The record was set this year in the MPC Computers Bowl by Boise State's Quinton Jones, who had 7-151-1 TD in a 27-21 loss to Boston College on Dec. 28, 2005 in Boise, ID. The record coming into this year's bowl season was held by Johnny Rodgers of Nebraska who had 136 punt return yards in the 1971 Orange Bowl vs. Alabama.
- Florida State's Willie Reid's 87-yard punt return for a touchdown in the second quarter was the longest in FedEx Orange Bowl history. The previous record was 80 yards by Alabama's Cecil "Hootie" Ingram, who eventually became Florida State's athletic director (1981-89), on January 1, 1953 against Syracuse.
- ➢ Reid's punt return for a TD was the senior's third of the season and second in consecutive games. He is the first returner in the Bobby Bowden era to return three punts for touchdowns in the same season. In 1984, Joe Wessel returned three blocked punts for touchdowns but no FSU punt returner in the last 30 years has ever taken three to the endzone.

#### TWO FSU TDs 1:20 APART:

➤ Florida State's two second-quarter touchdowns (Reid's 87 yard punt return, Lorenzo Booker's 57-yard TD catch from Drew Weatherford) occurred 1:20 apart. It was the shortest time between touchdowns in the Orange Bowl since Florida and Maryland exchanged touchdowns 12 seconds apart during the January 2nd, 2002 Orange Bowl. With :12 remaining in the first quarter, UF's Brock Berlin connected with Taylor Jacobs for a 46-yard touchdown pass. As time expired in the quarter, Maryland's Shaun Hill connected with Jafar Williams for a 64-yard touchdown pass.

#### **AUSTIN SCOTT RUSHING:**

Penn State junior tailback Austin Scott had 14 carries for 105 yards in the first half, posting his third career 100-yard game. Scott's season high had been 57 yards on 14 carries at Illinois. Scott finished the game with 26 carries for 110 yards and 2 touchdowns.

➤ Gary Cismesia had made 45 consecutive point-after attempts before missing the first of his career tonight in the second quarter. The last time an FSU kicker missed a PAT was during FSU's 37-0 victory over North Carolina, August 30, 2003 (Xavier Beitia). The missed kick was the first failed kick on a PAT in the FedEx Orange Bowl since the January 1, 2000 game when Alabama's Ryan Pflugner missed the game-tying PAT in the first overtime giving Michigan a 35-34 victory over the Crimson Tide.

In last year's National Championship game on Jan. 4, 2005, Oklahoma recorded the safety when QB Matt Leinart recovered his own fumble in the end zone with 6:34 left in the game.
- ➤ Florida State recorded a safety in it's last FedEx Orange Bowl appearance, when **Stanford Samuels** tackles Oklahoma punter **Jeff Ferguson** in the end zone. Those were the Seminoles' only points in a 13-2 loss on Jan. 3, 2001.

#### COMBINED PUNTING:

➤ The combined 20 punts by both teams (9 FSU, 11 Penn State) are the most in a FedEx Orange Bowl game since 1947 when Tennessee and Rice combined for 28 (15 Tennessee, 13 Rice) in Rice's 8-0 victory over Tennessee on January 1, 1947.

#### FEDEX ORANGE BOWL MEDIA CREDENTIALS:

This year, 759 applications were received for media credentials, a record for a non-championship year. The previous record was 692 for the 2004 FedEx Orange Bowl game between Miami and Florida State.

# SEMINOLE POSTGAME ORANGE BOWL NOTES Florida State vs. Penn State January 3, 2006

#### **BREAKING HIS OWN RECORD**

Willie Reid has had a huge impact on the 2006 Orange Bowl and was named the game's MVP. He set a new OB record with an 87-yard punt return that resulted in the Seminoles first TD. It was the third longest punt return in school history and it is a big reason Reid set two new records tonight. The senior broke his own single season record for punt return yards and he has now also set the record for punt return yards in a single game. Last year Reid's 522 yards broke Deion Sander's record of 503 yards set in 1988. Coming into the Orange Bowl, Reid had amassed 361 yards. Thanks to his school-record 182 yards tonight, the Kathleen, GA native has 543 yards on the season. Leon Washington held the previous single game record when he recorded 159 yards on punt returns versus Wake Forest October 23, 2003.

#### OVERTIME IN MIAMI

The last time the Seminoles played an overtime game was also the last time the team played in Miami. In 2004 FSU opened the season in Miami versus the Hurricanes. FSU surrendered a 10-point lead in the fourth quarter of that game and then lost to the Hurricanes in overtime. This is the fourth time Florida State has been involved in an OT game and they are now 1-3 on those occasions. The Seminoles have lost all three OT games played on the road. The first one came in a 26-20 loss at Louisville in 2002. In 2003 FSU defeated NC State 50-44 in double OT in Tallahassee. FSU had never played OT in a bowl before tonight's game and this was also the first triple overtime game ever played by an FSU team.

#### GOLD RUSH

Florida State was held to just 33 yards rushing by Penn State in the 2006 Orange Bowl. It was the second-lowest output of the season for Florida State. Boston College limited the FSU running game to just 13 yards September 17 in Chestnut Hill. This was the third straight game an opponent limited FSU to fewer than 50 yards rushing in a game and the fourth time in the last five games that has happened.

#### **BIG KICK**

Gary Cismesia tied tonight's game in the fourth quarter with a 47-yard field goal. It was the fifth time in the last seven games that the FSU kicker has connected on a field goal of 40+ yards. Last season Cismesia connected on just two field goals of 45 or more yards. This season he has done it five times, four of which have come in the last seven games. The last time FSU successfully connected on a field goal to win or tie a game in the fourth quarter was October 23, 2004. Xavier Beitia hit a 22-yarder to down the Demon Deacons 20-17.

#### **GIVING UP TWO**

The safety recorded by Penn State at the start of the fourth quarter was the first recorded against a Seminole team in over three years. The last time an opponent recorded a safety against FSU was NC State in 2002. The Wolfpack recorded two in the fourth quarter and won that game 17-7, November 23.

### WILLIE REID - NEW RECORD FOR ALL BOWLS

Willie Reid's 182 punt return yards tonight (7 attempts) shatters the record for all bowl games. The record was set this year in the MPC Computers Bowl by Boise State's Quinton Jones, who had 7-151-1 TD in a 27-21 loss to Boston College on Dec. 28, 2005 in Boise, ID.

#### FEEL THE NEED FOR REID

Willie Reid's second quarter punt return for a TD was the senior's third of the season and second in consecutive games. He is the first returner in the Bobby Bowden era to return three punts for touchdowns in the same season. In 1984, special teams' star Joe Wessel returned three blocked punts for touchdowns but no FSU punt returner in the last 30 years has ever taken three to the endzone. Reid's punt return was an Orange Bowl record, ironically breaking the record set by former FSU Athletics Director Hootie Ingram, February 1, 1953.

#### TRAILING AT THE HALF

Florida State is trailing at the half for the fifth time this season. The Seminoles are 2-2 in those previous four occasions. FSU's last win when trailing at the half came October 29 in a 35-27 win against Maryland in which the Seminoles trailed 21-14 at the half. In three of Florida State's last four games heading into tonight's contest, FSU had been tied at the half. The last time Florida State has gone to the lockerroom with a halftime lead was October 22 versus Duke - a stretch of six games. The Seminoles led that game 21-7 at half.

#### STREAK STOPS AT 45

Gary Cismesia had made 45 consecutive point after attempts before missing the first of his career tonight in the second quarter. The last time an FSU kicker missed a PAT was during FSU's 37-0 victory over North Carolina, August 30, 2003 (Xavier Beitia).

#### **LUCKY MAKES START**

Tonight, Seminole senior Ron "Lucky" Lunford made the THIRD straight start of the season and fifth of his career. The Jacksonville native opened the game at right guard where Cornelius Lewis was originally scheduled to start. Mario Henderson started in Lunford's spot at left tackle.

#### ON THE SIDELINES

Former Florida State players on the sideline tonight include Paul Irons, Tommy Polley, Anquan Boldin and Samari Rolle. All four just completed their NFL seasons. Irons appeared in two games for the Cleveland Browns. Both Rolle and Polley play for the Ravens and Boldin just completed the best season of his three-year career with 102 catches for 1,402 yards.

#### **PENN STATE**

COACH JOE PATERNO: It was a great football game, two teams that played as hard as they know how to play and it came right down to one play. Could have gone the other way, but I was proud of our kids. They hung in there, I think **Bobby's** proud of his kids. I thought it was a heck of a football game.

Q. I'm sorry this has to be the first question, but could you give us an update on Paul, if you know how Paul is doing.

COACH JOE PATERNO: Well, they think he has got some ligament problems, but they are going to wait and do an MRI on him as soon as they can and find out just how serious it may be. It's a tough break for him.

I shouldn't speak. The doctors will probably have something out tomorrow.

Q. You've been part of a lot of big games, but after all you've been through in recent years, where does this one rank?

COACH JOE PATERNO: Well, obviously this year has been one of the most rewarding, and I think to win it, to win this one this way at the end of the year is a great tribute to these kids and to a great coaching staff. I think these guys know how I feel about our coaching staff.

Yeah, it's a great feeling, but not really personally, I'm just so pleased for these guys. They came off a couple of lousy years, got together and made up their mind that was enough. They really went to work and they fought hard. This guy has made some plays in the clutch (indicating Michael Robinson). We have had some tough games and the other guys here have done a great job.

So it's been a great experience and great to cap it off with a win like this.

Q. Imagine in your wildest imagination that you would not expect that your two touchdowns would be scored by the players that did it, would you comment on that?

COACH JOE PATERNO: I'm not quite sure I got the drift of your question, two players that scored the touchdowns?

Q. I imagine those were not the people that you expected to score them going in.

COACH JOE PATERNO: I don't really expect, you know, we just — I don't know whether I expected them or not. Hate to be evasive, but I really don't know.

You go and you play and there's some plays you call, sometimes it gives a kid an opportunity to score and that's fine. But you don't really know who is going to score what. If I had known *Tony Hunt* was going to be banged up, you would not expect the other kid to get the touchdown. That's one of the great things about football, there's 22 guys involved in it on every down, and it doesn't change.

Great answer, isn't it? (Laughter).

Q. This question is for both Michael and Coach. The last drive, you brought Kevin out, brought him back out. Michael what was your input? And Coach, what were you thinking and how close do you want to get Kevin for that last field goal?

MICHAEL ROBINSON: You want to go first?

COACH JOE PATERNO: That second down was supposed to be a fake.

MICHAEL ROBINSON: Yeah, I didn't like

COACH JOE PATERNO: He was griping to me about the fact that it was supposed to be a fake. But we don't get the lineup we thought we were going to get. Mike was griping over there, and it's a good thing that the kid put it through, because he had to kick it. He had to kick it. We would have called a time-out. (Laughing).

COACH JOE PATERNO: I kept saying to myself, "When are we going to get this thing over?" I kept looking at my watch, 12:30, a quarter to 1:00, I'm usually asleep three hours at that time. (Laughter) That's the longest game I've ever been in. That game was five hours long almost. Maybe it was five hours.

### Q. Michael, how physical was tonight's game?

MICHAEL ROBINSON: It was very physical. But we expected that. *Florida State* is a great team with a great defense. Those guys were definitely pumped up. Their defensive coaches did a great job disguising their blitzes. They did some things that maybe I had never seen before. But we stuck in there and we kept pushing, and I kept on telling the offensive line, just keep pushing and keep sticking with us. I'm not coming out of this game no matter how much I slow, I'm going to get up.

Coach did a great job staying with us and not deviating from the game plan and things ended up going our way.

Q. Could you talk about what you got from your defensive line, those guys, you didn't have a lot of substitution there, and talk about the effort they gave you for this five-hour game.

COACH JOE PATERNO: Well, I thought the whole defense played great. This guy played great (indicating Calvin Lowry) and the old wide receiver there (indicating Ethan Kilmer)

Yeah, you're absolutely right. The one thing we did do was we played some three-man

defensive, three-down guys on defense and took one out and *Larry Johnson* kind of alternated those three guys. So we got a little bit more out of them than we would have than if we had to play a four-man line every down,

But they hung in there. We're obviously in good shape. There were — we didn't have kids cramping up or anything like that.

And it was interesting, because I was concerned that I had not worked them hard enough the last week or so; that we might not be in great shape. But they must have been behaving and getting a lot of sleep and weren't fooling around, uh-huh.

This guy, he's a lover boy over here (indicating Calvin Lowry) (Laughter).

Why don't you let me go and you can gab with these three guys.

# Q. Michael, obviously it's gratifying for you, particularly as a senior to get this win, but what does it mean to you to get a win for Coach as you head out of here in your last Bowl?

MICHAEL ROBINSON: It means a lot. This senior class, we made up our mind in the off-season, *Coach Paterno* was not getting the respect he deserved, his team was not getting the respect it deserves and we always knew we were a player or two away.

I think the way this game went, it definitely epitomizes what we've been through in our careers here - we were up, we were down and we finished it up with a great win, a dramatic win. I think I feel better about this win than if we would have blew them out.

I think before going into this game, I kept telling the team, you know, what type of team are we? Really, what type of team are we? We're going to go up against a lot of speed, a tough, physical defense, and we have to show up. What type of players do we have, what type of personalities do we have.

I think everybody stayed with it, and guys stayed into the game plan. We didn't panic when things didn't go our way. You know, we pulled through.

Q. Could you see Ethan's touchdown catch from where you were and could you talk about the journey he's taken and how significant his final performance was?

An Interview With:

#### **FLORIDA STATE**

COACH BOBBY BOWDEN: Joe and I both thought it was a great football game, a game that both kickers probably could have ended the game a lot earlier. We missed, they missed, we missed, they missed. But it was a great ballgame, again, a game in which nobody really should have lost that game, but somebody has to lose.

I thought our kids played about as hard and about as good as we could. If we could have eliminated penalties, I think we might have won the game. Of course you can say the same thing about them, but I'm talking about us. I don't know how many holding penalties we got in the red zone, but it seemed like every time we got to the red zone, there was a holding penalty, even in the playoff at end there.

So we were our worst enemy in that regard.

#### Q. 13 penalties for 119.

COACH BOBBY BOWDEN: And that's not counting the ones that they turned, right? They had some, too, I'm sure. But anyway.

Q. There was an awful lot of head coach experience in the building tonight, and we saw a game tonight with safeties and fumbles and missed field goals. Where does this game rank in terms of bizarre games you've seen in your career?

COACH BOBBY BOWDEN: Well, I've played in a lot of bizarre games, especially when you get down to missing field goals. I think when they pick the all-time missed field goals coach, I'il probably win that award, because we lost a lot of games missing field goals and we played against other people that lost them.

Penn State could have lost tonight missing field goals, and Miami this year when they missed a field goal. So that is weird.

Like I say, we're masters at that.

Q. Can you point to Willie's punt return and what it seemed to do for your team. You had trouble doing really anything against their defense and he seemed to open up some things for you.

COACH BOBBY BOWDEN: The ballgame, I tried to approach our team this week as we need another *Virginia Tech* game out of us, we need another *Virginia Tech* game. The key in that game was try to hang in there, hang in there and hang in there and then somebody break it open. We were 3-3 at the half and *Willie* brings a punt back in the third quarter and really breaks the game open. We just got hot.

Well, tonight, it was very much the same thing, except *Willie* returned it in the first half. But we're going into the half now, one point. Hey, that's like *Virginia Tech*. I said, "Don't worry about that one point. It ain't going to mean nothing, it's like being tied."

So I just — I knew it would be a dogfight and one of us would win it, and I had no idea which one might at that time. I knew our chances were about as good as theirs, by what happened in the first half. But Willie had set the tone for us, in this ballgame, the *Maryland* ballgame and the *Virginia Tech* ballgame with his punt returns.

Q. Willie, if you could just talk about that punt return you broke for a touchdown, if you could talk about what went through your mind and how soon you realized you had a good chance of breaking it?

WILLIE REID: I felt that I had a good chance of breaking it when the holdups didn't get down there as quick, guys like *Pat* and Roosevelt Lawson did a good job of holding up their gunners and they really give a punt returner the most trouble. They did a good job of walling off their man, and I just had the kick of the beat and made a touchdown off of it. It was a great job for our punt return team. The coach does a great job for

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us and it's been one of the stronger teams this year.

Q. Can you guys just talk about the emotion, being involved in a game like, this and even though you lost the game, maybe what it does for how you feel about the season?

WILLIE REID: Well, it was a tough loss and real tough to swallow it. Could have gone either way with the kick. You know, it's something you really can't control because you're not out there on the field and you really cannot put it on one guy. We had a lot of penalties tonight and we didn't do a lot of things well.

I think this game is a classic game between two great coaches and I was just happy to be a part of it.

PAT WATKINS: I felt like most of us were unhappy because all week long we had been underdogs, well, almost all year and every week we go out and try to prove something, going against the No. 22 team, the No. 3, and we sort of feel like we can play with anybody. And that automatically gets your emotions up and down. And on top of that, *Coach Bowden* and *Coach Paterno*, two of the greatest coaches in the game, you want to win it so bad.

Q. Coming off this season, you won the ACC Conference Championship Game for the 12th time in 14 years but you had a five-loss season, is that going to be tough to sell a lot of recruits before signing day?

COACH BOBBY BOWDEN: The championship or the five-loss?

#### Q. Five-loss season.

COACH BOBBY BOWDEN: Oh, yeah, that will be a hard sell. But I won't sell that, I'll sell them the championship. (Laughter) I'll show them my ring.

I don't try to sell negative. I'll try to sell the fact that we won the championship for the 12th time in 14 years or something like that. A lot of people think that if you have a losing season your recruiting ain't going to be good. Sometimes it helps you. Some of those kids want to go somewhere where they can play, you know, they feel like they can play better for us than they can for somebody else who is loaded. You'd be shocked how little effect five losses has on a season. You know I would not go in somebody's

house and try to sell them on our five losses, don't you? I'd sell them on the championship.

Q. Pat, would you talk about the intensity on the field and the kind of contact that was going on out there. Just seemed like a lot of shots being taken on both sides.

PAT WATKINS: We knew coming into the game that it was going to be a physical game. We watched a lot of **Penn State** film and felt like we needed to go out there and we needed to prove that we was the **Florida State** team that everybody was afraid of and the one that was going to go out and hit you right in the mouth.

We knew this coming in and we went out and gave it all we had.

### Q. How much was Weatherford grown up over the past two games?

COACH BOBBY BOWDEN: **Weatherford** has really gained from the first game of the year until the 13th game of the year. He has just gained aggressively with it. He got how many yards today throwing, I don't know how many he got, I think it was over 200, though. And I think he needed one hundred and something to break the **ACC** record, I think, for a freshman.

Anyway, he has really grown with it all year long and tonight is a great example because *Penn State* had — I coached against *Joe* up at *West Virginia* for ten years, and I saw those four teams he had where he dominated eastern football. And this team here, reminded me of those same ballclubs. You know, physical, good blocking, good tackling, good tough running backs. And we hung right there with him and *Drew* hung right in there with them.

He's really done well. I'm very, very pleased with him. It's going to be interesting with all he can do. It reminded me of — I don't know why, he reminds me of **Drew Brees** when he was a freshman at **Purdue**. I don't know what the stats are, if they were close or not, but he reminds me of **Drew**.

Q. What was it like for you to be involved in a game like this? And again, does it leave a memory on the season that you think the feeling, the team gained something as you go into next year?

COACH BOBBY BOWDEN: Oh, yeah. I think the thing that's very important is the direction

you're going, you know. Although you lost more ballgames than you've lost in maybe four or five years and the most since you've lost since years ago and all that stuff, you can't play that game. You've got to say, are we heading forward? Yeah, I think we're heading forward.

Again, that was the No. 3 team out there in the nation. I wish we would have been 3 and they were 22, I would feel a little bit better going in. I thought we played them — it's hard to tell who the best team was. But they were a much more mature football team than we were. The thing that concerned me most about them was their maturity. When a team has three-year starters, you'd better watch out.

So I thought that could be the difference in the ballgame. And the way we were making mistakes early in the game and getting penalties, I thought that was exactly what was going to be the difference.

Q. With some of the criticism that you and Joe have taken in the last couple of years, what does it say to you that your teams were able to put on such an entertaining game that you guys had tonight?

COACH BOBBY BOWDEN: Yes, we both have taken a lot of criticism lately, which is — it's going to happen. And it will happen more and more and more, and both of us of course being at our age, the easy thing to say is — it's got to be one of two things: It's either our age, or what's the other one? Oh, our sons. His son, my son, everybody jumps on the sons.

Again, you have two football teams, two excellent football teams tonight. Even though we are not ranked up there high at all. I do think, like I told my kids, what a great game that was to build going into next year.

Like I said, I'm concerned about direction, and I think we are heading in the right direction.

Q. Willie, you set a record tonight for punt return yardage, 182 yards for any Bowl game in history, can you talk about the significance of that.

WILLIE REID: Well, I didn't know it was like that, but I have to credit the team, the other ten guys that blocked for me because all returns look the same without any blocking. Those guys, I really have to tip my hat off to them. They worked really hard in practice, they do their job well in the

game and it just brings me - it's crazy how the returner gets a lot of the credit, but those guys really deserve all of the credit.

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COACH JOE PATERNO: Well, I wish we had him another year. He has not gotten enough credit for the job he's done on special teams, as well. He really has not been playing that much. He has not been getting as many reps as some of the other wide receivers, but he sure came — he sure played big tonight.

He's got great speed. When he catches that ball in the middle, he's run away from some people.

Q. Can you talk about the contribution you got from Austin Scott. You've pretty much said how much he's worked hard in practice and how does it feel for you to see all of his work pay off tonight?

COACH JOE PATERNO: I'm happy for him. He did a good job, he hung on to the ball and the whole bit.

He's got the makings of a good back. If he just has a little more patience, and once in a while, he'll take to the outside or try to get cute when he ought to just go straight up the field. But he's a good back, he's blocking better and did a good job on his pass protection tonight, because they were coming pretty good. I'm glad for him. He's hung in there with us.

## Q. You guys, is there anything that still doesn't surprise you about your coach's tenacity?

MICHAEL ROBINSON: Sometimes I'll be wanting to go tell him to calm down a little bit, man. (Laughter) Seriously, I'm like, "Coach, 79 years old, man, be cool."

I'm glad he does that. Sometimes when we were thinking that maybe we were better than what we really were, he would get on us. We would be thinking we were having a good practice and one dropped ball and he'll let us know that could be the football game. And the overtime, guys were catching the ball, guys were holding on to the ball and one dropped pass, one fumble and that's the football game.

I think guys really understand now what he means in practice. I know guys are always saying, why is coach getting on us? Why does he do that if we are having a good practice? But any play could be the play that wins the game. You know, in the clutch tonight, we made those plays.

Q. Michael, you talked about having it out with Coach before on that play, I wonder how often he let's you have it out with him? And two, what was going through your head after those two missed field goals?

MICHAEL ROBINSON: I guess the older I've gotten, the more he let me say some stuff. That's the good thing about *Coach Paterno*, he values his players' input. We went over things and there were some things I didn't agree with on certain plays of the game, and certain things he didn't agree with. There's one thing I can say, we came to a common ground and made it happen.

It's been such a pleasure to play for Coach *Paterno*. He's taught me a lot. I think my experience here at *Penn State* has definitely gotten me ready for the real world and wherever it may take me, whether it's a job, the *NFL* or whatever it may be. I definitely think that my experience here has made me a stronger person.

Q. When Bobby was here, he was talking about the thoughts you and he shared after the game, about what a great game it was, do you share his feeling about what a great game this turned out to be?

COACH JOE PATERNO: Yeah, I think it was a great game. The two teams played about as hard as they can play and about as well as they could play. Both came back from some adversity, both of them hung in there. It came down to one play here, one play there.

And I told **Bobby** that. I said, you know, I feel very fortunate that we made a couple plays that had to be made. That third down and 17, 18 was one of best throws you'll see that Mike made, and it was a real fine catch. But he's been making those kind of plays all year. That fourth and 14 against **Northwestern** — yeah, no kidding.

Q. Mike, you were pretty emotional on that podium afterwards talking about Joe Paterno, talking to the crowd. What did that mean to you to be able to address the stadium like that? I don't know if you can say defend him, but to be able to give that speech, what did it mean to you?

MICHAEL ROBINSON: It means a lot. Like I said before, to think that people actually wanted him to give this game up, to call it quits, when we knew what type of team we could have, I mean, I'm at a loss for words. What could these

people have been thinking, to be honest with you? **Coach** wasn't the one out there actually throwing interceptions and fumbling the ball and missing tackles, he can't do that.

So I just think I'm happy for him and so happy that he ended it the way he did, and he's a great coach.

Q. With your 11-1 season, how do you feel if you guys did have a playoff now, how do you feel if you could win the National Championship?

COACH JOE PATERNO: I think if you ask any college football player across the country, their goals will be to play for a National Championship, and you know, maybe if we had a playoff, who knows. Honestly before we knew what Bowl we were going to, we thought *Virginia Tech* might have been the best team out there, total team.

You know, who knows. I'm excited to watch the game tomorrow because I'm excited to see who will win it. But before we knew what Bowl we were going to, we planned to play either one. I think a playoff, who knows what would have happened, who knows what *USC* or *Florida State* or *Texas* would do in *Happy Valley* in December.

Q. Could you talk about what happened with the fumble on the goal line and how much you wanted to make up for that mistake.

MICHAEL ROBINSON: It was a very warm game, and before the play, *E.Z. Smith*, he sweats a lot and he sweats on the ball a lot. He told me, "Man, it slipped, I'm sorry." Whatever it was, maybe it touched my fingertips, I should have got it. The guy made a great play from *Florida State*. It's one of those things that as long as we came away with the win, I'm glad, whatever happens, happened.

Q. Two things: One, how much energy did you have left at the end, and two, why did you not want to go for the fake field goal?

MICHAEL ROBINSON: Actually, surprisingly, if I had to run the ball, I had a lot of energy to be able to run the ball. I didn't want to run the fake because I thought maybe we were going to be getting too cute with the football.

Actually, it was a lot of times, you know, if you watched the film, I argued with the coaches a lot during that overtime. We wanted to do some things with throwing the ball and things like that

when we had the upside. All we needed was a field goal and things like that.

I just kept telling the coaches, "Don't get cute." We do some of the things, we have to do as less ball handling as possible, run a sneak when we're in field goal range. I'm happy that they respected what I said and actually they did exactly what I said. And I'm not here to say I'm no coach or anything, but it's just something I felt real passionate about.
