninth, but FSU came back to tie on DeLoach's third hit of the game, a looping single to right field.

Tebbetts's slide beat the throw by right fielder Darryl Philhower. Tebbetts was running for Rick Figueredo, who led off the 10th with his third straight single.
