Pregame:

Texas A&M's 12th man designee today is Jay Elliott, listed on the flip card with (12).

Though there is a 30 percent chance of rain at some point in the classic, rainfall has not been the norm in most Classics. In only three of the past 55 Mobil Cotton Bowl contests has rain been falling at kickoff. There has been drizzle and overnight showers in local weather, but kickoff weather finds the thermometer above 42 degrees (F) for the 33rd time in 56 years. Best weather in recent MCB encounters was a springlike, 68-degree afternoon in the 1990 Classic when Arkansas tangled with Tennessee.

Officials today are from the Western Athletic Conference. This is the second time in four years that the WAC has supplied game officials through NCAA auspices. Southeastern Conference officiating crews worked the 1988 and '91 games while the WAC officials worked '89 and '92 Classics. The Big Eight Conference worked the 1990 MCB.

Texas A&M's first quarter safety was the first in a Mobil Cotton Bowl game since Texas punter John Goodson stepped out of the end zone to preserve a 14-12 win over Alabama in the 1982 game (14-12 win by Longhorns). It is Texas A&M's first safety since blocking a punt out of the end zone against SMU in Game 10. It is the first safety scored by a SWC team in the MCB since Baylor's Tommy Tabor tackled Alabama's Walter Lewis in the end zone of the Tide's 30-2 triumph over the Bears in 1981.

The 10:09 was the 10th-fastest accummulation of points in the Classic. It displaced a 50-yard field goal by Alabama against Texas at 10:06 remaining in the hello frame of the 1973 game -- on a 50-yard field goal by Alababama kicker Gregg Gantt. It was the fourth safety in Mobil Cotton Bowl history. The only other two-pointer besides the 1981 and 1982 safeties occurred in the 1953 game by Texas (a 16-0 winner) against Tennessee.

This is the first Classic in which two coaches are meeting one another in the Mobil Cotton Bowl for the initial time since the 1991 Classic when Dennis Erickson (Miami) and David McWilliams (Texas) faced. It also marks the second year in a row that Division I-A independent has played in the MCB. No Florida independent had played in the Classic prior to 1990.

Florida State had scored just one TD in its last eight penetrations into the "red zone" of 20-yard line in its most recent two regular-season games against Miami and Florida. Texas A&M's last four touchdowns, including the first TD by FSU, have been after turnovers. There were two fumbles lost and a pair of pass interceptions (both by Texas) which led to opponents' TDs against the Aggies.

There have been 411 points scored in the first quarter of 56 Classics. The nine-point output matches the fewest points scored in a first period since Arkansas jumped out to a 6-3 lead against Tennessee in 1990. The 1989 Arkansas-UCLA game produced a scoreless first quarter. Teams scoring first have won 27 of the previous 55 Mobil Cotton Bowl contests while teams leading at halftime have gone on to capture 32 of the first 55 MCB games.

This is the first time that the new 1991 ruling on fumbles into the end zone has been observed in the MCB. The new ruling gives the fall to the opposing team at the point where the ball is fumbled into the end zone. Thus, instead of receiving the ball on the 20-yard line as a touchback, the ball goes over to the Seminoles at the point where the ball was fumbled into the end zone -- the two.

Page 2 -- 1992 Mobil Cotton Bowl Game Notes

Patrick Bates' second qtr. pass interception gives him two for the contest -- tying him for second place with 11 other players with a pair of pilfers. Bates had four pass interceptions during the regular season and becomes fir first player to make two interceptions in one game since Ohio State All-America LB Chris Spielman had two pickoffs against Texas A&M in the 1987 Classic.

The nine-point output in the first half was the lowest opening 30 minutes of scoring since Georgia and Texas played to a 3-3 deadlock at intermission in the 1984 contest.

Casey Weldon had not scored a touchdown in 12 regular-season games and only has one regular-season rushing TD in his career -- a 1988 infantry TD against South Carolina. However, Weldon seems to save his most critical TD rushing prowess for bowl games: he had a five-yard TD sortie against Penn State in last year's Blockbuster Bowl prior to Weldon's four-yard carry for a score against the Aggies today.

Weldon's three pass interceptions in the first half ia a game-career-high for the senior slinger. Eralier in 1991, Weldon tossed a pair of interceptions against Michigan for his previous "most."

This marks the first time that Texas A&M has trailed this year in the first quarter and at halftime. The Aggies had outscored 11 opponents 272-44 in the opening half and 130-17 in first quarter results during the regular-season era in '91. The last time that Texas A&M trailed in any game(regular- or postseason) in the first quarter was on Oct. 27, 1990, when Rice grabbed a 12-7 advantage at College Station. The last team to lead Texas A&M at halftime was Texas Tech on Oct. 6, 1990. The Aggies came back to win both games -- 41-15 over Rice and 28-24 against Texas Tech.

The eight turnovers (four fumbles lost and four pass interceptions) place the 1992 game on track to break the 1942 Classic record of 13 turnovers. Texas A&M surrendered seven interceptions and five fumbles to Alabama while the Crimson Tide lost one fumble to the Aggies for a game-record (for both teams) 13 turnovers in the MCB.

Texas A&M's fifth fumble lost in the early portion of the third canto ties the Mobil Cotton Bowl record of five fumbles lost in one game with Texas A&M (vs. Alabama, 1942), Rice (vs. Navy, 1958) and Texas (vs. Notre Dame, 1971). Texas A&M ties its bowl record (vs. Alabama, 1942 Cotton) and (vs. Southern Cal, 1977 Bluebonnet) for fumbles lost with five. The MCB mark for total fumbles in one game is nine by Texas (vs. Notre Dame, 1971). Florida State's bowl record for most fumbles lost by both teams fell with Greg Hill's second fumble lost in the third quarter. That gave the two teams six fumbles lost and eclipsed the mark of five by FSU and Oklahoma combined in the 1981 Orange Bowl.

And about horses... Florida State's Chief Osceola did not ride the Seminoles' famed war horse to the coin toss to throw a flaming spear on the Cotton Bowl Stadium turf. If the feat had been accomplished, it would have marked the first time for a mounted horse to be part of a school's Mobil Cotton Bowl festitivies, but SMU has sported the traditional "Peruna" show horse at Classics as recently as the 1983 triumph 7-3 over Pittsburgh. When Texas Tech played in the 1939 Classic against St. Mary's (Calif.), the Red Raiders had not established their "masked rider" tradition of running a mounted horse through the stadium. The FSU horse is "Renegade."

Florida State offensive lineman Kevin Mancini has a twisted knee and missed several series in the third quarter. He was expected to return, possibly in the fourth quarter.





Page 3 -- 1992 Mobil Cotton Bowl Game Notes

On Bucky Richardson's second pass interception allowed of the day, Texas A&M committed its seventh turnover of the day. The Aggies' record for turnovers in a bowl game was 12 in the 1942 Cotton Bowl against Alabama (seven interceptions, five fumbles lost). That's also the one-team record for the Mobil Cotton Bowl contest.

Chris Crooms made his second interception of the game in the fourth quarter to join Patrick Bates and 10 other players with two interceptions in a Classic game.

Florida State has tied a school record for most interceptions allowed in one bowl game with four against Penn State (1967 Gator Bowl) and vs. Oklahoma (1965 Gator Bowl). When the Seminoles recovered a Wilbert Biggens' fumble in the fourth quarter it was the 13th turnover of the game and established another FSU bowl record for combined fumbles with seven -- six lost by Texas A&M and one by the Seminoles. Weldon also threw his fourth pass interception in one game for the first time in regular-season or bowl history.

The 13th turnover -- Biggens' fumble for Texas A&M, which had six fumbles lost and two interceptions at that juncture -- ties the Mobil Cotton Bowl record for combined (two team) turnovers in a Classic. Texas A&M (7 interceptions, 5 fumbles lost) and Alabama (one fumble lost)set the record with 13 in 1991. The Aggies set a Mobil Cotton Bowl record with six fumbles lost, eclipsing the mark of five by three other teams in three separate games.

Florida State runningback Sean Jackson became the 37th player in Classic history to rush for 100 yards in one game when he picked up his 105th yard on his 23rd carry early in the fourth quarter. Stay tuned for where this ranks in MCB history when final stats are tallied...

The attendance of 73,728 is the 23rd-largest draw in Mobil Cotton Bowl history. The all-time-high is 77,500 by Arkansas-Georgia in 1976, and the fewest ever to attend a game was 15,000 in 1940 (Boston College-Clemson) during Jess Neely's final game as Clemson's head coach. The Hall of Famer and Vanderbilt law school graduate (as well as football standout) then started a 1940-66 tenure at Rice.

The 12 points (10-2) in today's game is the fifth-lowest total in MCB History. There have been two 0-0 ties, and it's the lowest-scoring battle since the 7-3 SMU win over Puttsburgh in 1983. It was also the third-fewest TDs -- one -- ever tallied in the Classic. None were scored in the 1947 0-0 Arkansas-LSU deadlock and in the scoreless 1959 TCU-Air Force contest.

Just a reminder: (see note above) the 13 turnovers ties the 1942 MCB record of 13 by Alabama (12) and Texas A&M (1). FSU's school record for combined fumbles lost was five before today. The Seminoles also tied the school record in bowls for pass interceptions with four. Texas A&M committed a bowl-record six fumbles lost.

Sean Jackson has tied for 19th place in Classic history in net yards rushing with 119 on 27 carries (ties for fifth in a single-game history with Charley Timmons (Clemson vs. Boston College, 1940), Lydell Mitchell (Penn State vs. Texas, 1972) and Eric Dickerson (SMU vs. Pittsburgh, 1983).

Bobby Bowden becomes the second head coach ever to win seven consecutive bowl games, tying UCLA's Terry Donahue in the 1982-88 postseason games. Donahue established the record with a 17-3 win by the Bruins over Arkansas in the 1989 Mobil Cotton Bowl.





Page 4 -- Mobil Cotton Bowl Notes

In career bowl games FSU coach Bobby Bowden addes to his national record with a 11-3-1 mark for a .767 winning percentage. Florida State has not been defeated in its last 10 bowl games (9-0-1), and Bowden is 10-2-1 in bowls as head coach of the Seminoles. FSU and Bowden tie Division I-A mark for consecutive bowl victories with seven.

Casey Weldon of Florida State ties Mark Manges for fourth place in single-game MCB pass attempts with 32 (Manges attempted 32 passes for Maryland against Houston in 1977). Sean Jackson tied Arkansas' Ike Forte with the 119 yards by Arkansas (vs. Georgia, 1976) in individual rushing at 19th place. The 14 completions by Weldon represented the 11th-highest total in Classic annals.

Today's game was the fourth-lowest point total for a winning team (along with Arkansas vs. Nebraska, 10-7 in 1965 and Georgia vs. Texas, 10-9 in 1984). It also tied for fourth for fewest points by a losing team -- 30-2 to Alabama in 1981.

Third down converstions, a combined 3-for-29 for 10.4 percent, is believed to be a combined defensive "best" yield. At one point the two titanic defenses had held one another to 1-for-22 combined.

The last time that Florida State was held to 10 points or less in consecutive games was in 1976 -- Bobby Bowden's first season -- a 47-0 loss to Miami (Fla.) and a 24-9 defeat at the hands of Oklahoma, both on the road. The last time that Florida State won a game with as few as 10 points was in 1981 with a 10-5 triumph over Memphis State.

Sean Jackson had 100-plus yards for the third time in his career (including regular-season games) but the first time this season. The 119 yards ties his career high against South Carolina in 1990. The last time Florida State committed five or more turnovers in a game was in 1988 against East Carolina (three interceptions and two fumbles). The last time Florida State forced eight turnovers was before 1981 at an unspecified game. It is still being researched by FSU authorities.

Casey Weldon had his lowest total offense -- 92 yards -- in 19 games as a starter. The previous low was 106 yards against LSU this year in Baton Rouge.

Bobby Bowden becomes the first Vanderbilt alumnus (he has a Master's degree from Vanderbilt's George Peabody College for Teachers) to win a bowl game in the 1991-92 postseason. Texas A&M assistant coach David Culley is a former standout quarterback for the 1973-76 Commodores and assistant at Louisville before coming to Aggieland.

This was the second-most individual interceptions (ties for second with Joe Montana, Notre Dame vs. Houston, 1979). Kevin Murray of Texas A&M (vs. Ohio State, 1987) set the Classic record with five.

David Davis, the walk-on punter at Texas A&M from Loop, had nine punts for the sixth-highest number of punts in a MCB contest.

Bucky Richardson's 2.4-yard average per pass attempt is the eighth-lowest in MCB record books. Texas A&M's 3.0 yard average per play ties for sixth-lowest in Classic annals.

Florida State's 11 penalties is the second-highest in single game MCB history behind Miami's 16 penalties in 1990.





Page 5--Mobil Cotton Bowl Game Notes

The 39 total offense plays by Weldon ties for ninth in Classic history with 39 rushing and passing tries by both Frank Ryan, Rice vs. Navy (1958) and Glynn Griffing, Mississippi vs. Texas (1962).

The five first downs by penalty combined ties for second-most in a Mobil Cotton Bowl contest. The record is eight in the 1990 Texas-Miami game.

The two teams combined for 17 penalties -- second-most in a MCB behind last year's 24 penalties by Texas and Miami (Fla.).

Texas A&M's .250 passing percentage (6-of-24) ties for eighth-lowest in MCB annals. Texas was 2-of-8 against Tennessee in 1953 for .250 in passing percentage.

The six Texas A&M fumbles again sets a school record, surpassing five fumbles lost against Alabama (1942 Cotton) and Southern Cal (1977 Bluebonnet) in bowl games. The seven fumbles in all ties the A&M bowl record against Southern Cal (1977 Bluebonnet).

The 0-3 bowl record by Southwest Conference teams ties the 1983 postseason showing of 0-3 for least bowl production. Texas fell to Georgia in the 1984 Cotton Bowl, Oklahoma State downed Baylor in the Bluebonnet Bowl and Alabama topped SMU 28-7 in the Sun (now John Hancock Bowl). SWC teams finished 0-2-1 in 1974 bowls as Texas Tech salvaged a measure of respect by tying Steve Sloan's Vanderbilt Commodores 6-6 in the Peach Bowl. Sloan later became head coach of the Red Raiders from 1975-77 and currently serves as Athletic Director at North Texas. SWC teams scored two points in the final two bowl games of the 1991-92 bowl period. Baylor was the first conference team to be shut out in a bowl battle since Southern California blanked Texas A&M 20-0 in the 1975 Liberty Bowl. Indiana downed the Bears 24-0 last night in the Domino's Pizza Copper Bowl.

Florida State limited Texas A&M to the 4th---lowest total by a losing team in Classic history. Alabama downed Baylor 30-2 in the 1981 Classic while Oklahoma A&M (1945 vs. TCU), Tennessee (1953 vs. Texas, 16-0) and Texas (1963 vs. LSU, 13-0) for shutout triumphs in previous games. The eight-point differntial was the lowest since Tennessee edged Arkansas 31-27 in the 1990 Classic.

The team scoring first did not win the contest for the 29th time in 56 games. The team leading at halftime in the Classic won for the 33rd time in 56 contests while the squad leading after three quarters won the MCB for the 40th time in 56 battles. That is a winning percentage of .71.4 percent.

Texas A&M QB Bucky Richardson had been Most Valuable Player (or Offensive MVP) in his previous two bowl appearances (35-10 win over Notre Dame in the 1988 Cotton Bowl and 65-14 triumph over Brigham Young in last year's Sea World Holiday Bowl). He had competed against Heisman Trophy winners -- Notre Dame's Tim Brown and BYU's Ty Detmer -- in each instance. Richardson's 33 career pass attempts is the sixth-highest total in MCB records. He completed eight of these tosses. The Texas A&M standout had 60 career total offense attempts to tie Texas' Eddie Phillips (Texas, 1971-72) and Danny Davis (Houston, 1977, '79).

Referee Jack Baker's ** clarification of the rule on Greg Hill's fumble in the first quarter.

Baker: "Early in the game, at about the two-yard-line...

"The offensive team fumbled the ball in the field of play. The ball went out of bounds in the end zone.

Either out of bounds at the side of the end zone, or at the end of the end zone, the ball belongs to the defensive team at the spot of the fumble.

"This is the second year the rule has been in effect.

"He fumbled the ball in the field of play and that was the ruling."

Have you had this call before?

"It's a very unusual call. I've had it once before, the first year it was put in. It's not a touchback because it was fumbled in the field of play.

It would appear that few fans are aware of the rule?

"I'm sure. This is the second time I've ever had it.

I had it in a game at Utah the first year it was in effect."





FLORIDA STATE QUOTES

Coach Bobby Exmeden Bowden: "We won this game about the way we lost the last two."

Bowden on the play of Sean Jackson: "It doesn't surprise me that Sean gained as many yards as he did. Everytime he has played for us, even though it hasn't been on a starting basis, he's been productive."

Bowden on the wind: "I don't think it was a barrier today. I thought it might be, but I don't think it was strongenough to be a factor."

Bowden on the weather: "The fact that you had a wet ball the whole football game, and it seemed like it rained the whole football game, I think that affected everybody's execution.

Bowden on his defense: "I think this was our defense's best effort. I don't know that I can ever remember a defensive performance, **** when I was coaching, that was more outstanding. They literally won the game. Texas A&M had quite a few opportunities to put points on the board and our *** defense stopped them time after time after time.

"Our defense played well enough against Miami and Florida to win, We just couldn't win it. But when you get into a defensive struggle, folks, you just try and get enough points to win. You forget about that 45-40 stuff."

Bowden on fumbles: "We played one of the best teams in the country. I think you have to give credit where credit is due. It was not sloppy. Only a couple of times did I see sloppy ball-handling. It seems like most of the things that came out where were knocked out."

QUARTERBACK CASEY WELDON: "They gave us a lot of different looks and I just had a terrible day. I don't want to make any excuses, but I just couldn't get a great grip on the ball and some of my throws sailed because of that.

(on safety) It was just a heck of a play by Coryatt. I never saw him.

To go out a winner was great. The defense and offensive lines just carried me today. I was a heavy burden, but they did a great job."

FULLBACK EDGAR BENNETT: "Our seniors wanted to go out winners. We wanted to keep our bowl streak alive and we did.

Texas A&M has a great team and their defense is superb. They don't get the credit they deserve."

DEFENSIVE BACK CLIFTON ABRAHAM (Dallas Carter HS): "This win felt good because I could ve gone to A&M. It felt good to beat them.

Our defense has been underrated all year. We felt we should have had 40 points, but fortunately we still got the victory.

This makes up for the last two games and I'm excited about next year. I'm going to work hard to take Terrell Buckley's place."

OFFENSIVE TACKLE KEVIN MANCINI: "I think we just wore them down. Thye are atalented bunch and they have a great defense, but we just got back to being the offensive line we were for 10 games in the season. We sucked it up and got after it today."

DEFENSIVE BACK TERRELL BUCKLEY: "I sat down and talked with Coach Bowden and Coach Andrews last night and I came to the conclusion that I am going to forgo my senior year and enter the NFL draft.

"Every athlete has things to do he doesn't want to do. Coach Andrews told me I was fundamentally and mentally ready to go into the NFL. After he told me that I made my decision.

"He indicated as far as individual goals, the only thing I didn't accomplish was the Heisman Trophy."

FSU HEAD COACH BOBBY BOWDEN (On Buckley's decision): "When Terrell Buckley took Deion Sanders' place, I felt he had as much if not more natural talent than Deion. He has a lot of potential and he has a good head on his shoulders.

"I thought he might stay in but he has thought about it a lot."





R.C. SLOCUM - HEAD COACH: "As an old defensive coach, I feel some of those turnovers are created. It is a great credit to their defense. With two tough defenses that you saw today, I think you can see why I expected the game to turn out the way it did. We had problems moving the ball, but so did the other side. And you can see that our program is almost on Florida State's level.

On Greg Hill's fumble --"I really didn't get a good look at it. Greg reached out for the goal line and fumbled. Whatever happened, he fumbled it into the endzone and then it went out. There were a couple of critical plays that went against Texas A&M, but from what I could tell, they were the right calls. Overall, I thought the officiating was very good. I want to go on the record as saying that the officials called a good game, especially on those critical plays. Usually when you look back at the films you'll see that it was the defense, not our ball players, who created the turnovers and forced fumbles. We have been real good all year with our turnover ratio, but not today.

On missed scoring opportunities—"We had no breaks today. On Hill's fumble, we make a great play and they end up with the ball. Then we followed that with a dropped touchdown pass. Those two touchdowns we let slip away provided Florida State the margin they needed to win the game.

On the second-half end around fumble--"That's the kind of play that, if it works, it looks great. But this time it didn't work. We were at a point where we were scrambling to make yards and it was a good play opportunity. Our offense wasn't consistent and it simply was a situation where we needed to try and get things going.

On delay of game penalty during first quarter field goal attempt--"We had a situation there where our holder knows not to get the ball snapped until everyone is set. Someone was moving and time ran out

On the game--"I though it was an outstanding game. A lot of people might look at a 41-39 game and think that that is a great game. Those same people might think a 10-2 game is boring, but it's all a matter of perception. It was a great performance by both defenses. Our defense gave us a chance to win the game all the way to the end. At halftime, I think we had the same amount of turnovers, total yardage was about the same and first downs were close too. I don't think you can attribute the turnovers to us just because we have a young ball club. Florida State turned the ball over. It was just the way it happened today.

On the future--"I am looking forward for a great year next season. We lost a lot of great seniors and we will have some big holes to fill. If we can get that done, we should have another great season."
