FSU Rumbles Over Mississippi

College 33 to 12

ATTACK LED BY STRAUSS

Seminoles Pile Up 375 Yards Rushing

Special to The Democrat ROBINSON FIELD, CLINTON. Miss. Oct 8-The Florida Uniersity Seminoles opened defense of their Dixte conference champlonship in impressive fashion here tonight, rumbling over Mississippi College's Choctaws 33-12 with a power-packed running attack headed by fullback Buddy Strauss.

The big Indiana from Tallahassee ripped and fore through the

Choc forward wall for 375 yards as they stomped up and down the field, scoring in every quarter.

Strauss, a driving, punishing plunger, continually blasted his way through the Mississippians every time it appeared that the Seminoles were beginning to lag

Key Role

The hard-running fullback scored only once, but he played a key role in setting up all the other four touchdowns.

Mississippi's efforts to retaliate along the ground were continually smothered by FSU's big tough line as the Choca were limited to a pet of 44 yards by rushing.

Capt Hugh Adams, Whitey Urghuart, Bill Dawkins and Ted Hewitt sparked the Indians on the defense.

The Choctaws took to the air often in a desperate attempt to pass their way into the ball game. and they succeeded once in cutting the Seminole margin to 14-12 in the second quarter when Davey Lee hit a hot streak. But the Seminoles managed to stave off each succeeding threat, and won coing away.

Strauss had plenty of help from his mates along the ground. The FSU line was opening holes and Strauss, MacLean, Parrish and Peterson kept on the move all

aight.

MacLean, the Seminole scoring and running ace of 1948, gained constatently, but was unable to shake loose. He scored the first touchdown from three yards out.

Peterson Scats

Dick Peterson turned in the longest run of the game, a 63vard scoring launt off tackle for he final touchdown in the fourth serior.

Red Parrish scored once on a reverse in the second period. The other PSU tally came in the third period when Strauss connected with Hewitt on a jump pass down the middle.

For Mississippi College, Lee set up one touchdown with his passms, and comected with Fulton for the other.

A slim crowd of 2,000 as FSU roll up its second win of the season, and Mississippi lose its secand game against one victory.

FIRST QUARTER

After the two teams had sparred for an opening through the early minutes without success, Capt. Hugh Adams put FSU on the move by intercepting a abort pass on the 50 and going to the 45. The Seminoles two blg guns, MacLean and Strauss went right to work Strauss alammed for 15, MacLean got 10 and then 4. Straus picked up II, then came back for 4 to put the ball on the one. From that point MacLean pulled over for the score. Hanson converted and the quarter ended with FSU leading 7-0

SECOND QUARTER

PSU went on the move again enriv in the quarter, taking over on their 36 and racing 64 yards to gore. Parrish's running pass to flanakas ate up 35 yards to the 15, the Choctawa were penalized to the 10, and three plays later Strauss grashed over for the second acore. Hanson clicked again and 11 was 14-0.

Davey Lee found the range for Mississippi to put the Chocs back in the game. He tossed two passes to Hughes and Fulton to move make the 10. A penalty set FSU to the 4 and Howard scored from

there on a double reverse. The kick was low-and it was 14-6.

Wall intercepted a pass for the Chocs and went to the FSU 35. Lee hit Fulton on the 21, then hit him again for the score. The kick was blocked and it was 14-12.

FSU bounced right back with its third score. The Seminoles look the kirkoff back to the 25 and rolled 75 yards to score. A 14-yard dash by Parrish, MacLean's 21-yard run and a Strauss to Hewitt pass are up most of the ground. Parrish went the final two yards on a reverse, and Hanson was true with his toe again to make it 21-12 at the half.

THIRD QUARTER

PSU took over on its 39 early in the period and began another sustained drive. Parrish got ill at one clip, and Strauss added 17 and 13 yard blasts. MacLean not 3 to the 9, and Strauss bit Hewith with a jump pass down the middle for the score. Hanson's kick was no good and the score was 27-12. Pumbles and pass interceptions halted the scoring for the remainder of the period, though PSU drove from its 10 to the 31 on one march.

FOURTH QUARTER

After Dawkins had covered a Choc fumble on his own 15 to halt a threat the Seminoles began to move toward their final tally. Strauss got 18 and then 1 to charge to the 37. From that point Peterson burst over tackle, cut back nicely and reced 63 yards to acore. Hanson's kick was low. Hewitt stopped one Choc march with an interception, and the game ended with the two teams trading the ball deep in Mississippi territory.
