

Seminoles Edge Millsaps 7-6

in Dixie Loop Debut

Strauss' TD, Crona's Kick Give FSU Win

TIGER STADIUM, Jackson, Miss., Oct. 23—An underdog Florida State University eleven came from behind here tonight with a 52-yard touchdown drive and a perfect point from placement to knock the Millsaps Majors from the ranks of the undefeated teams.

The Seminoles comeback, which wiped out a 6-0 lead the Majors had achieved just a few minutes earlier in the same period, gave FSU a stirring triumph in its Dixie Conference debut, and spoiled Millsaps' annual Homecoming celebrations.

A dim crowd of some 4,000 fans, who had watched the Majors dominate the play through the entire first half, were stunned as the Indian eleven from Florida finally gained momentum and drove to the winning tally.

Sudden Score

The Seminoles' score came with startling suddenness after Dave McIntosh, Little All-American halfback, had put his club in the lead with a brilliant 40-yard dash down the sidelines.

After Stewart's try for the point had been blocked by a wave of Seminole linemen, the Majors kicked off to the FSU 30. Ed Fox, Seminole game captain, started his mates on the road to victory when he raced back to the Majors 48 yard line with the boot.

Buddy Strauss, hard-hitting fullback, drove for eight yards, and Ted Hewett, a fine player for the Indians all night, moved down to the Majors' 31 yard line.

Ralph Chairdron then speared Hewett with a 21-yard aerial to the Millsaps 10. And on the first play from that point Strauss bulldozed over tackle for the touchdowns.

Joe Crona, combination tackle-center, then toed the all-important point from placement. And FSU had a slim lead which it guarded like gold throughout the remainder of the tilt. Crona's kick, ironically was the first extra-point that the Seminoles had scored all season. They missed five straight in their opener against Cumberland and failed again in their lone attempt to convert against Erskine last weekend.

The Seminoles were on the ropes several times during the first half when McIntosh, Britt and Davis sparked drives that led deep into FSU territory. But the Indians tightened in the shadow of their goal and once halted the Majors on the one-foot line.

Millsaps Dominates

So completely did Millsaps dominate the first two periods that FSU was able to rack up only one first down during the first half, while the Majors were rolling up nine.

Chaudron for the Seminoles and McIntosh for the Majors engaged in a punting duel through most of the first quarter before Millsaps went on the march with its threats in the second.

Early in the third period the Indians were apparently on the march when a fumble on the Millsaps' 45 suddenly turned the tide.

McIntosh slipped away to a first down on the FSU 40, and a roughing penalty moved the Majors to the FSU 25. Another roughing penalty, this time against Millsaps, set them back to the Indian 40, and when McIntosh missed with a pass it appeared that the danger had passed.

But the slippery breakaway star

suddenly skirted left end and went all the way for the score.

The game was rough from start to finish with numerous penalties against both clubs.
