

Seminoles Shoot Down Flying Fleet Squad, 26 to 7

Indians Score Three 'Quickies' in Burst

The Florida State University Seminoles slammed over three quick touchdowns in a concentrated scoring burst early last night and raced on to a 26-7 triumph over Erskine's Flying Fleet before a crowd of 6,800 fans in Centennial Field.

In the short space of 10 plays, beginning late in the first period and running over into the early minutes of the second quarter, the Indians took advantage of every break to score three triphammer touchdowns that clinched the decision.

Dick Peterson, junior halfback from Chicago, started the flurry when he pounded over right guard from two yards out to climax a 50-yard march.

Fleet Fumbles

On the second play after FSU's kickoff guard Loren Maltby recovered a Fleet fumble on the 37, and two plays later Walter Foy swept right end for 32 yards and a touchdown.

Maltby recovered another fumble on the 29-ard line on the first play following FSU's second touchdown, and the Indians were off and running again.

Two running plays and a pass moved to the 3, and Peterson cracked right tackle for the score.

Hanson tacked on the point after touchdown on the third score to give the Indians a 19 point lead that they protected throughout the game. Red Parish accounted for FSU's final score, running around left end for 14 yards on a reverse. Hanson again converted.

The Fleet's lone score came in the fourth period when John "Duke" Dulumbuck slithered eight yards to score after his passes had moved his team into paydirt.

The victory was 'The Seminoles' third in a row this year, and their ninth consecutive triumph in a two-year span.

The win evened the count with Erskine. The Fleet was the last club to halt Don Veller's rampaging Indians, turning the trick last Oct 15 in Due West, S C.

Jerry Morrical, Capt Hugh Adams, Maltby and Joe Marcus paced the big Seminole forward wall.

Wide-Open Affair

The game was a wide-open affair with FSU rolling up 326 yards from scrimmage, and Erskine picking up 215.

Until Dulumbuck started hitting with his tosses in the second half neither club was able to gain much ground through the air. The Erskine southpaw was one of the standout players on the field during his limited service.

Feeling between the two teams broke out in the fading minutes of the second half when two players passed punches, and the two teams started trading blows.

Every man on Coach Johnny McMillan's traveling squad saw action in the rough and tumble tilt, while injured freshman back Johnny Quinn was the only Seminole on the varsity squad who failed to get into the melee.

First Quarter

Erskine took the opening kickoff and drove down to the 20 before they ran out of gas, and the two teams battled scorelessly around midfield until Chaudron intercepted a pass and hauled it to the 50. Parish, Foy and Strauss carried FSU overland to the 13. Foy banged right tackle for a score, but the Indians were off-sides and set back to the 18. They moved back to the 2 and Peterson

banged right guard for the score. Hanson failed to convert.

The Indians were in gear now and they rolled fast. Maltby recovered a fumble after the kickoff, and Foy swept right end for 32 yards and another score. After a penalty had set the Indians back on their try for the point a pass failed to connect. On the first play after the kickoff Maltby fell on another fumble, and the Indians were headed home again as the quarter ended, 12-0.

Second Quarter

Strauss bulled to the 23, then hit Hewitt with a pass to the 9. Parish swept to the 3, and Peterson cracked right tackle for the score. Hanson converted and the score was FSU 19-0.

The two teams traded the ball back and forth fruitlessly as two fumbles and three intercepted passes nullified each threat.

Then, with 20 seconds left to go in the half and FSU on Erskine's 45, a fight broke out between two players. Members of both teams traded punches in the outbreak. Two FSU players and one Erskine man were ejected from the game.

A hideout pass from Peterson to Reddick moved FSU to the 13, and Peterson ran to the 5, but time ran out and the half ended.

Third Period

Urquhart took the second half kickoff on his 7 and raced back up to the 30 as the Seminoles went into gear again. Parish, Foy and Strauss grounded down to the 14, and from that point Parish swept around left end on a reverse and scored. He was hit on the 2, but dove over into paydirt. Hanson converted and FSU led 26-0. Erskine picked up two first downs on Dulumbuck's passes, but had to punt, and the quarter ended with FSU at midfield.

Fourth Period

Aided by two 15-yard penalties, FSU drove to the Fleet 20, but their aerial game failed and Erskine took over on its 33 and started a drive of its own that moved to the Seminole 12 before Morriscal intercepted a pass.

After FSU punted out to midfield the Fleet drove to its only score. Dulumbuck's passes ate up most of the yardage, and the southpaw quarterback slipped off

tackle himself for the last eight yards. Bennett converted and the score was FSU 26, Erskine 7. The game ended without further scoring.
