TODAY'S GAME

Tulsa, under new head coach F.A. Dry, pulled one of the upsets of the season last Saturday night when the Golden Hurricanes tripped previously unbeaten Louisville 28-26.

Dry had replaced Claude (Hoot) Gibson the week before in a sudden turn of events.

Against the Cardinals, Dry returned to the passing game made so famous by Tulsa teams of the past. Todd Starks came back as the starting quarterback and the 175-pound senior responded with a performance which saw him complete 17 of 34 passes for 184 yards.

Dry is certainly no stranger to the coaching fraternity. He had been Tulsa's offensive coordinator in 1964 and '65 when the Golden Hurricanes presented one of the nation's best college passing attacks. He later went to Houston for five seasons as an assistant with the professional Oilers.

Earlier this season, the Hurricane had relied primarily on a running attack. With Dry at the helm, Tulsa has gone to the air more.

However, Tulsa does have an outstanding rusher in Raymond Rhodes, 184-pound speedster from Mixia, Tex. Rhodes and Florida State's Hodges Mitchell were teammates at TCU before both decided to transfer.

Rhodes, an offensive back at TCU while Mitchell performed in the defensive secondary, has carried 157 times for 627 yards this season.

In the Louisville game, Tulsa played its finest defensive game of the season. With the Golden Hurricane leading 28-26 in the fourth period, Louisville had a fourth down and one foot to go at Tulsa's 20. Louisville went for it and didn't gain an inch.

Biggest defensive standout was sophomore linebacker Al Humphrey. He was little short of sensational against the Cardinals as he came up with 10 tackles and five assists, caused a fumble in the Louisville end zone, fell on the ball for a touchdown and intercepted a pass and returned it to the Cardinal 5.

Going into the Louisville contest, Tulsa was second in the nation in pass defense.

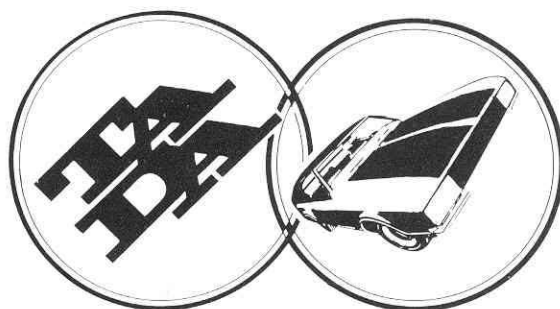
Today's game will pit strength against strength, Tulsa's stingy pass defense against Florida State's outstanding aerial game.

FLORIDA STATE'S

DISTINGUISHED PROFESSORS

Florida State can boast of many things. However, all of the University's accomplishments would have been impossible, if not for people.

Florida State is a "people" University. Its level of excellence, particularly in academics, is directly attributable to the excellence of its faculty, which includes two Nobel laureates.

Each member of the Florida State faculty has received many honors; however, since 1957 a faculty member has been singled out each year to receive the title of "Distinguished Professor of the Year;" a title bestowed on him by his colleagues.

This coveted commendation is granted to a faculty member whose extraordinary accomplishments have contributed markedly to the University's endeavors for excellence.

In order to acquaint you with each, although very briefly, a short biographical sketch of each is presented here.

PAUL A. M. DIRAC, professor of physics

Dr. Dirac's pioneer work in the quantum mechanics of the atom won him the Nobel prize in 1933 at the age of 31. A giant in his field, he has continued to make major contributions in many areas of modern theoretical physics.

He is best known for the famous "Dirac equation," with which he reconciled Erwin Schroedinger's earlier quantum theory and Einstein's theory of relativity. With his quantum theory of the electron, he replaced Schroedinger's wave equation with more general equations. His work is one of the essential foundations of later developments in particle physics.

A native of Bristol, England, Dr. Dirac received the Ph.D. from Cambridge in 1926. He is a Fellow of the Royal Society and was awarded the Society's Royal Medal in 1939. He won the Copley Medal in 1952, and in 1961 was elected a member of the Pontifical Academy of Sciences.

ROBERT S. MULLIKEN visiting professor of chemical physicals

Known as "Mr. Molecule" to scientists, he won the Nobel prize in 1966 for his fundamental work concerning chemical bonds and the electronic structure of molecules by the molecular orbital method.

Dr. Mulliken helped bridge the knowledge of chemistry and physics, spelling

out the rules by which atoms form molecules and how they are bound together by electrons. His work in this field has led to a better understanding of all kinds of modern materials and how they react to one another.

A native of Newburyport, Mass., he received the B.S. degree in 1917 from Massachusetts Institute of Technology and a Ph.D. in 1921 from the University of Chicago.

WILEY LEE HOUSEWRIGHT dean of the School of Music

Associated with the University since 1947, Dr. Housewright is the third dean of the music school. In 1958 he became a consultant for the U.S. Department of State and a member of the U.S. National Commission for UNESCO, positions he still holds.

A native of Wylie, Tex., he earned the B.A. degree at North Texas State College in 1934. After studying at the Juilliard

School of Music in New York City, he attended Columbia University where he earned the M.A. degree, and New York University, where he received the Ed.D. degree in 1943.

MICHAEL KASHA
professor of chemistry

Selected for membership in the National Academy of Sciences, Dr. Kasha has been directly responsible for the University receiving almost \$7 million in federal funds since the organization of the Institute of Molecular Biophysics in 1959. He has been its director since it was formed.

A native of New Jersey, he attended an engineering night school and then got his bachelor's degree in chemistry from the University of Michigan. He received the Ph.D. from the University of California at Berkeley in 1945.

DOROTHY LOSI BREEN HOFFMAN
professor of modern languages

A prolific writer, Dr. Hoffman's energy and devotion to service consistently transcends campus boundaries to embrace church, social and professional activities. She has achieved almost every officership or post of responsibility within the power of her associates to bestow in modern languages, in arts and sciences, and on University-wide levels.

Elected Phi Beta Kappa in her junior year, she received the B.A., M.A. and Ph.D. degrees at the University of Illinois.

CARLISLE FLOYD JR.
professor of music

The composer of numerous operas, Floyd joined the University faculty in 1947. He was the recipient of a Guggenheim Fellowship in 1956 and in 1957 received a citation from the National Association of American Composers and Conductors for Outstanding Service to American Music.

He acquired the master of music degree in 1949 from Syracuse University.

BETTY MONAGHAN WATTS
professor of food and nutrition

Dr. Watts joined the University in 1951. Now retired, she was the recipient of the 164 Border Award for outstanding research in Food Science.

She received the B.S. degree from Wilson College, Chambersburg, Pa., and the Ph.D. from Washington University in St. Louis, Mo.

RAYMOND K. SHELINE
professor of chemistry and physics

The author of more than 140 articles on various aspects of physics and chemistry, Dr. Sheline has been an invited speaker at several international gatherings and was guest research professor for three years at the Institute of Theoretical Physics in Copenhagen, Denmark.

A native of Ohio, he received the B.A. degree at Bethany College, and the Ph.D. degree from the University of California at Berkeley.

GREGORY R. CHOPPIN
professor of chemistry

A native of Eagle Lake, Tex., Dr. Choppin received the B.S. degree from Loyola University in New Orleans and the Ph.D. degree from the University of Texas.

He worked for three years at the University of California in the Lawrence Radiation Laboratory where he was part of the team that discovered the chemical element 101 in 1955. He is the author of approximately 90 papers and 4 textbooks.

EUGENE D. NICHOLS
head of mathematics education

A Polish-born mathematics educator, Dr. Nichols is well-known for his efforts in developing programs to teach "new math." He received his master's degrees in mathematics and education and his Ph.D. in mathematics education, all from the University of Illinois.

He has written numerous articles and publications in addition to more than 15 textbooks.

EARL FRIEDEN
professor of chemistry

Dr. Frieden is the author of over 75 papers including numerous reviews on the biochemistry of amphibian metamorphosis, mechanism of action of thyroid hormones, and copper enzymes and enzyme kinetics.

A native of Norfolk, Va., he received the B.A. in chemistry at the University of California, and the M.A. and Ph.D. degrees at the University of Southern California.

RALPH ALLEN BRADLEY
head of statistics

Under his direction, the Department of Statistics has become rated as the strongest in the southeast and one of the most reputable in the country.

A Fellow of the Institute of Mathematical Statistics, Dr. Bradley received the B.A. and M.A. from Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario, and the Ph.D. from the University of North Carolina.

LLOYD MUMBAUER BEIDLER
professor of biological science

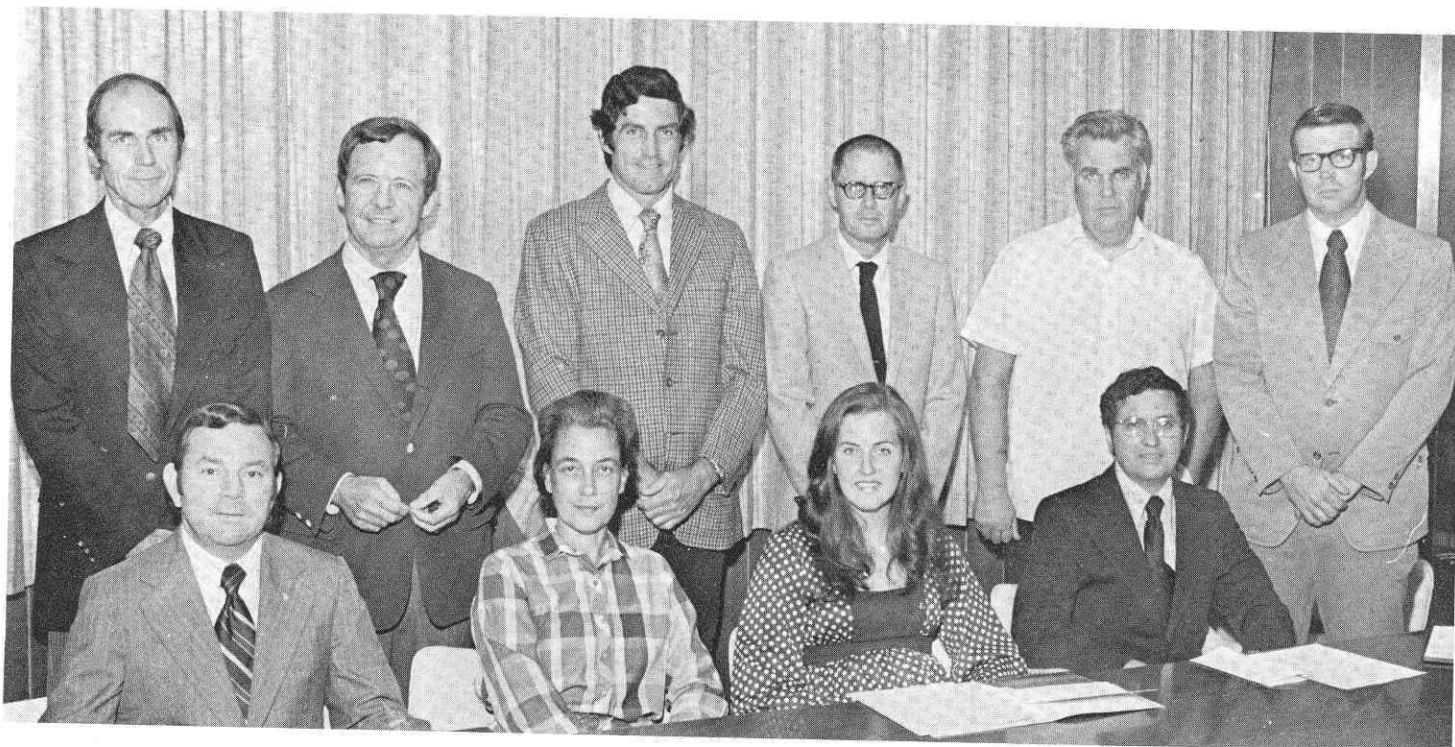
A Florida State faculty member since 1950, Dr. Beidler received his doctorate in biophysics at Johns Hopkins University in 1951 after learning a B.S. degree at Muhlenburg College.

A native of Allentown, Pa., he helped develop a science program for kindergarten through elementary school that is widely used throughout the nation, and has lectured throughout the U.S. and abroad on the biophysics of taste and odor receptors.

KELLOGG WESLEY HUNT
professor of English

The methods of language analysis devised by Dr. Hunt are used by the Princeton Educational Testing Service and his theories of language development have been incorporated in four major textbook series.

The Parkersburg, Iowa, native, who has directed several U.S. Office of Education grants, received his B.A. degree from Cornell College and the master's and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Iowa.
