Florida State 8, Miami 1

TALLAHASSEE -- Florida State freshman Jonathan Johnson pitched a four-hitter over eight innings and the Seminoles scored six runs in the sixth to claim an 8-1 victory over Miami in college baseball action Saturday.

A crowd of 5,053 at Dick Howser Stadium saw fourth-ranked Florida State win its second straight game over Miami, and fifth straight overall, to up its record to 30-7 on the year. Miami fell to 22-13 with the loss.

Johnson, 6-0, was in control throughout. He struck out eight and walked five while allowing only four hits. Only two runners reached third base for the Hurricanes. Miami scored its lone run in the fourth inning. Keith Tippet led off with a double and scored two batters later on Alex Miranda's two-bagger.

FSU jumped out to a 2-0 lead after one inning. UM starter Jose Prado, 3-2, walked Randy Hodges and Link Jarrett to start the inning. After Mike Martin's single hit Jarrett for the second out, Mike Schmitz singled to drive in Hodges. Martin scored on a passed ball by UM catcher Chad Hoelker.

Florida State extended its lead to 8-1 with a six-run uprising off three UM pitchers in the sixth, highlighted by Mike Martin's two-run homer off Prado. In addition, Miami reliever Danny Rios walked two FSU runs in.

Martin led the Seminoles with a pair of hits and two RBI. Schmitz also collected a pair of singles.

Miami Head Coach Brad Kelley was ejected by home plate umpire Bruce Ravan in the sixth for arguing a call about a trapped ball in the outfield.

The two teams conclude the three-game set Sunday at 1 p.m. at Dick Howser Stadium.
