ED'S NOTE: The following updates the previous release concerning the Florida State vs. Memphis State football game Saturday which will be now shown on regional television by ABC-TV.

THE GAME--Southern Independents Florida State (6-1) and Memphis State (1-5).

SITE--Liberty Bowl (50,180), Memphis, Tn.

NEW KICKOFF TIME--11:35 a.m. CDT (12:35 p.m. in Tallahassee and most of Florida).

THE ANNOUNCE TEAM--ABC-TV has assigned Steve Zabriskie (play-by-play) and Steve Davis (color), the former Oklahoma quarterback, as its announce team.

FSU AND ABC-TV IN '80--This will be the first ABC-TV appearance of the season for the Seminoles.

SEMINOLES AND ABC-TV SINCE '77--The regional TV appearance vs. Memphis State marks the seventh ABC-TV showing for the Seminoles since 1977. Three of those games were played last season with the Tribe winning at Virginia Tech (17-10), at LSU (24-19) and at Florida (27-16). The Florida game was telecast to a national audience. The Tribe had one appearance in 1977, beating Florida, 37-9, at Gainesville. The following year the Tribe won a 31-21 verdict at Miami and then erased Navy, 38-6, before a Homecoming crowd in Tallahassee.

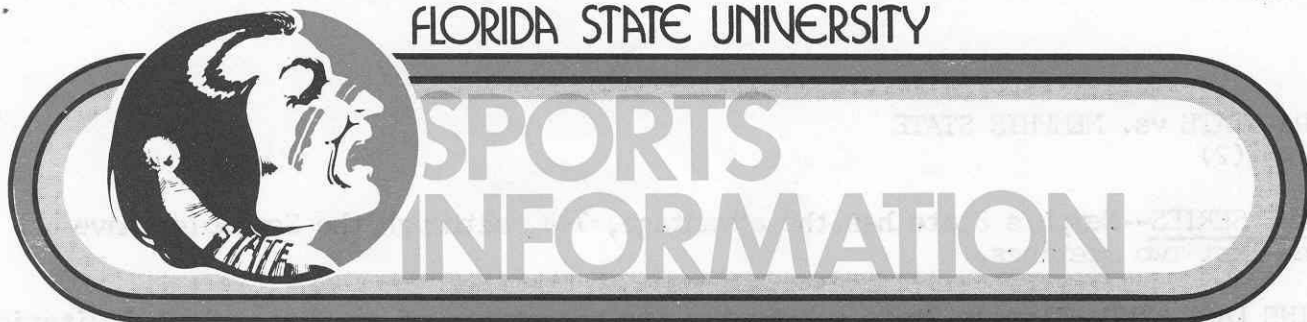
BB PERFECT WITH ABC--Seminole mentor Bobby Bowden has a perfect record on ABC-TV since joining the Tribe in 1976. His report card on ABC-TV is 6-0.

BUT A BLEMISH--Bobby Bowden has lost a network TV appearance since joining FSU. That loss came in the Orange Bowl on January 1 where the Tribe bowed 24-7 to Oklahoma. That game was beamed across the country by NBC-TV. The Seminoles have had one other non-ABC national appearance--the 1977 Tangerine Bowl telecast by Mizlou where the Tribe took a 40-17 verdict vs. Texas Tech.

SEMINOLES VS. MEMPHIS STATE ON ABC--This is not the first time Florida State and Memphis State have appeared on regional television. The 1967 game at Memphis won by the Seminoles 26-7 was also part of a regional package.

MORE ABOUT SEMINOLE AND ABC-TV--Since ABC-TV began broadcasting the NCAA college football package Florida State has been on the tube 15 times. The Tribe has a 9-5-1 record in those games. The previous ABC-TV appearances: 1959--at Blacksburg, Va., FSU 7-Virginia Tech 6; 1966--at Blacksburg, Va., Virginia Tech 23-FSU 21; 1967--Memphis, Tn., FSU 26-Memphis State 7; 1967--at Jacksonville, Fla. (Gator Bowl), FSU 17-Penn State 17; 1968--at Tallahassee, Fla., Florida 9-FSU 3; 1969--at Tallahassee, Fla., FSU 33-North Carolina State 22; 1970--at Tampa, Fla.--Houston 53-FSU 21; 1971--at Miami, Fla., FSU 20-Miami 17; 1972--at Auburn, Ala., Auburn 27-FSU 14; 1977--at Gainesville, Fla., FSU 37-Florida 9; 1978--at Miami, Fla., FSU 31-Miami 21; 1978--at Tallahassee, Fla., FSU 38-Navy 6; 1979--at Blacksburg, Va., FSU 17-Virginia Tech 10; 1979--at Baton Rouge, La., FSU 24-LSU 19; 1979--at Gainesville, Fla., FSU 27-Florida 16.

CORRECTION--There was an error in the earlier release concerning placekicker Bill Capece. He has scored 77 points this season, not 76 which was the basis of several items on page three. Thus Capece is nine points shy of tying and 10 points short of setting a new Seminole single season scoring record. He needs 21 more points over the final four regular season games to set a new I-A record for most points scored by a kicker in a single season. Bahr has the record (97) with 22 field goals plus 31 PATs.

SEVEN FROM HEAVEN--Southern independents Florida State (6-1) and Memphis State (1-5) collide in Memphis Saturday.

SITE--Liberty Bowl (50,180), Memphis, Th.

KICKOFF--7:30 p.m. CDT, 8:30 in Tallahassee and most of Florida.

EXPECTED ATTENDANCE--Memphis State officials hope for 25,000.

RADIO & TELEVISION--The extensive FSU Radio network (59 stations) will carry the game to most of the south. Gene Deckerhoff is responsible for play-by-play with former head coach Bill Peterson providing the analytical commentary. WECA-TV (27) will send the game back to Tallahassee live via the NCAA exception rule. Talent for the telecast will be Tom Mees (play-by-play) and Jim Crosby (color).

THE SEASONS--Florida State, after losing a 10-9 verdict to Miami (Fla.) in the fourth game of the season, has rallied for three consecutive wins--Nebraska (18-14), Pittsburgh (36-22) and Boston College (41-7). The Seminoles opened their season with wins over LSU (16-0), Louisville (52-0) and East Carolina (63-7).

Memphis State has been having its problems. The Tigers lost their first three games before dumping Arkansas State, 24-3. Losses to Louisville, 38-14, and North Texas State, 29-10, have followed.

LAST WEEK--Florida State, with the defense forcing Boston College mistakes, picked up a 41-7 win over the Eagles in the Tribe's Homecoming Game. The win was the sixth in seven starts for the Seminoles, who recovered two Boston College fumbles, intercepted two of the Eagles' passes and also blocked two punts. The FSU defense forced a Boston College mistake on the opening kickoff when the ball carrier fumbled and the Tribe recovered. It led to a Bill Capece field goal--his 15th of the season--a new FSU single season record. Capece would kick three more during the night to raise his season total to 18. The only Boston College score came on a 83-yard return of an interception by Rich Dyer. That score came after FSU had rolled to a 20-0 advantage.

Memphis State trailed by only three, 10-7, at intermission but couldn't keep up with North Texas State in the second half and lost a 29-10 verdict. Key to the North Texas second half effort was tailback Malcolm Jones who gained 188 yards rushing, 100 in the second half. Chief offensive threat for Memphis State was runningback Richard Williams, who gained 70 yards in 15 carries and caught another three passes for 48 yards.

THE SERIES--Memphis State has the advantage, 7-4, although the Seminoles have won the last two meetings.

THE LAST TIME--Florida State celebrated its acceptance of an Orange Bowl invitation by mauling Memphis State, 66-17, before 48,021 Doak Campbell Stadium fans last November 17. One hour before kickoff the Orange Bowl selection committee had invited FSU to play in its first New Year's Night game. FSU saw itself deadlocked at 3-3 after a quarter but broke loose for 21 points in the second quarter. The Tribe added 28 more points in the third quarter and each team tallied 14 in the final frame. The Seminoles came up with nine touchdowns in the game and each was scored by a different player.

THE COACHES--Bobby Bowden (Samford '52) has guided Florida State to a 40-13 record in the four plus seasons he has been head coach for the Seminoles. That is an imposing record when one erases the 5-6 first season that started 0-3. Over the last 23 games, the Tribe has lost just two. In the last three years Bowden has taken the Tribe to two bowl appearances (1977 Tangerine and 1980 Orange). Bowden last year was cited by ABC-TV and Chevrolet as its Division I-A Coach of the Year and was also Associated Press Southern Independent Coach of the Year for the second time in three seasons. This is Bowden's third head coaching stop. He was previously at Samford (31-6) and West Virginia (42-26) which gives him an overall coaching mark of 113-45 through the Boston College victory last Saturday. The victory total at the start of the current season (107-44) ranked 10th among active head coaches in I-A. The percentage (.709) was 11th among I-A and I-AA head coaches.

Richard Williamson (Alabama '62) is the Tigers' 17th head football coach. He started this season with a 29-26 record over five seasons but now has an overall log of 30-31. His 1976 team went 7-4 and earned Williamson Associated Press Southern Independent Coach of the Year honors--an award Seminole mentor Bobby Bowden has won twice in the last three seasons. Williamson played wide receiver at Alabama and as a senior in 1962 caught sophomore Joe Namath's first touchdown pass. That same year Williamson was an All-SEC selection and was voted Alabama's Most Valuable Player on offense. Before taking the head coaching job at Memphis State, Williamson was an assistant for 12 years; twice at the University of Alabama and twice at the University of Arkansas.

THE CAPTAINS--Seminoles have four--two for the offense and two for the defense. Offensive representatives are guard Greg Futch (70) and tackle Ken Lanier (72). Captains for the defense are noseguard Ron Simmons (50) and linebacker Reggie Herring (39). Memphis State will name game captains during the week.

BOBBY VS. MEMPHIS STATE--Seminole mentor Bobby Bowden has a 2-1 record in previous games vs. Memphis State. In 1976 he lost a 21-12 verdict to Williamson and Memphis State at the Liberty Bowl. The following season the Tribe rebounded in Tallahassee with a 30-9 victory. Last season FSU won by a 66-17 count.

BB BEGAN IN MEMPHIS--The "marriage" that now exists between Bobby Bowden and Florida State began in Memphis, Tn. Bowden's first game as Florida State head coach was in Memphis at the start of the 1976 season. The Seminoles were 21-12 losers in that game and lost their next two assignments, Miami (47-0) and Oklahoma (24-9), before Bowden got his first win as FSU head coach, 20-10 over Kansas State.

SEMINOLES ON ROAD--This will be the fourth and final road assignment of the season for the Seminoles. They are 2-1 in previous road games, winning 16-0 at LSU and 18-14 at Nebraska. Miami (Fla.) administered the loss, 10-9.

MORE FSU ROAD NOTES--The Memphis State trip marks the 26th road game FSU has played since Bobby Bowden became head coach in 1976. The Seminoles have been winners in 17 of those games and 15 of those wins have come over the last 19 games.

ABOUT CROWDS--No matter what the crowd size in Memphis this week (Tiger athletic department officials expect it to be 25,000), it will be the smallest gathering the Tribe has played before this season. Each of the Seminoles home games have been played before nothing less than 50,547 and the smallest road crowd was the 50,008 that was in the Orange Bowl for the Miami game. In the other two road games, the Tribe drew 77,535 at LSU and 76,152 at Nebraska. The LSU crowd figure is the largest to ever watch the Seminoles.

'CASE YOU WONDERED--The smallest crowd to watch the Seminoles play last season was 14,539 at Cincinnati. The road game at Louisville drew 27,306.

BOTH METRO MEMBERS--FSU and Memphis State are both members of the Metro Conference. The league crowns champions in most major sports but football. FSU has won the league all-sports championship for the last three years.

WANT TO COMPARE?--Florida State and Memphis State have one common opponent this season--Louisville. FSU won a 52-0 verdict from the Cardinals in the Tribe's second game of the season. Memphis State was beaten 38-14 by Louisville.

CAPECE KEEPS KICKING--Seminole placekicker Bill Capece last week set an FSU record for field goals in a single season when he booted his 15th of the season. It was his first of four field goals vs. Boston College. Capece, a senior from Hollywood, Fla., is also nearing other records.

- (1) He is 10 points shy of tying the Seminole single season scoring record. That mark is 86 held by Barry Smith since the 1972 season. Capece has already moved into the second slot, replacing Ron Sellers, who scored 72 in 1968.
- (2) Each time he scores, Capece adds to his record for most points ever scored in a single season by an FSU kicker. The old mark of 70 was set last season by Davey Cappelen.
- (3) He's just four field goals shy of tying the NCAA Division I-A single season record of 22 set by Penn State's Matt Bahr in the 1978 season. Bahr picked up those 22 field goals over 27 attempts.
- (4) He needs 22 more points over the final four regular season games to set a new I-A record for most points scored by a kicker in a single season. Bahr has the record (97) with the 22 field goals plus 31 PATs.

WILLIAMS & 100--Sophomore tailback Ricky Williams became the second Florida State player to gain more than 100 yards rushing in a single game this season with his 109-yard performance vs. Boston College. Senior tailback Sam Platt has accomplished the feat three times. The 109 were his best career totals at FSU, passing the 61 yards in seven carries vs. East Carolina earlier this season.

MORE PIECES ABOUT CAPECE--A couple more pieces about Bill Capece. In the last three victories--Nebraska, Pittsburgh and Boston College--the Seminoles have tallied 95 points. The foot of Bill Capece has accounted for 44 of those markers. Just as amazing as the scoring statistic is that he has scored on 13 of 14 field goal attempts in those three games.

SUPER SUB--Junior linebacker Ron Hester has drawn the starting nod for the last two weeks while veteran starter Paul Piurowski recovers from an appendicitis operation. In his first career start vs. Pitt, Hester was credited with 13 total tackles, including two for loss, and two fumble recoveries. It earned him Associated Press Southeastern Lineman of the Week honors. Against Boston College he again had 13 tackles, one was a quarterback sack. But, he blocked two punts and also scored one touchdown.

PIUROWSKI READY--Paul Piurowski will apparently be ready to play when the Seminoles travel to Memphis State. Just 10 days after he underwent surgery for emergency appendicitis, Piurowski was again on the football field. He was in the game for just one play vs. Boston College, but did make the tackle.

TURNOVERS COME--In its wins over Nebraska and Pitt, the Seminole offense didn't have a turnover. The Tribe did fumble and lose the ball once vs. Nebraska, but that came on a punt return. In the win over Boston College, however, the Tribe lost the ball twice on pass interceptions and once on a fumble.

WHAT THE PLAYERS SAY...

K BILL CAPECE--"I thought I would have a pretty good year, but not like this. It's great to know I've set a school record (total field goals in a single season) and now I'm hoping to get the NCAA record for a single season.

"It makes me happy the way I've been kicking. No, I'm not the franchise. There are 10 other guys out there doing the job. I can't kick alone.

"Beating Boston College when we really weren't 'up' showed me that this is a pretty good football team. We were flat but still won quite easily."

DT MARK MACEK--"We made the football game on Saturday a 'fun' day because the defensive coaches have us working so hard during the week. The defense has a great mental attitude. We still think of the Boston College game as a shutout since that score came on a pass interception.

DT MARK MACEK (Cont'd)

"Against Boston College we didn't put it together as a team. We showed our potential, but potential doesn't win games.

"Memphis State might be able to beat us. It all goes back to mental attitude. I don't know how they're thinking this morning.

"This year's defense is much better than last year. We're more mature and know what to do. We don't lose our poise on the field."

DB MONK BONASORTE--"It doesn't take much for the defense to get fired up. When there is a job out there to do, we do it. It's good that some of our younger players are getting an opportunity. I like knowing there will be plenty of talent when the senior class has gone.

"When we start getting the big head, the only thing we need to think about is the Cincinnati game last year. For those of us who played in that game or were there it brings you back to reality quickly. Cincinnati didn't have a very good team, but look what happened--we almost got beat, 26-21.

"Our offense shouldn't be criticized. It has played well. Look what happened against Pitt. When, and if the defense slips, the offense will be there to pick us up.

"The defense thinks it has four shutouts, not two like the NCAA stats say. East Carolina scored on that kickoff and Boston College ran back the interception. Those weren't scored against the defense. The NCAA can't count it that way, but we sure do."

WHAT BOBBY SAYS...

ABOUT BOSTON COLLEGE WIN--"We didn't seem to have the same intensity that we had during the Nebraska or Pittsburgh games, but that had to be expected. The kids knew what had to be done and went out and did a great job."

ABOUT DEFENSE--"Look at the statistics and you can see they played well against Boston College. The defense didn't have the mistakes the offense had. Those fellows on defense have great pride in what they do. They're a special group that really gets along well together."

ABOUT MEMPHIS STATE--"We're in the same situation we were in last week--we will be favored and our objective must be to avoid the upset. I'm sure Memphis State will be sky high for us. Their coaching staff will be reminding them all week about what happened here last year, 66-17.

"I think our players learned a great lesson last season at Cincinnati. They now know that if they aren't ready to play on Saturday the worst can happen. We will depend on our seniors for lots of leadership this week. They will need to be the ones to prepare the team mentally."

ABOUT BOWL SITUATION--"I would be lying if I said I wasn't thinking about the bowls. It would seem to me that we are in a better situation this season than we were last year at this time to get a major bowl bid because of the teams we beat. Just look at the top 20 polls from last week. We're even ahead of an undefeated team (North Carolina) in the top eight. The wins over Nebraska and Pitt have made our program very creditable nationwide.

"I would say that if we can continue to win something good should happen to us, but again I'm realistic enough to understand that funny things do happen when they're determining bowl matchups. Nothing will ever surprise me. We need to keep winning--avoid the upset."

ABOUT INJURIES--"Right now we could use the open date this week because a bunch of our boys have minor problems. But, the open date isn't there so we just need to continue playing hurt. There is nothing real serious, but the whole team could put three days of rest to good use. We (the coaches) will have to be extremely careful not to work the team hard this week. They will need the time to rest and heal if we're going to play well at Memphis State."

SID TRAVEL--Seminole sports information director Mark Carlson arrives in Memphis Wednesday evening. During his stay he will headquarter at the Sheraton Inn, Memphis Airport (901/332-2370). He may also be reached through the Memphis State sports information office (901/454-2337).

TEAM TRAVEL--Seminole team and official party depart Tallahassee via Texas International charter Friday at 2 p.m. Arrival in Memphis is scheduled for 2:15 p.m. CDT. Headquarters will be the Sheraton Inn, Memphis Airport (901/332-2370). Return to Tallahassee is tentatively scheduled for Sunday at 1 a.m.

PLAYERS TO WATCH...

FLORIDA STATE

NG RON SIMMONS--(No. 50, 6-1, 230, Sr., Warner Robins, Ga.)--has recovered from an early season ankle injury that sidelined him for most of the opener vs. LSU and the entire Louisville and East Carolina games. He was a member of every pre-season All-American team and is still a strong candidate for post-season All-American honors. He's the most honored player in Seminole history having finished ninth in the Heisman voting last season and being a semifinalist for the Lombardi Award.

DB MONK BONASORTE--(No. 42, 6-1, 175, Sr., Pittsburgh, Pa.)--is Florida State's career leader in interceptions with 14, including three this season. He picked off the record breaker in the Seminole upset victory at Nebraska. He had eight thefts last season--fourth best in the country which helped him earn third team Associated Press All-American honors. Monk came to FSU as a walk-on and first competed at the tight end position.

LB REGGIE HERRING--(No. 39, 6-1, 215, Sr., Titusville, Fla.)--is the Seminole team leader in tackles with 101, 56 solo and 45 assists. He also has three quarter-back sacks, two caused fumbles, a fumble recovery, two tackles for loss and an interception. Reggie came to the Seminoles as a defensive back but was converted to line-backer in his sophomore season. If he continues at the present pace, he will lead the squad in tackles for the third consecutive season.

OT KEN LANIER--(No. 72, 6-4, 260, Sr., Columbus, Ohio)--is the veteran of Seminoles' offensive line. He has been a starter since the second game of his freshman season. Many observers--pro scouts--seem to field he will be among the first 12 players selected in this year's draft. Like punter Rohn Stark he's also a member of Florida State's track and field team. Ken holds the school record in the shot put and has been the Metro Conference champion the last two years.
