## Seminoles Drop 6-0 Tilt to Cumberland

LEBANON, Tenn., Nov 15 (AP)—Hampered by wind, rain and mud, a Cumberland university football squad eked out a 6 to 0 victory over a visiting Florida State University football squad here yesterday.

The game's only score came in the second quarter when Bernard Hicks took a 10-yard pass from Brown Braley on Florida State's 20 yard line and cut across the gridiron for the only marker of the game. The visitors swarmed over the Cumberland line and blocked Carl Boley's attempt at an extra point by placement.

Both teams dropped the slippery heavy ball numerous times. The home town team recovered three of its five fumbles, while Florida State regained six of her 11 bobbles.

### Passing Was Numerous

The passing was as numerous, and as bad, as the fumbling. Florida made 11 attempts, completed three and had two intercepted. The Bulldogs tossed 16, completed six, and saw Florida grab three.

In the last quarter Florida made its bid for a score moving up to the Cumberland 25-yard-line, but there Bulldogs held them for downs.

The winners were able to mark up only six first downs as the visitors tallied for nine.
