

FSU splits twin bill

NEW ORLEANS — Florida State's baseball team experienced feast and famine Saturday while splitting a doubleheader with Tulane.

The Seminoles pounded 16 hits, including four by Mike Yastrzemski, to blast the Green Wave 15-9 in the first game. But FSU managed only five off right-hander Mike Maack in losing the second game 11-3.

The split left the Seminoles with a 27-13 record — more losses than they suffered all last season in a 51-12 campaign. Tulane is 21-9.

The teams play again today at 1 p.m. before FSU returns home for a doubleheader against Jacksonville University Tuesday at 5 p.m.

In the first game, the Seminoles overcame a 7-5 deficit with five runs in the fourth.

Lionel Martinez walked, advanced to second on a single by Don DeLoach and scored on a single by Mike Fuentes. Jeff Ledbetter's single tied the score and Yastrzemski's single, coupled with an error by shortstop Billy Vogt, accounted for two more runs. Mark Barineau knocked in the final run of the inning with a single.

FSU put the game away with four runs in the sixth. Yastrzemski singled and scored on a triple by Mark Lacy. Barineau reached on a fielder's choice as Lacy scored. Craig Ramsey walked.

After both runners moved up on a double steal, Martinez drove them in with a single. He moved to second on a wild pitch and scored on another single by Fuentes.

Martinez added three hits to the Seminoles' attack. Fuentes, Ledbetter and Joe Licata added two apiece.

Ken Fischer struggled through 5½ innings to gain the victory, his fourth in five decisions. Reliever Jay Keeler retired four of the six men he faced to seal the triumph.

The second game had little suspense, with Tulane surging to a 10-0 lead after three innings.

John Olson was the big gun in the Green Wave's offense, driving in six runs. Olson belted a two-run homer in the first inning, a run-scoring single in the second and a three-run homer in the third.

Carlos Cambo added two hits for Tulane.

Florida State scored on the fourth when DeLoach doubled and Lacy blasted his seventh home run of the season. Lacy, who became eligible last month, has hit in all 18 games he has played and is one game short of the longest hitting streak in FSU history, set by Dick Gold in 1969.

FSU added a run in the sixth when Danny Dowell doubled and scored on a single by Martinez.

Maack kept the Seminoles off balance most of the day, walking two

and striking out five to gain his second victory without a loss.

Ed Schneider was the victim of Tulane's early barrage, giving up five hits, five walks and eight runs in just 2½ innings. Ledbetter came on in relief and was equally ineffective, walking five and throwing four wild pitches.

Schneider dropped to 4-4.
