

FSU Runners Bow

Grant Colehour N C A A college Division six-mile champion, led Eastern Kentucky to a 17-45 (low score winning) triumph over an outmanned Florida State cross-country team yesterday. He covered the five-mile course in 26:11.

Eastern Kentucky, which has now won 25 consecutive meets, captured five of the first six places. The team has won the NCAA college division cross country championship for the past three years.

The top Florida State finisher was Ken Misner, who ran a strong fourth. Marc Williamson was next for the Seminoles with an eighth-place finish.

"They were simply a better conditioned squad than we were," said coach Mike Long, whose runners had only two weeks to prepare.

"We have been working out twice a day," said Long, "trying to get ready, but it was evident we didn't make it."

The cross-country scoring system allows team points for the first five finishers of each team. After them each squad is allowed two "bumpers" or "place holders," who do not contribute to the team points, but may raise the competition's total.

Florida State's next meet is tomorrow against South Florida in Tampa. Eastern Kentucky will be traveling to Gainesville to run against Florida.
