

Tribe Tonight

Welcome back.

That seems like a most unusual way to begin this piece, but after an absence of 49 days from Doak Campbell Stadium

something needed to be said.

And, what a 49 days it has been. The Tribe comes home tonight with a nifty 5-2 record that includes a better-than-expected 3-2 showing on the most recent road trip that was considered the most treacherous ever undertaken in the history of college football.

Just to refresh your memories. When you last watched your favorite football team, they were winning 10-5 over Memphis State and hiking the season record to 2-0. A trip to Nebraska followed and with it the first defeat of the season.

Many thought the Nebraska result (14-34) was a forecast of worse things to come. Not so, however. After an open date, the Tribe traveled to Ohio State and claimed a 36-27 verdict before 87,158 fans, the most to ever watch a Seminole football game.

Then came a trip the following Saturday to the famous Notre Dame campus. Few teams have ever won on their first visit to South Bend, but FSU toppled the Irish, 19-13. That win replaces last year's 18-14 victory at Nebraska as the most prestigious in Seminole history.

The constant travel apparently caught up with the Tribe the following Saturday when a talented Pitt squad put a 42-14 rap on the Seminoles. It was the worst defeat for FSU since a 1978 excur-

sion to Mississippi State.

Last Saturday the trip ended with a surprisingly easy 38-14 win at LSU. The win was the third consecutive win in Baton Rouge for the troops of Bobby Bowden, who have never lost in what LSU partisans fondly refer to as "Death Valley."

So, now that it's over, what did head coach Bobby Bowden think of Oktoberfest?

"I'm just glad we don't have to do it again," said Bowden. "It was very important to win three of five games. I wish we could have done better, but what it does is get us back in good shape."

Earlier this week Bowden was asked

to grade the trip.

"I'd have to say it was a B," Bowden drawled. "Two wins and a tie would have been a C — just average. I think we got the best of it."

Now tonight it's "Homecoming" in two ways. First the Seminole football team return and second, many former graduates are on campus.

This is the first of three consecutive home games for the Tribe. Following Western Carolina into Doak Campbell Stadium will be Miami (Nov. 7) and Southern Mississippi (Nov. 14).

The season concludes with the annual backyard brawl against Florida at Gainesville on Nov. 28.

So, even though many of you would like to believe that once Oktoberfest ended the season would get easier, forget it. It could be an even rougher road than the last five games since two of the final three are against in-state rivals.

"It's funny, at the beginning of the season we thought about the awful road trip," Bowden says, "but now when you look at the schedule, you have to say the toughest part is still ahead."


A victory against the Catamounts tonight will allow the Seminoles to achieve two goals. The victory would be the 200th in the history of FSU since it began playing football in 1947. Historians now note the Seminoles are 199-146-12 since they began with a 14-6 loss to Stetson in '47.

A win tonight would be the 50th for Bowden here since he took over the slumping program in 1976. He carries a 49-16 report card at FSU as he prepares for tonight's kickoff.

Bowden will become only the second FSU head football coach to gain 50 victo-

ries. The first was Bill Peterson, who will be in the radio booth tonight, analyzing the contest for the Seminole Network.

TRIBE TIDBITS: Western Carolina is a member of the Southern Conference . . . WCU tailback Melvin Dorsey has rushed for 823 vards in eight games this season, a 103-yard average per game... his best effort was 165 yards against Furman . . . Seminoles Greg Allen and Garry Futch were honored by Associated Press for their performances vs. LSU . . . Allen, who rushed for a school record 202 yards in 31 carries in his first collegiate start, was named Associated Press Southeastern Back of the Week and Futch shared Lineman of the Week honors after registering 10 tackles, including five for losses . . . If you don't have a ticket for next week's game vs. Miami, forget it — none are available . . the game was sold out almost a month ago, the earliest non-Florida sellout in Seminole history . . . FSU will be trying to stretch its 18-game home win streak tonight... the Tribe has not lost in Doak Campbell since 1978 when Houston turned the Seminoles back, 27-21...the Seminoles have won 19 of their last 20 home games and 25 of the last 27 ... Lik Thomas: From FSU to the Big Leagues

If you are confused, it's understandable, but this piece does concern one person, who signs his checks three different ways and is a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers defensive secondary. It's also about a Florida State graduate ('73), who's making his mark, not only in the rugged life of pro football, but also in the business world and community of Pittsburgh.

It's an appropriate Homecoming feature even though J. T. Thomas will not be here tonight. Instead he will be preparing for a game in Pittsburgh tomorrow against the San Francisco 49ers.

Indeed, it's incredible in the eyes of many that he's even on the Steeler 40-man roster today. Many of the media types in the Steel City area had almost written J. T. off the club in July prior to the start of training camp. Instead, he will start at free safety tomorrow and contribute more than his share to the Pittsburgh pass defense.

Last summer was the second time the media folks had written off J. T. Thomas as a member of the Steelers. The first came in the summer of '78 when a blood disorder, Boeck's Sarcoid, a rare but not fatal disease, forced him to the sidelines.

In this modern age of medicine where almost everything appears curable, Boeck's Sarcoid is a mystery. Very little is known about the disease.

"It comes and goes," Thomas explained. "They (doctors) don't know why. It's like the common cold."

However, that year of inactivity probably was a benefit to Thomas. He learned more about himself and the world. "I look at whatever happens to me in life as a learning tree," Thomas says. "If I

"I look at whatever happens to me in life as a learning tree," Thomas says. "If I traveled the same path as Terry Bradshaw or Lynn Swann, that wouldn't make life unique. That's what makes life exciting.

"My year sitting out, I came in touch with reality. In football, you have a tendency to be exalted. You see reality in a very vague mirror. You think you're cognizant of things, but you're really not. They always say football players die two deaths, the first when they leave the game. In a sense, I've been resurrected."

If you're getting the idea that Thomas is an interesting sort, you're right.

An example is the recent visit by the Steelers to New Orleans. While many of his teammates were checking out the sights of Bourbon Street, J.T. was off by himself.

"I love my solitude," say Thomas, a member of all four Steeler Super Bowl teams. "I just go out alone. I need the space.

I grab a cab and just go. I went to a restaurant called Bunning's at West End Park.

"I sat at a big table at a marina where they had yachts tied up. It was right alongside Lake Pontchartrain. And I ate lots of healthy seafood. It was fantastic." Why would he pass up the opportunity to be with his teammates?

"We're on top of each other all week," he says. "We see each other at meetings, on the practice field, at lunch, in the locker room, in the showers and you name it. I need to be by myself once in a while. I even go off and find dives; no one recognizes you there."


Don't however, get the idea Thomas is not a "team" player.


"Football is a game of dependency," says Thomas, the first black to ever play in a football game at Florida State. "If one phase is not functioning properly, you all stink. We depend on the pass rush; they depend on our coverage. In basketball, you find the hot guy and give him the ball. In baseball, you can pinchhit for an individual. But football doesn't work that way. Everyone has a function.

"You take one spark plug out of my BMW and it doesn't work, and the Steelers are the same way. But as defensive backs, we often get the blame for a big touchdown because we're the last line. But I like it that way."

Yes, indeed, J.T. Thomas is making a name for himself, but he hasn't forgotten Florida State.

"I still keep in contact with the people down there." he says. "I've been at several clinics with Coach (Bobby) Bowden and Bill Shaw (defensive line coach) was a teammate. When I take my family to Florida in the winter I always try to stop in Tallahassee. I really like it there and at one time after my rookie season continued on page 89





Darien Andreu: Up and Running

The sun peeks up from behind the hill and the shadow of a runner emerges. The feet develop a rhythm as they move across the dew-covered grass. Perspiration beads form on the runner's forehead from the hot, moist air.

A door opens up and a runner steps out into the cold, almost unwillingly. The first steps are dreaded as the cold air seems to pierce the lungs. It's dark outside but lights are starting to flicker on here and there.

On both occasions, in two different parts of the year, it's 6:30 a.m. in Tallahassee. While the rest of the world is waking up, Darien Andreu of Florida State's women's cross country team is already tuned into a new day.

"I love running" says Andreu, a senior from Orange Park, Fla. "You've got to love it because it's not easy to go out there and run the miles. You have to get satisfaction out of it."

Which part of the year does Andreu find it easier to run in? "Definitely the warmer months," she says. "The heat and humidity don't bother me at all. You can see some great things out there like the Capitol shrouded in a fog and the sun coming up behind it. I also like to run through the campus and see what's going on. The miles just seem to fly by."

But in the winter months in Tallahassee, running becomes more of a chore, even for Andreu. "It's bitter," she says. "You open the door and the cold air rushes upon you. You've got to start generating some body heat quickly. The air seems to go right through all the sweats, too. It's definitely not enjoyable until you get past the first mile. I just think about getting through it."

Actually, the morning runs are but one of the daily runs for Andreu and her teammates during the cross country season. In the afternoon, the squad assembles and does a variety of workouts;

sometimes a hard interval workout, sometimes a long run that could stretch as far as 12 miles. Other times the squad will run the hills, a critical but hard part of the entire phase of training for cross country competition.



"Our program is incredible here," says Andreu, who also runs the 3,000, 5,000 and 10,000 meter distances during track and field season. "Just look at the job Roger (Smith) and Gary (Winckler) have done since they became the coaches here a year ago. They turned the track program around (FSU finished third in the nation last year) and our cross country program is following. They are tremendous motivators and bring out the best in all of us."

During the spring, cross country is out and track is in full swing. "Track is a

whole different world," says Andreu, who stands 5-3 and weighs barely 100 pounds. "It's a perfect sport—it's measured and you know where you are in reference to time. You get entirely caught up with the watch."

Andreu's favorite track race is the 5,000 meters, which is known as the 5-K in track lingo. That's also the distance of a cross country race which may explain why she excells at both cross country and track even though they are run in two very different ways. "In the track race, you have to be aware of tactics but at the same time amuse yourself since you're going around the same flat track," she says. "It's strange in that it takes a lot of concentration or you could find yourself lulled right out of the race."

But Andreu has found herself successful in both, qualifying for the regional and national meets during cross country season and qualifying for the 3, 5, and 10-K runs during the spring season. "When I came here, Darien was one of the squad's top runners already," says Smith, who coached at Wyoming before he took the FSU position. "But the improvement since then is just incredible. She has a lot of talent and she adapts well and really understands what we're trying to coach. She'll be one of the top runners in our region meet this year."

That meet is being run next week in Athens, Ga. and FSU fans should expect to hear Darien Andreu's name at the top of the finisher's list. And after regionals, the next step is nationals where Andreu hopes to lead FSU to a top ten finish.

"We're capable of reaching the top ten, and we even have a shot at the top five this year," she says. "If we can get the best performance out of everyone and if we can run as a team and help each other, then we can reach our goals.

If dedication has anything to do with it, Darien Andreu will reach hers.

According to the Collegiate Dual Meet Rankings put out by Track and Field News, Florida State's track program—men and women combined—is the fourth best in the nation. The computations are arrived at based on four factors; schedule toughness, depth of performances, head-to-head competition and hypothetical competition.

Florida State's men's program ranked ninth with the women's program getting fifth place. But as a combined unit, the Tribe program was considered the fourth best in the United States.

- THE GAME: Florida State (5-2) celebrates Homecoming against Western Carolina (2-6) in the first meeting ever between the schools.
- ATTENDANCE: Very few tickets were available early Saturday. A capacity crowd is likely. A crowd larger than 51,454 will be the largest of the season in Doak Campbell Stadium.
- THE CAPTAINS: FSU has elected five captains for the season--punter Rohn Stark (3), quarterback Rick Stockstill (11), fullback Michael Whiting (27), cornerback James Harris (33) and noseguard James Gilbert (51). Western Carolina captains include wingback Jeff Dean (24) and defensive end Scott Strickland (82).
- ABOUT HOMECOMING: Florida State will be playing in its 34th Homecoming Game. The Tribe has a 24-8-1 record in these contests and has won five straight.
- THE COACHES: FSU mentor Bobby Bowden (Samford '52) tonight bids for his 50th coaching victory with the Garnet and Gold. Bowden enters the contest with a 49-16 mark as Seminole pilot and overall coaching mark of 122-48 that includes marks of 31-6 at Samford and 42-26 at West Virginia. Since coming to FSU he has twice been named by various groups as National Coach of the Year and twice been selected the Associated Press Southern Independent Coach of the Year.

 Bob Waters (Presbyterian '60) is in his 13th season at Western Carolina and has posted a 73-55-4 record. He came to Western Carolina in 1969 from Stanford where he had served as the receiver coach. He played his college football at Presbyterian and led the Blue Hose to the 1960 Tangerine Bowl, where he was voted the Most Valuable Player. After his collegiate career, he spent five seasons with the San Francisco 49ers as a quarterback and defensive back.
- MILESTONES: In addition to Bobby Bowden seeking his 50th victory as head coach for FSU, the Seminoles will be attempting to notch their 200th victory tonight. Since starting football in 1947, FSU has compiled a record of 199-146-12.
- <u>WINNING SEASON:</u> Florida State can secure its fifth consecutive winning season tonight with a victory. A win tonight would assure the Tribe of nothing less than a 6-5 record for the season.
- ABOUT GREG ALLEN: Seminole tailback Greg Allen can duplicate a Herschel Walker feat if he would gain 200 yards rushing tonight. Walker ran for 200 on four different occasions last fall and once did it back-to-back. Allen could possibly go back-to-back tonight after his record-setting 202 yard performance last week vs. LSU. Allen was the second freshman to run for 200 or more yards this season. Joe McIntosh of North Carolina State gained 220 earlier in the campaign.
- STOCK NEARS 1,000: FSU quarterback Rick Stockstill needs to pass for 32 yards tonight to hit the 1,000 mark for the season. Stockstill would hit that mark one game earlier than last fall when he didn't pass the 1,000 marker until the ninth game of the campaign. Rick also has an opportunity to top his 1,377 total of last fall with strong efforts over the final four games.
- BOWL SCOUTS: Three of the post-season classics have representatives here tonight.

 The Gator Bowl is represented by Tonmy Gay, Bill Brigman represents the Peach Bowl and Jeff Clark is the Tangerine Bowl representative.

Florida State- Bobby Bowden

"The game was closer than the score indicated. They did a better job than we did tonight. I'm proud of Bob Waters, his staff and palgers. They weren't intimidated by Doak Campbell Stadium. We outpersonneled them tonight. Mixon impressed me. They were very well prepared for us. (On Greg Allen) It was sure tempting to put him back in. I knew he was close to the national record. I was aware of it but I just didn't think it was right."

Greg Allen (Florida State)—"It's hard to believe I got 300+ yards. I just kept running and thinking about that goal line. Coach Kish kept me informed about the record. First he told me how close I was to 200 and then he told me that I had broken the NCAA record for a freshman. I just went out there and did whatever I could. Tonight teally felt great."

Western Carolina -- Bob Waters

"We ran out of players in the second half. It was a good hard hitting game. We lost some players on our defensive line and in the backfield. I think that's where the differnce was. When Florida State loses its first string players, they have quality replacements. We do not. The big plays on offense on both teams did not surprise me. I think both teams have that type of offense. I thought we played very well in the first half but we seemed to run out of gas in the second. Florida State has a great team and they kept coming at us. When we had a few players (key) get hurt, I knew we were in trouble."
