**FLORIDA STATE WINS 17TH STRAIGHT ACC GAME WITH 6-3 VICTORY
OVER GEORGIA TECH**

APRIL 27, 1996

TALLAHASSEE, FL -- All-America candidate J.D. Drew drove in the game-winning run on a basehit to leftfield in the third inning as No. 4 Florida State (39-8, 17-0 ACC) defeated No. 18 Georgia Tech (28-17, 8-9 ACC), 6-3, in front of 3,506 fans at Dick Howser Stadium.

Florida State tied the Atlantic Coast Conference record for the best start in league play at 17-0.

Georgia Tech struck early as leftfielder J.J. Thomas drove in first baseman Scott Byers with a basehit to leftfield. FSU knotted the game at 1-1 in the second inning as DH Scooby Morgan belted a solo shot over the right field screen for his seventh home run of the season.

Leftfielder Jeremy Morris drove in Drew with a towering two-run home run to put the Seminoles ahead 4-1 in the third inning and FSU added to its' lead with a RBI-double by Drew in the fifth, driving in Scott Zech.

Tech third baseman Michael Sorrow led off the seventh inning with his 11th home run of the year and the Seminoles retaliated as Zech drove in shortstop Brooks Badeaux with a double to rightfield. Georgia Tech loaded the bases and scored a run on Jay Hood's fielder's choice in a ninth inning comeback effort.

Right-hander Mike Davis (6-0) picked up the win after relieving starter Randy Niles in the fourth inning. Davis gave up two runs on two hits and struck out five batters in 5.1 innings, before leaving the game. Closer Chuck Howell earned his fourth save of the season as he shut down the Yellow Jackets with the bases loaded.

Georgia Tech starter Shane McGill evened his record at 3-3 as he gave up five runs on six hits and four walks in 4.1 innings.
