Seminoles Pound Out 47-6 Victory Over Louisville

Teams Loosen Up, Toss 55 Passes In Tilt

FSU Pulls Away In Second Period

LOUISVILLE, Ky., Oct. 2—In this land of thoroughbred race-horses, Florida State's Seminoles, proving themselves not quite as green as the mis-named Kentucky Bluegrass, shook the kinks out of their offensive legs and sprinted to a 47-6 triumph over University of Louisville's Cardinals before a piteous crowd of perhaps 1,000 here Saturday afternoon.

Both teams loosened their reins and let go. All told, there were 55 passes thrown, 24 by FSU. The Seminoles, with Harry Massey in the fore of four quarterbacks, completed nine. Louisville, with a gallant, lame Johnny Unitas in the saddle, connected with nine, too.

GRAHAM FACTOR

Billy Graham spurred FSU's early game with runs and pass in-

terceptions and had the distinction of scoring the first touchdown of the campaign for the Seminoles. Graham, most of the other regulars, sat on the bench much of the way as Coach Tom Nugent used his entire squad of 40.

Louisville managed to make it interesting in the first quarter and it was 7-6 after 15 minutes. But the Seminoles raced away with three second-quarter touchdowns, tacked on two more in the third, one in the fourth. No Seminole scored more than one of the seven touchdowns.

An alert FSU defense accounted for four interceptions. Louisville hauled in three FSU strays. The Seminoles hopped on two Cardinal Pumbles. FSU held to the ball, fumbled not at all.

NEGROES START

For the first time, PSU was playing against a team with Negroes in its lineup. Three of them — center Andy Walker, halfbacks George Cain and Leonard Lyles—were starters.

As the sun peeked in and out of an overcast, Louisville won the toos and received. Three plays got but five yards and the Cardinals punted from their 33, with Massey returning the boot to FSU's 34. Massey was pitching from the start. Units, leaping out of bounds, batted the ball back to John Sowa for an apparent interception, but it was ruled an incomplete pass because the quarteback stepped outside the boundary.

Quickly, PSU moved all the way, Massey fired to Graham for 32 yards to the Louisville 34. Graham sliced off tackle for

seven. Massey passed to Buddy Reynolds for 22 to the five. Then Massey passed again to Graham for the touchdown, Graham converted for 7-0.

CHARGING DEFENSE

After the kick, Unitas hit Sowa with a 17-yard pass but his other throws, in the face of a charging FSU defense, fell astray and Louisville punted again. Buck Metts picked up 12 yards his first carry, but Unitas intercepted a Ted Rodrigue pass and Louisville was in business at the FSU 37.

Pred Zangaro grabbed a Unitas pass for 18 yards. An offside penalty stymied the Cardinals for a brief moment, but Unitas passed to John Becker at the 15, to Charlie Phillips at the

seven. Zangaro powered to the four. A pass fell incomplete but Bill Layne sliced to the one. Layne cracked over on fourth down. Zangaro missed the conversion and FSU led, 7-6.

It was obvious Louisville, nursing the sting of last year's 59-0 defeat, had come to play a ball game. Within four minutes playing time, three Seminoles were helped off the field—freshmen guards Leo Basgett, Leon Bryant and sophomore halfback Metts.

10-YARD LOSS

As the second quarter moved under way, Louisville stopped one FSU bid when Joe Unitas, cousin of Johnny, crashed through to sock quarterback Vick Prinzi for a 10-yard loss.

A punt exchange left PSU set at the 50. Massey was back in to direct a drive for TD No. 2. Reynolds started it with an 11-yard dash to the 39. Massey passed to Tom Feamster for 12. John Griner hit guard for seven to the 20. Graham swept wide to left. Picked up 15. Massey, on the keep, whipped to the right and was over from the five standing up. Graham's toe made it 14-6.

Billy Odom's interception of a Unitas bullet at the PSU 45 started another scoring push. Len Swantic was in to railroad this one. A pass to Feamster at the Louisville 46, Odom's rush to the 40, another aerial grab by Feamster at the 29, Ronnie King's 15-yard skip through the middle to the 14, Swantic's sweep to the right for seven—and FSU had TD No. 3. Lee Corso swung his foot for 21-6.

Moments later guard Charley
Jacobs swooped on a Unitas fumble at the Louisville 40. Rodrigue made fast work of this one.
He passed 24 yards to Bill Weaver, 14 to Reynolds and FSU was

at the two. King crashed over guard from there. Graham made the point for 28-6.

Sub guard Vince Gibson recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass for PSU before the
first half ticked away. A counter interception by the Cards'
Jim Houser at the Louisville 10
stopped one drive. A play earlier, Bob Grenn had dropped a
touchdown-labelled pass from
Rodrigue at the 15.

FSU TAKES OVER

With things under control, PSU decided to let Louisville receive the second-half kick. But the Cardinals could cut no mustard. After the punt, PSU

opened up at its 39.

The Seminoles stayed on the ground. King crashed through for 12, Swantic swept for 14 and nine. Metts dug for 12 in leading to the Cardinals 21. Seconds later, a personal foul was assessed against the home team, putting FSU at the one. Reynolds raced wide to the right for the six points. Graham missed and it was 34-6.

With five minutes left in the quarter, Louisville had an opportunity when Max Slechter basged a Massey pass at the FSU 30. Jim Houser's pass to Cam placed Louisville at the 15, but Massey put a stop to it by intercepting a fourth-down toss at the three and skipping up to his 31.

After Graham was nabbed for minus five back to the 26. Vick Prinzi came in to hit Feamster with a pass at midfield. The hig end rambled on for a touchdown on a 74-yard play. Graham's kick was wide and it was 40-6 with two seconds remaining in the period.

THREAT STOPPED

Early in the final frame. Unitas passed 18 yards to Sowa. 31 to Becker and Louisville had a first down at the Seminole three. But FSU bottled up the threat by stopping three running plays. Becker dropped a Unitas pass in the end zone.

With 2:32 left, FSU moved to a final touchdown on a 36-yard run by Prinzi. Trying to pass, he elected to keep and raced around right end for the score. Corso set it up with a pass interception. Graham converted for a concluding 47-6.
