Blowing 3-1 lead in the bottom of the ninth inning, the Seminoles were besten 6-by the Mimmi Hurricanes in 10 innings Sunday. With the defeat, the Seminoles lost a chance to win a series in Mark Light Stadium for the first time since 1976.
