

Five-run eighth lifts Tigers by FSU

Clemson's Jason Harris belted a three-run home run to cap off a five-run eighth inning as the Tigers rallied by No. 10 Florida State 5-4 Saturday night at Tiger Stadium.

The Tigers (40-7, 12-4 in the ACC) ripped five hits in the inning to chase Seminole starter Jon McDonald, who up to that point had allowed one hit. McDonald gave way to Chris Chavez, who gave up a single, then Zach Diaz, who surrendered Harris' game-winning shot.

Florida State (39-14, 14-4) powered its way to the early lead, getting solo home runs from Brian Cox and Matt Diaz to make the scored 2-0. Brooks Badeaux's lead-off double in the third led to a run, while Jeremiah Klosterman's pinch-hit homer in the ninth closed

the gap to one.
