GREENVILLE, S.C.--Florida State ended its 1982 cross country season on Saturday at the NCAA Regional meet in Greenville, S.C. Florida State, who beat Virginia Tech last weekend to win the 1982 Metro Championship, finished a disappointing 12th in the men's division.

In order to qualify, a team had to place in the top four at the regionals. East Tennessee State won the meet with a team score of 56, Clemson was second with 94, Virginia Tech third at 132 and Tennessee claimed the last spot in the NCAA Championship field with a 141 team score.

Individually, Hans Koeleman won the 10,000-meter run in 29:00. Philip Rolle was the first Seminole across the line, finishing 24th in 30:30. Other FSU finishers included Paul Waldron 49th (31:14), Greg Doss 71st (31:36), Ronnie Treadway 81st (31:43), and Richie Lewis 98th (32:02).

In the women's meet, FSU did not compete as a team due to a rash of injuries and the ineligibility of freshman Sandra Arthurton. Several FSU members tried to qualify for the NCAA Championships as individuals. Margaret Coomber came closest to that goal, finishing in 29th place with a 18:10 timing over the 5,000-meter course.

Virginia, considered one of the top women's teams in the nation, finished first with a net of 27 points.
