TALLAHASSEE -- Florida State pitchers LaWhit Lizzmore and John Nedeau combined on a six-hit shutout and senior Chris Brock had a triple and an inside-the-park home run to lead the Seminoles to a 4-0 win over Florida Wednesday night.

A crowd of 4,313 saw ninth-ranked FSU up its record to 30-10 on the year. Fifth-ranked Florida, which lost for the third time in its last four games, fell to 28-9 on the season.

Lizzmore and Gator starter Ron Scott were locked in a scoreless duel through the first four innings. Scott retired the first nine batter he faced and did not allow a hit or walk a batter in four innings of work.

Brock made a winner of Lizzmore, 1-0, with a leadoff triple in the fifth off Florida reliever Rob Bonanno, 2-1. Brock's hit was the first of the game for Florida State. He scored on Link Jarrett's ground out.

In his first start of the season, Lizzmore limited the Gators to six hits before leaving in the sixth with two outs and two on base. Nedeau snuffed the UF threat by getting Bo Camposano to ground out. Nedeau proceeded to retire the next seven in a row before walking leadoff batter Brent Killen in the ninth. He then struck out Ted Rich before getting Camposano to ground into a gameending double play. Nedeau faced the minimum of 10 batters in three and a third innings to pick up his first save of the year.


Brock's inside-the-park home run gave the Seminoles breathing room in the seventh. He led off the inning with a deep fly ball that looked like it would be caught in left. But neither leftfielder Dave Majeski nor centerfielder Brian Duva saw the ball and it dropped near the wall while Brock motored all the way around for his third home run of the year.


Brock added a single in the eighth for his third hit of the night to lead FSU offensively. Jarrett collected two rbi. Duva and Kevin Polcovich collected two hits apiece to lead Florida.
