

Seminoles Shoot Down Jax Fliers With 39-0 Barrage

Turk and Campbell Each Tally Two TD's

GATOR BOWL, JACKSONVILLE—Florida State University fired a six-touchdown salvo into an over-matched, under-conditioned Jacksonville Naval Air Station eleven here yesterday, and shot the futile Fliers down, 39-0 before a woefully slim, shivering crowd of 1,732.

The Seminoles, rumbling to their fifth win of the season against a single loss, and rolling up their 29th victory in 32 games under the tutelage of Dr. Don Veller, scored once in the opening period, twice in the second quarter and then wound up with a flurry of three fast TDs in the final period when the Fliers tired badly and had been stripped of several of their top performers.

Four Fliers prevented the game from turning into a complete rout—Darrell Spang and Mike Norman on offense and W. C. Sweat and Bob Chesson on defense.

Spang, a slim, six-foot, 165 pounder, lent the Navy eleven some striking power with his spirited running and turned in the day's top dash—a 75-yard sprint to the Seminole 15 in the third period where he was hauled down from behind by Tommy Brown.

Sweat, a 230-pounder from Live Oak with about six years of service ball behind him, hit extremely hard all day from his defensive tackle post and is one of the top linemen the Seminoles have faced this Fall.

With a few more Sweats and Spangs the Fliers could have made it a ball game, but as it was the Navy was the least impressive eleven the Indians have met since Troy State in the opener, and only the fact that FSU appeared a little "flat" itself prevented the score from rising even higher.

Dick Turk, chunky reserve full-back with the jet takeoff, and Curt Campbell accounted for two touchdowns apiece with Mike Sellers and Tommy Brown contributing the other two.

Turk, who was FSU's best runner yesterday, blasted over from the 5 in the second period and from the one-foot line in the fourth quarter. Campbell took a nine-yard pass from Gary Folsom and skipped across for one touchdown in the second quarter, and grabbed a 15-yard shot and raced 30 yards for his second score in the final stanza.

Sellers, closing in on his own FSU season scoring record of 54 points, bulled his way 25 yards off tackle for the first Seminole touchdown in the opening period to boost his total for the current campaign to 42 points and put him 13 points of a new mark.

Brown, who punted for a phenomenal 42-yard-plus average today and twice nailed runners when he was the "last man, turned in the Seminoles offensive highlight late in the fourth period when he grabbed a Tarzetti punt on his own 42-yard line, ran wide to his right toward the west stands and swept 58 yards to the sixth and final score after getting a key block by Preston Bradley.

Neither Bobby Fiveash nor Roy Thompson hit paydirt, but they

combined to help Turk spark the attack along the ground, with Fiveash looking particularly good in his first real heavy-duty role. The Bainbridge, Ga. boy gained 38 yards after having a 15-yard loss deducted. Thompson chipped in with 56, second only to Turk's leading total of 64.

Ernie Huggett converted on three out of six conversions, hitting after TDs number two, three and six.

Showing its usual punch along the ground, FSU rolled up 218 yards running and added another 120 through the airways though they completed only five out of 18 passes.

The Navy, limited to three first downs all day, gained 108 yards on the ground and were limited to seven more yards in the air though they completed four of 14 passes.

Spang's 75-yard sprint, which came in the third period when the Fliers were backed up on their own 15, gave the Navy its first down of the game and set up their lone scoring threat. That bid was quickly killed by Campbell who grabbed a Mike Norman pass on his own three and fled to his 45.

Norman, tailback in the Navy's single-wing, was a workhorse—running, passing and punting—but he was pretty well blanketed by the stout FSU defense until the fourth period when he slipped away up the middle several times against the reserves.

Chesson handled a defensive end post well, particularly in the first two periods.

Captain Bill Dawkins, John Karoliwicz, Bob Schmeiz, Jimmie Lee Taylor, Charlie Brown and a host of other linemen turned in top defensive games for the Indians.

Spang, Norman, quarterback Bob DePasquale, Jimmy Bishop and Chesson were all knocked out of action for the Navy at one spot or another and for varying lengths of time.

FIRST QUARTER

After sparring for five minutes with neither team able to move the chains for a first down, FSU

moved to its first touchdown on one of Roy Thompson's "pet" plays.

Norman quick-kicked 32 yards to the Seminole 28, and T. Brown came back to the 36. After two running plays lost a yard, Thompson got away inside left tackle on the same play that he had ram-bled 76 yards against Stetson, and sped 40 yards to the Fliers 25. Fiveash missed with a pass, but Sellers bulled inside left tackle and tromped over four Fliers into paydirt. Huggett's kick was wide and low and it was 6-0.

T. Brown and Bishop engaged in a punting duel until late in the period when Campbell intercepted Norman's pass on the Navy 27 and returned to the 25. Huey sneak 5 to the 20 as the quarter ended.

SECOND QUARTER

Turk, Thompson and Fiveash bit off 5, 2 and 4 yard chunks to the Flier 5, and Turk cracked right tackle from there for the score to make it 12-0 with only two minutes of the period gone. Huggett was good this time and it was 13-0.

A minute later it was 20-0 as Brown intercepted Bishop's pass on the first play following the kickoff and ran 11 yards to the Navy 25. Turk speared Campbell with a jump pass to the 16, and after Navy caught a 5-yard penalty back to the 11, Folsom hit Campbell on the two and the sure-handed end skipped over to score. Huggett converted for the 20th point. FSU made another bid later in the period, girding 45 yards to the Flier 24 before McIntire intercepted Huey's pass to halt the drive.

THIRD QUARTER

Spang returned the second kickoff 35 yards to his 40, but Navy could get nowhere and FSU held and took over on its own 31 after Spang's short punt. The Seminoles moved to midfield and Brown sliced a beautiful 46 yard punt out on the Flier 7. Backed to the wall, Navy punted out to its own 44, then Bishop intercepted a Fiveash pass on his 11. Knocked back to its 10, Navy shook Spang loose inside left end, and the speedy back raced 75 yards to the Indian 15 before T. Brown ran him down from behind. That was Navy's first first down.

Campbell got FSU out of that spot quickly, intercepting Norman's pass on his 3 and flying out to his 47. Fiveash hit Sellers with a pass that covered 40 yards to the Flier 20, but Sellers fumbled on the next play after bulling to the 15.

Taking over on Navy's 36 after

Spang's short punt, FSU started to roll. With first Fiveash and then Turk slamming for 11 yard gains, the Indians rumbled to the Flier 7 as the period closed.

FOURTH QUARTER

Turk banged to the one-foot line on the first play, then dove over right guard for the score. Huggett was wide and it was 26-0.

Navy flashed a drive, moving down to FSU's 42 on runs by Norman and Tarzetti before Norman was trapped for a 23-yard loss on an attempted pass. Brown took Norman's punt on his own 35 and zipped back to the Flier 45. On the next play Folsom connected with Campbell on the 30, and Campbell eluded two tacklers nicely and raced across to score. Huggett missed and it was 32-0.

When Navy stalled after the kickoff, Tarzetti punted to T. Brown on the FSU 42, and the slick Seminole safety man ran wide to his right, picked up a key block on the Fliers 40 and went 58 yards to score. Huggett converted and it was 39-0.
