Wiggins, Seminoles win 11-4

Dick Wiggins pitched 5% perfect innings and Don DeLoach hit three doubles as Florida State beat Valdosta State 11-4 Wednesday night at Seminole Field.

The victory gives the Seminoles a 40-6 record heading into their three-game series at home against Miami starting Saturday night at 8.

Valdosta State, the defending NCAA Division II champion, fell to 38-8. The Blazers currently are ranked third nationally in Division II. Wiggins, 7-2, won his fifth straight.

He retired the first 17 Blazers before Mickey Taylor singled with two out

in the sixth.

The senior righthander had a streak of 27 consecutive scoreless innings snapped in the seventh when Pepe Sanchez hit a two-run homer. Carl Owen followed with a solo homer, but the Seminoles still had a comfortable 8-3 lead.

Wiggins left the game after the seventh. He allowed three runs on four hits, while walking none and striking out four. Rick Hatcher pitched the last two innings for Florida State, allowing a single run in the eighth.

The Seminoles scored a run in the first inning when Jim Weaver's triple drove in Lionel Martinez, then exploded for five runs in the second. Martinez, with a single, and DeLoach, with a double, each drove in two runs

in the inning.
FSU pounded Blazers' loser Mike Raines (7-2) for 11 runs on 10 hits in 61/2 innings. David Raffensberger finished up for Valdosta.
