FSU rolls past Georgia 8-3

ATHENS, Ga. — Rick Hatcher scattered 10 hits and three Seminoles hit home runs Wednesday as Florida State coasted to an 8-3 baseball victory over Georgia. The Seminoles, 23-9, have won 14 of their

The Seminoles, 23-9, have won 14 of their last 15 games. They play Georgia again to-

day at 4 p.m.

The game was scoreless until the fifth inning, when Mark Lacy hit his third homer of the year for a 1-0 Seminole lead. The home run was Lacy's second in two days and stretched his hitting streak to 10 games.

FSU got another run in the sixth when a two-base error by left fielder John Basco allowed Don DeLoach to reach second. De-Loach scored when John Greene threw two wild pitches.

FSU's big inning was the seventh. Joe

Licata singled, Chris Cawthon walked and Ramsey hit his first home run of the year. Later in the inning, Lionel Martinez singled, went to third on a single by DeLoach and scored on another wild pitch by Greene.

In the eighth inning, Mike Yastrzemski smacked his third home run of the year for a 7-0 lead. Georgia scored its runs in the bottom of the eighth on a single, a double and Bob White's third homer of the year.

The Seminoles picked up their final run in the ninth when DeLoach singled and Lacy

doubled.

Hatcher's complete game was his first of the year and raised his record to 3-2.

Mike Fuentes, who has 54 career home runs and is within two of Bob Horner's NCAA record, walked twice in four appearances Georgia is 6-8.

Texas, with a 29-3 record.

Rounding out the top 10 were Oklahoma, Hawaii, San Diego State, St. John's, Missouri, Alabama and Stanford.
