BEVIS, ROBERTS LEAD FLORIDA STATE TO 9-3 WIN PAST NORTH CAROLINA

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. — Allen Bevis hit a pinch-hit, three-run home run to highlight a six-run seventh inning and All-America lefthander Chris Roberts pitched a complete game en route to his fourth win of the season as third-ranked Florida State scored a 9-3 come-from-behind victory over North Carolina in Atlantic Coast Conference baseball action Friday.

The win, Florida State's ninth in a row, improves the Seminoles to 19-3 overall and 3-1 in the ACC. Carolina drops to 9-8 overall and 1-3 in the league.

Carolina led 2-0 heading into the seventh behind the one-hit pitching of sophomore righty Jay Johnson. But the Seminoles banged out five hits and scored a half-dozen times in the decisive seventh inning. Nandy Serrano and Roberts began the rally by reaching base on a hit by pitch and walk, respectively. A sacrifice bunt by Ty Mueller advanced the runners and Serrano scored on a Johnson wild pitch to cut the lead to 2-1.

After an infield pop out, the 'Noles rapped five consecutive base hits. Kevin McCray's single to short right tied the game at 2-2 and Link Jarrett followed with a single. Bevis pinch hit for Tony Liesback and drilled a three-run homer off the screen above the left field fence. Justin Rigney, who also did not start, then followed with a back-to-back homer, also to left field.

Roberts allowed seven hits and walked three, but struck out five and stranded seven Tar Heel baserunners. He upped his record to a perfect 4-0. Johnson stayed in the game due to a injury-pleted Carolina bullpen and allowed nine earned runs and 11 hits in eight and two-third innings. He lost for the first time in four decisions.

The Tar Heels took a 1-0 advantage in the second as Scott Chandler struck out, but reached on a wild pitch, stole second and scored on two consecutive throwing errors by catcher Colby Weaver. Weaver left the game one batter later with an injury on his right hand.

Manny DaSilva's double to center and Scott Hughes' run-scoring single gave Carolina a 2-0 lead. Hughes and Chad Holbrook led the Tar Heels with two hits apiece.

Florida State centerfielder Grady Jordan suffered a broken wrist in the Carolina second inning when he dove for DaSilva's line drive. He will return to Tallahassee to have FSU doctors set the fracture.


