NO. 1 FLORIDA STATE DROPS 8-4 DECISION TO CLEMSON Seminoles Winning Streak Ends at 21 Games

TALLAHASSEE, FL -- No. 1 Florida State's 21-game winning streak came to end one shy of the school record in an 8-4 loss to Clemson in front of a season-high 5,021 fans at Dick Howser Stadium.

Right-hander Mike Paradis (4-0) earned the win for Clemson, in a six-inning outing in which he held the Seminoles to three runs on just four hits. Relieve Matt Additon earned his first save of the season after striking four batters in three innings to close the game.

FSU starter Nick Stocks (8-1) took his first loss of the year, surrendering eight runs in 6 1/3 innings. Stocks struck out four in the appearance, but the eight runs and 11 hits were the most he has allowed in his career.

It was Florida State's first ACC loss of the season as they moved to 35-4 overall and 13-1 in the conference. Clemson improved to 19-15 overall and 3-4 in ACC play.

The Tigers got out to an early lead with a four-run first inning as the first four batters scored, the last two on a two-RBI double by Jason Harris. A two-run home run by Henri Stanley in the top of the fourth gave Clemson a 6-1 lead. Patrick Boyd's solo home run and an RBI-double by Khalil Greene, which scored Harris after he doubled, pushed the margin to 8-3 after the top half of the seventh.

FSU put single runs on the scoreboard in the third, fourth and fifth innings. In the third, leftfielder John-Ford Griffin reached on a walk and scored on second baseman Marshall McDougall's double, which extended his hitting streak to 30 games.

First baseman John Halliday doubled in the fourth and crossed the plate after a pair of wild pitches by Paradis. The Seminoles' third run came after designated-hitter Sam Scott singled, stole second, took third on a fielder's choice and scored on another wild pitch.

Florida State scored attempted a come back in the bottom of the ninth after catcher Jeremiah Klosterman led off the inning with a single to left and his pinch-runner, Karl Jernigan, scored on a ground ball out by Griffin for the Seminoles final run of the game.
