## FLORIDA STATE'S OUTLOOK IN 1966

The odds are stacked against Florida State's Seminoles in 1966, but if some key pieces fall into place, Coach Bill Peterson may not be too unhappy with the solution of the puzzle that was spring practice, 1966.

Youth will be the byword of the '66 Siminoles, but there's enough experience present to flavor next fall's squad and present a slightly better than pessimistic outlook. The major stumbling block will be the schedule which ranks as the toughest ever played by a Florida State team.

The graduation losses, particularly on defense, were considerable, but the Seminole ranks are filled with young, eager and fierce sophomores. The highlight of spring practice was the attitude of these youngsters, not to mention the way they hit.

"It was really the most exciting spring we've ever had," Peterson said. "Every position was wide open. The attitude of the squad was tremendous, and these boys like to hit."

The biggest question in the spring revolved around the quarterback slot handled so capably by Steve Tensi in 1964 and Ed Pritchett last season. Out of 13 possible candidates, the struggle for this all-important position narrowed to a three-man race during the latter workouts.

Kim Hammond was a little used reserve last year as a sophomore. He has the edge in experience over Bill Cappleman and Gary Pajcic, both of whom were freshmen last season. Hammond has the all around skills, Cappleman the best arm, and Pajcic those undefined, but necessary traits of a great athlete--poise, leadership and the ability to win.

Whoever winds up at quarterback in FSU's pro-type offense will find one of the finest groups of receivers in the land awaiting his passes. None of the ends and flanker backs have a particular edge over the others at this time, but this should be Florida State's strongest department in both ability and depth.

Flanker Bill Cox, split end Lane Fenner and tight end Thurston Taylor are the leaders now, just ahead of an outstanding field of receivers which includes Jerry Jones, Donovan Jones, Chip Glass, Ron Sellers and T. K. Wetherell.

Offensive tackle play should be highlighted by Larry Kissam, a senior who packs all the necessary equipment. Jay Mac Matthews may man the other side, unless it is decided his talents are needed more on defense. Several youngsters must come through for depth.

Peterson considers guard Del Williams as one of the nation's most outstanding offensive linemen. A two-year letterman, Williams is the key man in the offensive line.



Opposite Williams will be veteran Larry Williamson or Wayne McDuffie. Hampered by injuries last year and this spring. McDuffie can play any offensive line position and will figure prominently somewhere next fall.

John Stephens is small as offensive centers go, but he has two letters and is a steady competitor. McDuffie can help out here if necessary, and several youngsters show potential.

The running game should be adequate. Bill Moreman should continue to improve after an outstanding sophomore year at left half, and bruising Jim Mankins should have the fullback spot all to himself after a good spring. Johnny Hurst is a good sophomore candidate at left half, and letterman Larry Green should add excitement if he can shake an injury jinx.

Mike Blatt was a reserve linebacker last fall, but is being figured as a fullback next year as a result of his spring performance. Wayne Giardino, a starter for two years at fullback, is currently listed as a defensive end, but could still figure in the backfield.

The defensive secondary was a pleasant surprise this spring, although it is stocked with sophomores. Bill Campbell is a returning letterman, and a top candidate for All America. Pat Conway is also a letterman, but has been injured.

Conway's injury and Campbell's participation in track this spring left the field open to the newcomers and several have been found who will play. Howell Montgomery, Marty Kolbus, Walter Sumner, Dutch Riser and possibly Pajcic have all been impressive.

Two sophomores have appeared at linebacker to carry on in the tradition of Dick Hermann and Bill McDowell of the 1964 team. Dale McCullers and Carlie McNeil need experience, but both have speed and ability.

Mike Bugar has a big spot to fill, but the former high school quarterback was chosen as the most outstanding defensive player at middle guard this spring. He has great quickness and possesses the ability to get around the ball carrier somehow.

Charles Pennie was outstanding at defensive tackle last season, and should be on someone's All America team this fall. He'll team with offensive convert David Braggins and several promising sophomores.

Neither of the defensive ends have ever played there before, but both are outstanding athletes. Giardino can play the position, as can Bob Menendez, another backfield recruit.

SUMMARY: Young, but eager. Strong pass receivers. Untried defense. Thin in the offensive line. Capable running backs. Inexperienced, but talented secondary.

## SOME SEMINOLE STANDOUTS FOR '66

BILL CAMPBELL, Defensive back, 5-9, 180, Sr. Tampa--The team's fastest man, Campbell is a threat to score any time he gets his hands on the ball. He returned 20 punts for 301 yards last fall. Good pass defender and tackler. Made a key interception in the end zone on a two-point conversion try against VPI last fall(FSU won, 7-6). Springs for Florida State's track team in the spring. Should make a bid for honors on the gridiron this fall.

CHARLES PENNIE, Defensive tackle, 6-4, 240, Sr, Hollywood--He was supposed to take a back seat to older brother Frank(drafted by Detroit) last season, but Charlie became a star in his own right and wound up an All Florida selection. Big and mobile, he played most of last season on a bad knee which has since been corrected. A good senior year will make him one of the South's top defensive performers.

JIM MANKINS, Fullback, 6-2, 226, Sr, King City, Calif.--Although Mankins alternated with Wayne Giardino at fullback early last year, the big fellow finished the season as Florida State's leading ground gainer with 336 yards on 85 carries, an average of 4.0. He has surprising speed for his size and power to burn. Mankins is also a good pass receiver, and is an additional threat in this category.

BILL MOREMAN, Running back, 5-11, 185, Daytona Beach--Began last season as a standin for the injured Phil Spooner, but was probably the best running back on the Seminole squad by season's end. Good balance and timing, hard to bring down. Moreman fights for extra yardage and can get it. His 20 yard touchdown run in heavy traffic broke Georgia's back last season(FSU won, 10-3).

MIKE BUGAR, Middle Guard, 6-0, 208, Jr, Youngstown, O.--No one expected the Seminoles to be able to replace Jack Shinholser any time soon, but Bugar moved into this position on the first day of spring drills and was awarded the outstanding defensive player award at spring's end. Cat quick and tough, he's a former high school quarterback. He sometimes seems to get to the quarterback before the ball.

DEL WILLIAMS, Offensive guard, 6-2, 237, Sr, Live Oak--Coach Bill Peterson believes Williams is one of the nation's best offensive linemen, and past performances bear him out. A starter at tackle for two years, he has shifted to guard for 1966 to shore up the middle of the line. Surprisingly fast for his size, his blocking on sweeps should mean yardage for the Seminole running game. Has no peer as a pass blocker.

## TOP SOPHOMORE PROSPECTS

GARY PAJCIC, Quarterback, 6-2, 194, So, Jacksonville--If Pajcic doesn't win the starting quarterback role next fall, he'll probably be a defensive starter, but knowledgeable observers look for him to be under center where he gained All South freshman recognition last year in leading the FSU yearlings to a 5-1 record. Pajcic has that intangible substance of leadership which gets points on the scoreboard. An all around athlete, he's also a standout in the classroom.

HOWELL MONTGOMERY, Defensive back, 5-11, 178, Blountstown--A great high school athlete from Florida's Big Bend area, Montgomery should develop into one of the nation's best defensive backs before he graduates. He has a sixth sense for getting to the ball, and is a good tackler.

BILL COX, Flanker back, 6-1, 185, Atlanta, Ga.--Cox was being compared to Fred Biletnikoff before an injury sidelined him last fall, and now he seems ready to step into the big role after a red shirt season. He has great hands, good moves and is fast. He can catch the ball in a crowd and make yardage afterwards.

RON SELLERS, Flanker back, 6-4, 183, Jacksonville--Possibly the most unlikely looking football player around, Sellers combined deceptive speed with good hands to catch ten touchdown passes as a freshman last fall. Most of these were thrown by Pajcic. The two were high school teammates at Jacksonville's Paxon High School.

JOHN HURST, Halfback, 6-0, 195, Live Oak--A powerful runner with good speed, Hurst looks like a real find. He'll back up Moreman and Larry Green, but should see plenty of action in his own right.

BILL CAPPLEMAN, Quarterback, 6-2, 197, Dunedin--After an uneventful freshman year, Cappleman made a real battle out of the quarterback race this spring. He has possibly the strongest arm of any candidate and is a good runner.

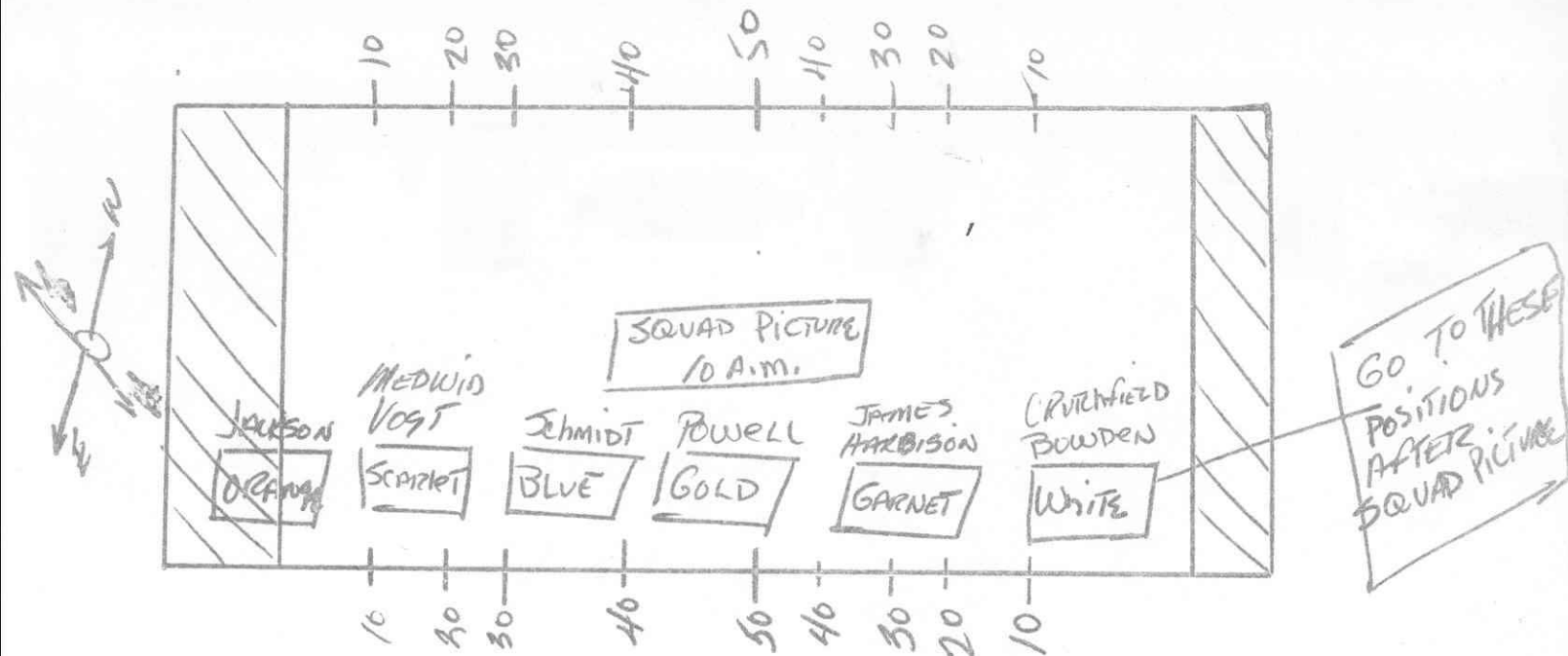
